# American Royal Hunter/Jumper Show Special Awards

## The Pat D. Ford Memorial Trophy

The American Royal offers a number of special awards and trophies during the Hunter/Jumper Horse Show. The newest trophy, added in 2010, is the Pat D. Ford Memorial Trophy. The Pat D. Ford Memorial Trophy is awarded to the high point rider in the **Pony Hunter, Pony Jumper & Junior Equitation/Medal Classes.** This memorial trophy is sponsored by Mr. Ford's wife, Dolores, their children and grandchildren. The American Royal was pleased that Mrs. Ford and her family chose to honor Pat's memory through this special award. Dolores has worked with the Hunter/Jumper Show at the American Royal for 26 years and Pat Ford worked with the show for 20 of those years, writing computer programs, working with the entries and tabulating points. Pat is greatly missed here at the Royal but this beautiful trophy celebrates his life and his love for his family.

### Carol H. Durand Challenge Trophy

Carol Hagerman Durand, internationally known as the first woman to ride with the United States Equestrian Team, opened this door for women into what was then the "man's world" of riding. Mrs. Durand won her first show at the 1925 American Royal. She won many awards in horse shows across the country and became well-known as a judge.

She rode for the U. S. Equestrian Team in the early 1950's. As a member of the U.S. Team, she won the International Trophy at Madison Square Garden in 1954. It is unknown what heights she could have reached in the 1952 Olympics, because although qualifying, she was not permitted to compete at the time. The Federation Equestrian International saw Olympic jumping as "too hazardous for women". Ironically, her life did tragically end in 1970 when evaluating a jumper that reared and fell on her.

Before her marriage to Dana Durand of Kansas City, the former Carol Hagerman served 22 months with the Red Cross overseas. She was one of four young women who established a Red Cross canteen in the jungles of India for combat engineers along a 200-mile stretch known as the Burma Road.

She shared her knowledge and enthusiasm with her many friends, especially her work with young people. She was an advisor to the Kansas City Dressage Society, a co-founder of the Mission Valley Hunt Club and the Mission Valley Pony Club. Carol was also a jumping consultant at Stephens College for 25 years.

Carol Hagerman Durand is remembered for the joy she found in teaching children to ride and for her fearless spirit and great love of the sport. In 1983, she was inducted into the Greater Kansas City Amateur Sports Hall of Fame. The trophy room at the Headquarters for the United States Equestrian Team in Gladstone, New Jersey is named in her memory. Also, there is an exhibit at the American Royal Museum in her honor.

# JOE MACKEY MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

TROPHY CANE SPONSORED BY ONLY THE BEST OF KANSAS CITY

Joe Mackey was known as a great family man, great horseman, great friend, an exhibitor at the American Royal for 50 years, an outstanding polo player and a veteran huntsman of the Mission Valley Hunt. Joe, and his wife Gladys, operated Somerset Stables in Olathe, Kansas and was the guiding hand of the Mission Valley Pony Club. He was widely known and greatly respected throughout the United States. Both horses and people were benefactors of Joe's many skills as a tireless trainer, instructor and qualified judge. He instilled in his kids of the Mission Valley Pony Club, a keen spirit of winning through hard work and good sportsmanship. In addition to the \$500 scholarship the winner receives a cane, symbolic to one Joe used to rap on the American Royal rail as his young riders circled the ring.

The 2013 JOE MACKEY SCHOLARSHIP of \$500 will be awarded to the Junior rider who accumulates the most points during the American Royal. Each junior exhibitor must ride the **SAME HORSE** throughout all classes. In case of a tie score, the money will be divided equally.
