This department is subject to all Boulder County Fair General Rules and all Open Class Creative Living Rules in addition to those listed for the department. It is the Exhibitor's responsibility to be familiar with all rules.

RULES:

1. Read Open Class Creative Living Rules and Boulder County General Rules and Regulations.
2. When filling out entry form, **Surface Stitchery is Department 109.**
3. Articles must be entered in the name of the person who made them.
4. Entries in this department must have been completed in the last two years.
5. The superintendent reserves the right to define classifications for all items entered.
6. Depending on entries, superintendents will combine or divide lots to make sensible classes for judging.
7. Exhibitors may submit up to 3 items in each Class.
8. Enter your exhibit in the class that matched its most predominate technique. For example, if your cross-stitched piece has only a few beads do not enter it in the class for embellished cross stitch.
9. If entering in the junior/teen categories, the age of the exhibitor must be on the entry form.
10. Entries must be clean (no hoop marks, stains, etc.) and neat (blocked, pressed, etc.) or they will be disqualified.
11. The superintendents encourage exhibitors to enter all their completed work, not just that which they could get framed.
12. Exhibits must not have been previously entered in the Boulder County Fair.

NOTES

1. Please try to be fair in assessing whether you should enter the beginner/intermediate category or the advanced/professional category. If three or more of the following criteria apply to you, please enter in the advanced/professional category.
 - a. You have participated in a wide variety of workshops in different techniques.
 - b. You have confidence in working with many types of fabrics, fibers, and embellishments.
 - c. You have professionally taught or judged needlework.
 - d. You have been compensated to do stitchery for others.
 - e. A judge in a judged exhibit indicates that you should enter the advanced/professional class.
2. Keep in mind that you can be an advanced cross stitcher and a beginner at embroidery or needlepoint.
3. For judging purposes you may, if you wish, submit a 3" x 5" index card telling the the name and designer of your piece, whether it was purchased as a pattern, pattern plus, or a kit, and any changes to fibers, embellishments, etc. that you may have made. These cards are only for the judges and may not contain any personal information about you.
4. In addition, the superintendents encourage exhibitors to submit with their piece an additional 3" x 5" index card that contains information about the piece, such as who designed the pattern, how long it took you to do, how difficult it was for you, what your favorite part was, any special meaning it has for you, threads/fabric used, etc. We will hang these cards next to your exhibits.
5. Please cover any identifying marks, such as your name or initials.
6. Judging is open. The superintendents encourage all interested parties to attend.
7. All entries are judged according to merit. If a class has only one entry, that entry does not automatically qualify for a ribbon.

DEFINITIONS:

1. Embroidery techniques include cross stitch, crewel, needlelace, ribbon embroidery, black work, hardanger, pulled thread, etc.
2. Embellished means the piece includes beads, charms, buttons, etc., or that it uses specialty threads, such as metallics, rayons, silk ribbon, ribbon floss, etc.
3. Flat beading pieces include any beading stitches that are worked as a flat piece whether it is finished as a flat piece or finished into another shape that requires little or no additional bead work to achieve that shape.
4. Dimensional beading pieces include any beading stitches that are worked with increases, decreases, or other methods to create a three-dimensional piece either with or without a supporting shape underneath.
5. Beaded jewelry pieces such as necklaces, bracelets, and jewelry sets should be entered in Department 117 Arts and Crafts.
