1. Before entering, refer to General Information.

Exhibits to be released between 8–10 a.m. Sun., 8/26.
3. LIMIT: One entry per class.
4. All entries must be crafted and completed by the exhibitor within the last year.

Wheat weaving a small wreath:

1. Soak wheat on stalk (from craft stores or local farmers) in a tub of water for an hour or so.
2. Holding three seed heads together, braid the stems of the wheat stalks.
3. Curve the ends around to make an oval loop, a circle wreath, or even bend it a bit to make a heart shape.
4. Tie with brightly colored ribbon. As the stalks dry, they'll hold their shape.

1. Exhibit featuring wheat only stems with or without leaves, in natural state, which best depicts theme; vase or container only. Not over 24 inches tall, including container.
2. Exhibit featuring wheat and other grains, stems and/or kernels, color spraying and minimum of accessories permitted. Not over 36 inches tall, including container.
3. Exhibit featuring braided or formed wheat designs may include animals, people, birds or other forms with wheat stalk and heads.
