Exposition Plans 89th Annual Fundraiser With Family Events Planned “Along For The Ride” is the Theme for the 2012 Event

Each year the Amarillo Tri-State Exposition sets the stage to *ooh* and *aah* visitors at its annual fundraiser the Texas Farm Bureau Insurance Companies Tri-State Fair & Rodeo. This year will be no exception.

The most noticeable change will be when visitors head to the concession area to tempt their taste buds. Not only does it look new and improved but there is shade to enjoy your refreshments from one of our many vendors.

In addition to facility renovations that can be enjoyed year-round the fair entertainment has taken on a bit of a twist. “As a committee we were committed to bringing more entertainment to this year’s fair. We have booked six bands of local, regional and national appeal, said Tod Mayfield, Entertainment Committee Chair. “We are also bringing numerous new acts and past favorites to perform during the day and early evening. We truly believe this year’s fair will have something for everyone.” Six nights of musical entertainment are being offered as well as entertainment the fair community can get involved in. The musical line-up includes: Tejas Brothers, Dirty River Boys, Eleven Hundred Springs, Rodney Parker & 50 Peso Reward, Ray Wylie Hubbard and Billy Joe Shaver. New to the traditional line-up of the petting zoo, pig races and log climbers will be a Hollywood Stunt Show, Rhinestone Roper, Banana Derby, Kid’s Celebration and a Shark Show.

Each day the fair offers great specials on gate admission and ride discounts so be sure and check out the website to find those. Student coupon nights will be held Monday, Sept. 17, Wednesday, Sept. 19 and Thursday, Sept. 20. “We added the additional student night on Thursday so that families would have an additional evening to spend together at the fair,” said Virgil Bartlett, General Manager, Amarillo-Tri-State Exposition. “Thursday night includes the first night of the PRCA Rodeo so we look for this to be a big draw for families.”

Exposition Grounds See Improvements

Construction began in March on a 40’ x 600’ covered area that will serve the Exposition in many facets. “The area referred to as the “Corral” to those of us at the fairgrounds was built to serve the community in many different ways,” said Virgil Bartlett, General Manager, Amarillo Tri-State Exposition. “It will serve as a food court during the fair but additionally we can rent the facility for car or motorcycle shows, BBQ cook-offs, dances, and have the ability for additional stalling should an event require it.”

The Bill Cody Arena has seen its share of renovations this summer also and equine enthusiasts will notice that immediately upon entering that facility. “We have air conditioned the restrooms, concessions area and included a lounge in the area that was once the stalling office,” Bartlett said.



2012 Scholarship Recipients



Cheyenne Dawn Hagerman of Amarillo graduated from River Road High School and was active in both 4-H for 10 years and FFA for 6 years. She was one of the pioneers of the Vet Science 4-H program in Potter County. She has shown steers, pigs, lambs and goats at the Tri-State Fair. She was a State Representative for the Texas 4-H Congress and presented a bill to the 4-H judiciary committee in Austin. She was a “section leader” in the River Road Band at her High School. She implemented a fundraising plan to purchase and plant 40 trees at the new school. Cheyenne plans to pursue pre-veterinary studies at West Texas A & M University and then pursue her Doctor of Veterinary Medicine Degree at Texas A&M in College Station. She would like to open her own practice specializing in large and exotic animals.



Casen Losey Hawkins was raised in Quitaque where he attended Turkey-Valley schools for the majority of his schooling. He graduated from Valley High School in May. He was very active in both FFA and FCCLA. Casen showed heifers and pigs locally and regionally. He qualified for state in both dairy judging and wildlife FFA CDE contests. He was “high individual” in dairy cattle and wildlife in area contests his junior year. He served as a committee chairman for FFA and held class offices his sophomore, junior and senior years. While at Valley, Casen played football, track, and basketball. In the fall, Casen plans to attend West Texas A & M University and major in animal science and get his teaching certificate.
