Premiums and Special Awards

Premiums

Grand Champion: \$10 & a rosette ribbon will be awarded to the best entry in Youth Garden Show, Youth Flower Show, Youth Culinary Arts, Youth Home Arts, Youth Hobby Crafts, Youth Literary Arts, Jr. Arts & Youth Photography. "Best" is defined as that which demonstrates the best technique and skill as determined by the judges.

1st place: \$5 & blue ribbon

2nd place: \$3 & red ribbon

3rd place: \$1 & white ribbon

Special Premium Awards

\$10 & a rosette ribbon and \$5 & a rosette ribbon will be awarded to the first and second entries that the judges determine warrant special recognition. These awards are sponsored as follows:

- Build an **ORIGINAL** creation using Lego-type components. **NO KITS PERMITTED!**
- Entry must be **SECURELY MOUNTED TO A WOODEN BASE** (not to exceed ½ inch thick, plywood preferred) that is **SIZED IN PROPORTION TO THE ENTRY**.
- **MAXIMUM BASE SIZE** is 24 inches wide by 16 inches deep. To safely move entry, a **1-inch margin** is needed on the mounting board.
- **MAXIMUM CREATION SIZE** is 22 inches wide by 14 inches deep by 12 inches tall, including the thickness of the base.
- Entries must be left for display during the Fair.
- DO NOT use hard-to-find or valuable pieces on entry
