## OPEN CLASS GOATS

1. Before entering, refer to General Information and Livestock Rules and Regulations, and Herdsmanship.
2. Stall fee per animal is \$2 (non-refundable), and due with exhibitor fee. All livestock exhibitors will be subject to a \$5 bedding fee, which includes one bale of straw. Additional bedding will be available for purchase at the Fair Office or you may bring your own.
3. Animals to arrive on the grounds between 8 a.m.-7 p.m. Mon., 8/20.
4. Animals must be checked by the official Fair Veterinarian prior to unloading them. The Fair veterinarian's decision to the health status of an animal is FINAL.
5. 4-H and FFA entries will be given priority for available barn space.
6. Open class entries will be limited to two goats per breed, per class, with no more than 8 goats total entered per individual. No more than 16 goats total entered per family, farm, firm or herd. Additional restrictions may be imposed depending upon availability of space and number of entries. Every attempt will be made at fairness to all exhibitors. All animals must be in place by 7 p.m. Mon., 8/20. None will be admitted late.
7. Due to the high risk of Q-Fever shedding in goats near kidding time, we will not allow does that are within 30 days before or after giving birth into the fair.
8. Senior does will show starting at 9:30 a.m. Thu., 8/23; group classes to follow. Show whites preferred. All clothing must be neat and clean.
9. No solid display boards or solid kick pen boards restricting air flow allowed in the goat barn.
10. All grains MUST be kept in tightly sealed containers. No tack on top of pens.
11. All pens MUST be cleaned daily and properly secured (no baling twine, wire or string).
12. Tack areas should be neat and free of clutter. Only items that directly pertain to the animals and your display should be visible. Personal items should be kept at your campsite or in a tack box.
13. All animals must have a required USDA or WSDA Scrapie Eradication Flock ID Tag or registered Tattoo. Check all of your animal registrations to be sure they have been

accepted by the ADGA, American Boer Goat Association or Miniature Goat registry. Be sure to check for proper tattoos before the fair.

1. Doe kids, 0 and under 3 months (refer to rule #7)
2. Doe kids, 3 months and under 6 months
3. Doe kids, 6 months and under 9 months
4. Doe kids, 9 months and under 12 months
5. Dry yearlings, 12 months and under 18 months, never kidded, never in milk
6. Dry yearlings, 18 months and under 24 months, never kidded, never in milk

RESERVE JUNIOR CHAMPION (classes 1- 6) – Ribbon Only

8. Does, 18 months and under 24 months, having kidded, in milk (refer to rule #7)
9. Does, 2 years and under 3 years, having kidded, in milk (refer to rule #7)
10. Does, 3 years and under 4 years, having kidded, in milk (refer to rule #7)
11. Does, 4 years and under 5 years, having kidded, in milk (refer to rule #7)

12. Does, 5 years and older, having kidded, in milk (refer to rule #7)

**CLASS**

13. Best udder, any doe in milk may be entered (refer to rule #7, two or more animals must be competing. No premium, ribbon only.) (No Boers may enter)
14. Senior get-of-sire, to consist of at least one milking doe (refer to rule #7)
15. Produce of dam, to consist of two does from the same dam.
16. Dam and daughter, any age female.
17. Three generations or more.
18. Breeder’s herd, to consist of four does, any age, bred and owned by exhibitor. One herd per exhibitor, per breed.
19. Dairy herd, to consist of four does in milk. All must be owned by exhibitor. One herd per exhibitor, per breed. (refer to rule #7). (Boers do not need to be in milk)
