Senior (Adult) Open Class is defined as an exhibitor who grows for their own personal use, not for profit.

RULES:

1. Read Open Class Creative Living Rules and Boulder County General Rules and Regulations. It is the Exhibitor's responsibility to be familiar with all rules.
2. **Please note that monetary premiums will only be awarded for classes with three or more entries. Ribbons will still be awarded.**
3. Exhibitors and public are encouraged to watch the judging, but no exhibitors will be permitted in the display area until judging is complete.
4. All non-perishable entries will be exhibited until they are released on Monday, August 13, 2018. **Perishable entries may be disposed of throughout the week.** Final release and ribbon pick-up is Monday, August 13, 2018.

5. An exhibitor may not make more than one (1) entry of the same variety in a Class, except as noted.
6. A limited number of display trays and containers for exhibits will be provided. Water is available in the Exhibit Building, if needed.
7. Maximum height for all herbs is twelve inches (12").
8. An unopened small bale of hay (80 lbs. or less) or a section from a large bale tied up or one 30 gallon bag of loose hay is required in the Field Crops classes. Judge will open bales at time of judging. Bales will be re-tied.

Guidelines for Exhibiting:

- A. The Fruit, Herb and Vegetable, classes will be judged on: Freshness, uniformity, flavor, color, texture/firmness & maturity, as applicable. Individual exhibits must consist of all the same variety of fruit, herb, vegetable and crop.
- B. For all classes follow rules & instructions for specifics: Number needed; height, weight, diameter or length limits; trimmed or not; peeled; husked; with or without stems.
- C. For a more appealing display, prepare product as if you would want to buy them. Clean and free of foreign matter.

AWARDS:

Ribbons will be awarded 1st–5th place for each class. 1st Place winners of each Class will compete for Champion & Reserve Champion for each class. All the Champions and Reserve Champions from the Jr. Youth (Dept. 104) and Sr. Adult (Dept. 103) from each class will compete for Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion ribbons.

- A. One entry per exhibitor per Class.

- C. No seeds or plant parts from weeds are allowed.
- D. Exhibit may have supporting structure other than plant parts but it must be 100% covered by seed or plant parts.
- E. Plant parts other than seeds may be used but a minimum of 50% of the area must be covered by seed.

Class: CROP ART

- 109. Seeds and plant parts of natural color, seeds of any origin, exhibit flat (i.e. picture/painting)
- 110. Seeds and plant parts of natural color, seeds only from Boulder County origin or of crops grown in Boulder County, exhibit flat (i.e. picture/painting)
