

# 4-H AND FFA YOUTH RULES

1. Eligibility of all 4-H and FFA Divisions is limited to enrolled members of 4-H Clubs and FFA Chapters. 4-H Members must be enrolled by 03/01/18 (late enrollment carries a fine between 03/01/18 and 05/31/18; no enrollments after 05/31/18).
2. Exhibitors must meet age requirements and must state such on entry form. Classifications are as follows:
  - 4-H PRIMARY** (5–7 as of 10/01/17)
  - 4-H JUNIOR** (8–10 as of 10/01/17)
  - 4-H INTERMEDIATE** (11–13 as of 10/01/17)
  - 4-H SENIOR** (14 to less than 19 as of 10/01/17)
  - FFA** (must be enrolled in High School Program School Year Prior to Showing)
3. 4-H and FFA Departments are open to enrolled members in projects and organizations in which they expect to exhibit.
4. 4-H and FFA Exhibitors living in or attending school in Benton and Franklin Counties or in the Burbank School District may participate in the Fair.
5. **4-H & FFA Exhibitors enrolled in and exhibiting any food producing animal must obtain the Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) certification by Tag Day, or July 1 for animals not being tagged, to be eligible to show. Further information on this certification can be found at: [www.yqca.org](http://www.yqca.org). YQCA certification is required for 4-H & FFA exhibitors showing any of the animals listed below:**
  - Beef & Dairy Cattle
  - Swine
  - Sheep
  - Market & Dairy Goats
  - Rabbits, Cavies & Pocket Pets
  - Poultry & Waterfowl
  - Pigeons, Game & Cage Birds
6. 4-H and FFA Members may enter Open Class, but they may not show the same animal or still life exhibits in 4-H or FFA. A separate animal or exhibit must be entered.
7. The Fair Board does not encourage any persons to stay overnight on the grounds. If it is necessary for exhibitors to stay, all youth must have adult supervision. Anyone outside of campers and tents after curfew (midnight) will forfeit all premiums, as well as the right to continue to participate in the Fair. The Fair will provide security to see that this rule is enforced.
8. Animals exhibited in any youth division must be owned or leased, shown, fitted, and cared for by the exhibitor, and entered in his or her name. Animals registered in the

family name but not listed with the County Extension Office or with the FFA instructor by May 31 will not be eligible to show in the 4-H and FFA Divisions.

9. Exhibitor is required to keep animal supplied with water, feed, and clean bedding from arrival until the animal leaves the Fairgrounds. Bedding will be available to purchase at the Fair Office, or you may bring your own. All livestock exhibitors will be subject to a \$5 bedding fee, which includes one bag of shavings.
10. Any exhibit deemed not worthy will not be displayed or judged.
11. Cage and stall fees are waived for 4-H and FFA exhibitors.
12. 4-H and FFA stall cards can be picked up at Fair Office or from Barn Superintendent.
13. These General Rules listed also apply to the Youth Departments.
14. No animal may be removed or replaced with another animal without the consent of the Fair Board Member in charge of that department.
15. Exhibitors who have outside help fitting their animal by others that are not currently enrolled in 4-H or FFA, including parents, will lose all premium monies and may be banned from future fairs.
16. Exhibitors must receive a blue ribbon in Fitting and Showing to be eligible for the Championship Round. 4-H Junior, Intermediate, Senior and FFA Fitting and Showing Division Champions will compete in the Large Animal Round Robin in the Benton Franklin Fair Sale Barn at 6 p.m. Thu., Aug. 23, for the title of Grand Champion Showman.
  - a. In 4-H and FFA Large Animal Round Robin, each contestant will provide an animal for the following age division to show in the Large Animal Round Robin: 4-H Junior, 4-H Intermediate, 4-H Senior and FFA. Departments participating in this event include Dairy, Horse, Steer, Goat, Lamb, and Swine.
    - i. Each exhibitor must show the animal they showed in Fitting and Showing.
    - ii. Exhibitors must dress appropriately, as for Fitting and Showing.
    - iii. Exhibit good sportsmanship.
  - b. Awards include Rosettes to First Place in Dairy, Horse, Steer, Goat, Lamb and Swine. Belt Buckles go to First Place winners in 4-H Junior, 4-H Intermediate, 4-H Senior, and FFA.
17. 4-H and FFA LIVESTOCK DRESS CODE
  - a. Exhibitors should be clean and neatly dressed in official FFA uniform or jeans or slacks with a short or long-sleeved shirt, blouse or T-Shirt. (T-Shirts must be plain, however 4-H Club Name is acceptable).
  - b. Clothing should not be revealing or offensive in nature. No bare midriffs. No low-cut tops or pants that reveal underwear. Any article of clothing that has rips, tears, or holes in unacceptable. If in doubt, *don't wear it*.
  - c. The ruling of the Fair Board and Department Superintendents is **FINAL**. Non-compliance with this dress code will result in being excused from the show ring and loss of premiums.
  - d. Close-toe shoes or boots are required while showing livestock and while in all livestock barns.
18. 4-H and FFA LIVESTOCK JUDGING
  - a. No pre-entries are required for FFA. 4-H must pre-enter online.

- b. Any member is eligible to judge in the division in which their project is enrolled. There will be no team judging in 4-H
- c. Any FFA Chapter may enter one team of five members. Other members may judge as individuals.
- d. Banners will be awarded to the three highest placing teams and individuals in FFA Livestock and Dairy Judging.
- e. Premium money will be awarded in the Junior, Intermediate, and Senior Division of 4-H.
- f. Rules governing State 4-H and FFA Contests will apply.
- g. Classes offered will depend on exhibits available for judging at the Fair.
- h. Participants must pick-up ribbons and banners at the time specified on the bulletin board. No ribbons will be mailed.
- i. To enter judging, refer to the department. Livestock judging: beef, sheep, and swine refer to Department 43.
