A MOTHER AND CHILDREN GET A HOME

Lakendria lost her job when she was pregnant with her third child. With no income, she eventually lost her home.

She and her two children lived with her sister for five months and then moved in with her mother. But after only a month, her mother was evicted from her home. Although her mother had an opportunity to move in temporarily with friends, Lakendria and her children had no place to go.

On the day of the eviction, Lakendria's mother took her daughter and grandchildren to a fire station in Irving near where they had been living. Lakendria was six-months pregnant. Desperate for help, she was upset and crying. A firefighter contacted our Carr P. Collins Social Service Center in Dallas to request help for the family. The Irving Police Department gave them a ride to the center.

The family began staying at our emergency women's shelter. After a month, they got into our transitional

shelter program, which provided them with their own room for the next eight months. During that time, Lakendria received counseling and attended parenting and money management classes.

"There were a lot of different programs and resources to go through to actually get you to where you needed to be,"

Lakendria said.

Lakendria gave birth to her third child during the time she was staying in our shelter. When the baby was born, we provided a crib, as well as linens, clothes, and baby formula.

a job as a teacher
at Head Start of
Greater Dallas.
Since she was
living in our
shelter, she was
able to work and

save money for an

apartment. When the family moved out of the shelter, we provided beds for their new home.

"The Salvation Army helped me to realize that it's not over until you want to give up and you want to stop," Lakendria said. "And for them, I will never stop. I will never give up. I will keep pushing until I can push no more."

OUR COMPLETELY RENOVATED COMMUNITY CENTER OPENS IN PLEASANT GROVE

But after more than a half century of service, it was time for an upgrade of the old center. Over the past year, a major remodeling project has been underway to create a beautifully renovated Salvation Army community center in Pleasant

Grove. The center will be a welcome beacon of hope for many more decades to come.

The center includes a state-of-the-art outdoor sports complex with lighted fields, a completely remodeled worship space, a gymnasium with maple floors striped for both basketball and volleyball, a dedicated food pantry space to help meet food insufficiency needs, a renovated kitchen with new commercial equipment, an upgraded multipurpose room with a new audio-visual system, a laundry room to wash athletic uniforms, and much more parking for local residents to access programs offered to the community.
