This will be accomplished in a manner representing the highest integrity and standards of all participants. UPON SUBMITTAL AND SIGNATURE OF THE ENTRY FORM: Exhibitors (including agents and junior exhibitors/parents/leaders/advisors) acknowledge and agree to the following principles for competition.

- 1. Exhibitors will comply with printed Fair and State Rules and accept all responsibility for their exhibits.
- 2. Exhibitors will indemnify Fairs & Expositions and the fair from any loss resulting from rules enforcement.
- 3. Exhibitors must be able to prove their eligibility and that of their exhibits according to fair rules, and acknowledge that misrepresentations of any kind are prohibited.
- 4. Junior exhibitors are expected to prepare, manage and present their own exhibits.
- 5. Exhibitors will conduct themselves with sportsmanship, integrity and cooperation with all participants.
- 6. In the case of animals.
 - a. Exhibitors will exhibit healthy animals and handle them with care.
 - b. Exhibit them in their unaltered conformation except for common animal husbandry practices.
 - c. Use all pharmaceuticals, biologics and other chemicals lawfully and with notification to fair management as it specifies.

IN FULFILLMENT OF THEIR RESPONSIBILITIES, THE DIVISION OF FAIRS AND EXPOSITIONS AGREE TO THE FOLLOWING PRINCIPLES FOR COMPETITION:

- 1. Fairs will advocate and enforce the printed rules.
- 2. In the case of rule violations or in practices determined to be unethical and inappropriate with the competitive exhibit program:
 - a. The Fair has the right to deny entry or remove any exhibitor or exhibit that is determined ineligible or whose presentation is deemed not in the best interest of the fair, endangers the public, or has violated the rules.
 - b. The Fair shall discipline such exhibitors as deemed appropriate.
 - c. The Fair shall submit a written report of such discipline to the appropriate governing body of the Division of Fairs and Expositions, regulatory agency, youth or breed association.
- 3. Fair staff will conduct themselves with integrity, professionalism and cooperation with all participants.
- 4. Fair staff will not be responsible for the accuracy of Exhibitor's entry forms.
- 5. Fair management reserves the right to cancel, augment, or replace any DIVISION or CLASS and combine Division and or classes as it deems necessary for competition purposes.

- 1. Each exhibitor is solely responsible for any direct or consequent loss, injury or damage done to or occasioned by or arising from any animal or article exhibited by him/her and shall indemnify the Association against any legal proceedings in regard there to. After audit of 'premium paid', any over payment of premium awards shall be refunded to the fair.
- 2. All property of every character entered for competition or display or for any purpose being on the Fairgrounds shall be subject to the control of the Association, which will exercise great care and precaution for its safe preservation, but in no case will this Association or its officers or agents be liable in damages for injury to a person or property or loss of destruction of property of an exhibitor or patron of the Fair or be responsible for any accident, loss or damage or what-so-ever nature that may occur on the Fairgrounds or at any other place or time. Should property owners desire protection against loss or damage or injury from fire or other causes, they must make their own arrangements.
- 3. California State Rules will take precedence over any entry into the fair. No exceptions. All rules contained in the State Rules for California Fairs as prescribed by the Divisions of Fairs and Expositions apply to this fair. - 5. Entries close and entry forms must be postmarked by: Wednesday, April 15, 2015, 5:00 P.M.
- 6. NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED.
- 7. No refunds will be issued under \$5.00.
- 8. All non-Livestock exhibits will be released on Monday, May 18, 2015 from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Pick up prior to 8:00 a.m. on May 19, may be done by appointment only through the building supervisor. The 42nd District Ag Assn. will NOT be responsible for any articles left after May 19 at 5:00 p.m. See Livestock Section for Livestock Release times.
- 9. TRAILER AND CAMPER SPACES: Trailer and camper spaces are available for \$350.00 for the duration of the fair, and are on a FIRST-COME-FIRST-SERVE BASIS. THERE WILL BE NO GUARANTEE OF UTILITY AVAILABILITY. Prior arrangements must be made at the fair office. Spaces are limited. 2014 trailer space allocation does not automatically provide space in 2015. Maximum length of trailers shall be 28 feet. For the price of \$350.00, each trailer space (value of \$245.00=\$35/night) will receive 2 season passes (value of \$70.00) and 1 vehicle parking pass (value of \$35.00). Parents MUST be with child 18 years old and under.
- 10. SECURITY: Security will be on duty for 24 hours during the fair.
- 11. PREMIUM CHECKS: Premium checks will be mailed from the fair after June 1, 2015. All premium checks not cashed after 120 days will be void. Errors in payment of premiums must be corrected by July 1, 2015.
- 12. AWARDS: Awards will be forfeited if "Signature of Owner or Agent" is in printed form on the entry form. A signature is required for disbursement of funds.
- 13. BEST OF SHOW: The selection of Best in Show does not qualify the exhibit for participation at the California State Fair. The state has discontinued Best of Show participation by counties
- 14. JUDGING: The official placing are those designated on the judging sheets. Placement of ribbons or ribbon stickers does not constitute official placing. Decisions of the Judges are final and cannot be protested. Judging will not be delayed in any case for late exhibitors. Judging schedules may be changed by the management.
- 15. ZERO TOLERANCE: Glenn County Fair, in conjunction with local law enforcement agencies, adopted a "No Tolerance Policy". The policy simply says any minor caught drinking an alcoholic beverage, in possession of an alcoholic beverage or giving alcohol to other minors will be arrested, turned over to the local police department and prosecuted to the fullest extent of the law. - 4) Exact number of specimens must be adhered to. A bouquet is made up of 7 or more flowers and foliage.
- 5) Plant matter in dried arrangements must be ALL NATURAL (no silks) and they may be dried or sprayed.
- Fresh arrangements must contain fresh flowers and/or plant material.
- 7) If fruit is used in arrangements, it may not be cut open or sliced, but must remain whole.
- 8) Judges' decisions are final. She/He may reserve the right to award a 2nd or 3rd place or no premiums, if in his/her judgment, the exhibit is not worthy of a higher award.
- 9) If any problems or questions arise regarding floriculture exhibits or displays, exhibitors are to first contact the Floriculture Department
- 10) Exhibitors are discouraged from bringing anything of value to use in exhibits as the Fair is not responsible for theft, breakage or damage to said items.
- 11) The Fair provides vases for the specimens, tables for table settings and companion pieces, the boxes for shadow boxes and trays to put under plants for watering. While exhibitors may bring their own vases, etc. instead of using the Fair's, the exhibitor need to remember rule #12 above.
- 12) Work on Garden Exhibits may begin on Tuesday, May 12, 2015, 7:00 a.m. 5:00 p.m., thru Wednesday, May 13, 2015, 8:00 a.m. 1:00 p.m. Any other times must be approved by Department Head. All garden booths must be completed by 10:00 a.m. on Wednesday, May 13, 2015.
- 13) Each indoor garden booth is approximately 10' x 10', and a height limit of 8'. There should be a minimum of exposed dirt. No silk or artificial plants. Any accessories appropriate to setting are permitted, however, the exhibitor needs to remember rule #12 above.
- 14) Indoor gardens must be free standing. Do not nail to prevailing walls.
- 15) Each club/organization must provide their own uniformly lettered signs, no larger than 24" x 18" advertising their club/organization. Said signs will be face down at the front of the booth and will be turned over after judging.
- 16) After completion of the fair, all garden areas must be leveled to a smooth terrain, with no display materials left in garden area. Tear down will be Monday, May 18, 2015 between 8:00 a.m. and 12:00 p.m. Garbage bins will be available. There will be NO security after noon on Monday.





SILENT AUCTION


FFA Students, who want to sell their school agricultural mechanics projects at the Glenn County Fair, can do so by participating in the Ag Mechanics Silent Auction. The auction takes place and it runs concurrently and adjacent to the Jr. Livestock Auction.

Students, who want to sell their agriculture mechanics projects at the Silent Auction, must adhere to the following conditions:

- 1) Projects to be auctioned must have been entered in this year's Ag Mechanics Divisions contest and awarded a 1st place.
- 2) Students must notify the Silent Auction Coordinator of their decision to sell and submit a starting bid price for each entry. This notification must be made no later than 1 pm Thursday, May 15th prior to the auction on Saturday.
- 3) All projects sold will be assessed an auction cost fee of 4.5%. Students selling projects are obligated to help with the auction activities during the hours of 10:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. on selling day.
- 4) The Junior Livestock Auction will sell up to 100 lots from vocational education dept J Ag. Mechanics in a silent auction format on Saturday May 17, 2015 during Junior Livestock Auction. Only blue ribbon winners will sell. If more than 100 lots are submitted each exhibitor may be limited to selling only one item, the best of show project may sell at live auction during the sale of champions.

Failure to comply with the Silent Auction Rules will result in a student's ineligibility to participate in the auction.

DEFINITIONS

<u>Weed Collections</u>- Dried specimens of at least 12 weeds common to vegetable and/or agronomic crops. Mounted in scrapbook format. Labeling shall include common and scientific names, area collected from, crops and areas where infestation is common.

<u>Plant Science</u>- Any subject area relating to the production, health or propagation of plants. Exhibit shall not exceed 2' x 2 ½' in size. Parts labeling and description of steps/stages shall be completed where they are applicable.

<u>Veterinary Science</u>- Any subject area relating to the production, health or reproduction of small or large animals. Exhibit shall not exceed 2' x 2 ½' in size. Parts labeling and description/stages shall be completed where they are applicable.

<u>Agricultural Business</u>- Design business card, business envelope, and letterhead stationery that best represents you and your FFA project. The exhibit shall not exceed 24" x 30" in size. Include a copy of your artwork enlarged to 8 ½" x 11". Design information should be provided. Any artwork or slogan NOT created by the exhibitor must be noted on the display OR prepare a personal resume no longer than 2 pages, mounted on poster board in a format such that it can be seen without turning.

<u>Any Other FFA Agricultural Science Project</u>- Similar size, labeling number of species, etc., as required in above classes. Could include such projects as Landscape Design.
