

Camping During Fair Week

1. All campers must check-in at the Fair Office prior to entering your assigned campsite. Fair Campsite Attendant will assist you to the exact location of your space.

2. When you check-in at the Fair Office, you will receive a Camping Permit. Your permit MUST be visible. Display it prominently on your unit so that it is visible from the driveway to the site, or at your entrance door.

3. All camping areas are marked on the map. Please come to the Fair Office and have the Campsite Attendant assist you to your assigned area, otherwise you will be asked to move, and if necessary, towed at the owner's expense.

FAIR WEEK 2019 CAMPING CHARGES:

- Designated RV Horseshoe Campground Site - \$70/week
- Cattle Barn Fence - \$50/week (Electrical)
- All other spaces with electricity - \$50/week (Electrical)
- Dry Camping - \$30/week (No Electrical)

4. Only one vehicle is allowed per campsite. If you need additional vehicle parking, you must purchase a Fair Week Parking Permit (\$10/week in the Fair Office), and park in the area designated by Fair Staff. Additional vehicles will be towed at the owner's expense.

5. Anyone parking their RV, Camper, or Tent prior to Sunday, Aug. 18th before 2 PM must have prior permission from the Fair, and be pre-registered and paid before arrival.

6. Camping is only open to exhibitors, superintendents, fair personnel, and volunteers - in designated areas. There are specific Dry Camping areas that are allowed in the fairgrounds, and you are required to register at the Fair Office BEFORE moving into your assigned camp space.

7. No camping behind the Food Booths, east of the Food Booths, in the South Parking Area (parking only), or on the South Lawns. These are strictly for parking and loading in and out.

8. Handicapped campsites are available on a limited basis with presentation of a state issued handicapped permit. You may call the Fair Office to reserve.

9. No one under the age of 19 may camp on the grounds unless camping with a responsible adult (leader/parent/relative). The responsible adult must also sign the camping registration sheet.

10. Dogs are encouraged to remain at home. Dogs must be on a leash and controllable at all times. Dogs may not be left tied up and unattended. All dogs must be current on rabies and other vaccinations and you are required to show records if requested.

11. Quiet Hours begin at 11:00 PM each night of Fair Week.

12. Use of a generator is NOT allowed from 10 PM - 7 AM.

13. NO AIR-CONDITIONERS are allowed to run off of Fair Electricity - regardless of your space type (RV Campground/ Cattle Barn, etc.), this pulls too much electricity and blows the breakers for everyone else.

14. Each Electrical Site is only allowed a maximum of 15 AMP draw per site, to limit blowing breakers during Fair Week.

15. Cords are to be less than 25 feet long. No extension cords allowed. They are a fire hazard.

16. Slide-Outs or Tip-Outs are not allowed to take up two spaces. If your slide-out is cutting into someone else's space, we will not allow it and will ask you to take it down.

17. During Fair Week, please help keep the bathrooms and showers clean and tidy, by cleaning up after yourself. Showers are located in the Indoor Arena under the grandstands and in the restrooms at the west end of the Food Booths (red food court building).

18. Showers will be closed from 12:00 Midnight - 5:00 AM.

19. The Bonner County Fair and Bonner County will not be responsible in case of fire, theft, accident, or loss of any kind.

20. Gates will be closed at 11:00 PM. Security Guards will be on the fairgrounds to make sure all non-camping vehicles are out for night hours.

21. All vehicles entering the fairgrounds at anytime during the week of fair must have a parking pass.

22. No livestock allowed in camping areas. Livestock must remain in barns.

23. RV Campers & Tents may not use electrical outlets assigned to other RV spaces.

24. Please report any incidents to the Fair Office & the Sheriff (if a serious situation).

25. Keep your camping area neat and clean. You may have a table and some chairs, etc. at your site. There will be no other household furniture allowed, ie; swimming pools, furniture, etc.
