Students must enter exhibits that match the departments and classes below. Pre-Fair will take place at the fairgrounds on Thursday, May 28 & Friday, May 29, 2020. All exhibits must be entered by teachers and delivered to the Fairgrounds 4-H Food Building by Friday, May 15th between 3 - 5 PM. We will judge all student's entries prior to Pre-Fair and attach ribbons and awards for display. Premiums will be distributed to schools on Wednesday, June 3rd.

PRE-FAIR EXHIBIT ENTRY DEPARTMENTS & CLASSES

*Please note that the classes and departments listed below will match the departments and classes for the 2020 Bonner County Fair's Fairbook. We encourage students to use these same entries from Pre-Fair and enter them again to the Fair in August!

Department 1A - Coloring Contest

The Bonner County Fair will provide a 4-page coloring book that will be posted on the Fair Website (under Events -> Pre-Fair) and on the Google Drive (link to the Pre-Fair Google Drive will be sent to all teachers). The first two pages are for ages K-2nd graders, and the last two pages are for 3-6th graders. Only the two pages that apply to the student's age need to be colored. On the back cover, all students must write the name of school, classroom, and student's name. The coloring books will be judged and displayed at Pre-Fair.

Department 1B - Recycled Farm Animal Frenzy

Farm Animal Frenzy pits classes against each other to use at least 80% recycled or recyclable material to create a life-sized farm animal. Examples: Cow made entirely from milk cartons, goat made from tire scraps, a chicken with a body of plastic bags woven through chicken wire, and so on. Ribbons and Premiums will be awarded per project, to go towards the classroom (not per student). A list of names will be required from teachers for students that participate. Legos are not allowed.

Department 10 - Junior Farmer Poster Contest

Celebrate agriculture and enter your poster or display at Pre-Fair. Poster should be mounted on construction paper for display (holes will be punched in top corners for hanging). Student entry must focus on one central theme:

For Pre-Fair, this department includes knitting, crocheting, needlework, handspun yarn and weaving. Please note that this is slightly different than the 2020 Fairbook, because we are combining all of these categories into one. In the Fairbook and during 2020 Fair, each of these categories will be a separate Department. All knitting entries must be made by exhibitor, clean and blocked (if necessary), ready for show.

Limit of 1 entry per Class (classes listed below), per student. Pieces must be mounted on construction paper for display, and two holes (one in top left corner and one in top right corner of construction paper) should be punched by teacher or student, for hanging during Pre-Fair. No work on lined notebook paper is allowed. NO Matte Board, and NO picture frames, please.

Entries must be from within this school year. Photos must be taken by student exhibitor. Limit of 1 entry per Class (listed below), per student. Pieces must be mounted on construction paper for display, and two holes (one in top left corner and one in top right corner of construction paper) should be punched by teacher or student, for hanging during Pre-Fair. NO Matte Board and NO picture frames!

All entries must be printed, and mounted on construction paper for display, and two holes (one in top left corner and one in top right corner of construction paper) should be punched by teacher or student, for hanging during Pre-Fair. If the project is only online, the link must be emailed to fairgrounds@bonnercountyid.gov. 3D objects won't need a construction paper mount.

This program is designed to encourage and expand the imagination produced by Creative Writing. Limit of 1 entry per Class (listed below), per student. Each entry must include: Student's Name, Teacher, and Name of School. All entries will be exhibited during Pre-Fair.

For each Class listed below, students must make either a display, labeled diagram, tri-board with pictures and descriptions, or model. The piece must be made by the student within the current school year. Lego Models are not allowed at Pre-Fair.

STEM & STEAM PROJECTS

In addition to the exhibit itself, these must include either a poster educational display, equipment, photography or a scrapbook. Labels and descriptions are encouraged. Ribbons and Premiums will be awarded per STEM/STEAM project, to go towards the classroom (not per student). A list of names will be required from teachers for students that participate (if not the whole class). If this is a whole classroom project, the teacher should write 'WHOLE CLASS' on the online entry form where it asks for the participant names.

2020 Online Entry

Online Entry will be available for teachers earlier this year. We want to allow our classrooms to begin entering their student's pieces much earlier, so we will have online entry available in February 2020 this year.


Online Entry is easy. You'll just go online to www.bonnercountyfair.com, and under the Events tab, you'll click on the "Pre-Fair 2020" link. From there, it will take you to our online entry page. Please note, each student's entry will need to be submitted separately.

You will receive an email confirmation for each exhibit entry submitted. No need to print them. Once submitted, all entries will be received and prepared by the Fair Office for judging.

Entry tags must be filled out and attached to each student's exhibit entry before arriving to the Fairgrounds for Pre-Fair (pre-fillable PDF exhibit tags will be available online as well). Entry tags must be attached to each entry before they arrive to the fairgrounds, so nothing gets lost or misplaced.
