Affordable and convenient, you are encouraged to take advantage of the camping facilities offered on the Arkansas State Fairgrounds during the Arkansas State Fair. No camp sites will be reserved in advance. Sites are available on a first come basis only. Campers will be allowed on the Fairgrounds at 7 AM—Saturday, October 5. Arrive at Gate 11.

- Water, 50-amp Electricity & Sewer: \$45 per day
- Water, Electricity & Sewer: \$35 per day
- Water & Electricity Only: \$30 per day
- Electricity Only: \$25 per day

POWER CORD RULES

1. Due to changes in our grooming areas per national and state electrical codes there will only be one GFCI outlet per grooming area. Any grooming done with electricity must be done in grooming areas or inside barns.
2. No power cords can be run from inside the barns to the outside of a barn.
3. In cases of wet conditions exhibitors may not be allowed to use Grooming Areas or Power Cords. ASF Livestock Office will notify Exhibitors if this action needs to be taken. The decision will be made by ASF Livestock Management with the recommendation of the ASF Electrician.
4. Only one power cord allowed per electric outlet. No quad or duplex boxes will be allowed on the end of a power cord and only one dryer, fan, radio, etc. per power outlet.
5. All cords must be a heavy-duty commercial cord with a ground. Cords must also be of proper length (do not run 100 ft. of cord if 10 ft. from outlet).
6. All cords must be in top condition. No ragged, taped or altered cords will be allowed.
7. No power cords can be run on the ground where water is present, across roadways or public walkways.
8. All electrical boxes will remain locked and accessible ONLY to Arkansas State Fair Electrical/Maintenance Dept. Staff and some Livestock Office Staff.
9. The Arkansas State Fair Staff reserves the right to inspect any equipment, cords, electrical connections, etc. AT ANY TIME. Failure to cooperate with the instructions of State Fair personnel will result in immediate disqualification from competition at any Arkansas Livestock Show Association competition for a minimum of one year and premiums for the current year Arkansas State Fair will be forfeited.
10. Failure to comply with these regulations may result in confiscation of cords and/or equipment, forfeit of premiums, immediate disqualification from competition at the Arkansas State Fair for a minimum of one year, or any combination thereof.
11. Absolutely **no generators allowed in barns or breezeways**. Grooming Chute areas only!
12. No butt fans allowed in barns.



FIRE MARSHALL REGULATIONS PROHIBITED ITEMS / ACTIONS IN BARNs

The Fire Marshall has directed that all streets must be clear on move-in days.

Any unattended vehicle will be towed immediately without notice at the owner's expense.

PROHIBITED ITEMS / ACTIONS IN ALL BARNs LOCATED ON ARKANSAS STATE FAIRGROUNDS

Tents in Barns

Hot Plates

Microwaves

Televisions

Slow Cookers

Smoking

Butt fans

Refrigerators are only allowed if proper electrical guidelines have been met and the refrigerator is positioned on a sturdy, well elevated piece of wood or blocks.

Refrigerators sitting on straw or hay will be immediately removed from the barn.

NO tarps or covered stalls are allowed in any Livestock Barn at any time. If you choose to sleep in the barn at night, you are not allowed to cover any stall or pen even at night. All bedding must be completely out of sight no later than 6 AM. Exhibit areas must be kept neat and clean at all times. NO microwaves, coffeepots, hotplates, televisions, slow cookers, etc. are allowed in the barns. Exhibitors are encouraged to utilize the Exhibitor Eating Areas provided by the Arkansas State Fair. Please refer to maps posted during Fair.



MOTORIZED VEHICLES ON STATE FAIRGROUNDS

1. The Arkansas State Fair will allow livestock exhibitors, vendors, service companies, and carnival members to utilize golf carts, 3-wheelers, 4-wheelers, and 6-wheelers during the Arkansas State Fair.
2. In order to be eligible for this privilege, the driver must abide by the following rules:
 - Vehicle must be registered with ALSA Security upon arrival at Fairgrounds.
 - The vehicle must be operated by a person 16 years of age or over, who has a valid driver's license.
 - The driver must provide a liability insurance certificate for \$100,000/\$300,000 liability limits that covers the vehicle and the authorized operator(s).
 - An Arkansas State Fair permit must be purchased from ALSA Security (at a charge of \$100) for each vehicle prior to being operated on the Fairgrounds.
 - Permit must be displayed in a visible location on the vehicle at all times.
 - No more than two people per vehicle will be allowed to ride. No one will be allowed to stand on back or ride on vehicle in any manner other than within the proper seat.
 - Vehicles may only be operated and parked only in permitted areas designated on map, provided at check-in.
 - No vehicle will be allowed in pedestrian areas during open hours of the Fair.
 - Speed limit for golf carts, 3-wheelers, 4-wheelers, and 6-wheelers is five miles per hour. Any violation of these rules may result in the vehicle being impounded until Fair closes on the last Sunday night of the Fair.
 - ALSA Security and Management have full Jurisdiction enforcement authority over the proper operation and parking location of these vehicles.
 - The vehicle and operating procedure are the sole responsibility of the person who signs the permit.
