Rules For Auction Sale

1. Entries in this auction are subject to General Livestock, General Sales and General Fair rules printed in the current year's catalog.
2. Auction will consist of 183 lots. Of those lots going to the sale it will be broken down in the following manner: Swine- 42, Goats – 42, Rabbits – 30, Lambs – 18, Steers – 18, Broilers – 17, Turkeys – 16. Each department will be responsible for their own placing of animals. The Junior Livestock Committee reserves the rights to make any changes. Lots will not be added by any department or person without the permission of the Junior Livestock Committee.
3. JLA committee reserves the right to add additional lots to support the scholarship fund, JCCA, and the General Sales committee.
4. All items in the Junior Livestock Auction will be sold by the lot.
5. Only one entry per exhibitor in these departments: Market Lamb, Market Steers, Market Rabbit, Market Swine, Market Broilers, Market Turkeys, and Market Goats can be sold at Auction with a total of two (2) items per individual. The Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion in each eligible department must sell. This is subject to the conditions governing the number of items exhibitor may sell noted in this rule.
6. A 5% sales fee will be charged by Brazoria County Fair Association.
7. No animal will be presented as breeding livestock or sold in the auction for the purpose of breeding.
8. Exhibitors selling in Auction are prohibited from making substitution of item sold. The item that qualified in the show to sell must be the item that sells and is delivered to the buyer/packing company/floor buyer. An exhibitor whose animal dies after qualifying for sale will retain his position in the sale order. The lot will be sold as a "Hard Luck" sale.
9. The exhibitors top placing animals must sell in the auction. All sellers having more than two (2) items eligible for the sale that they wish to drop from the sale, must notify the sales committee by 10 am Tuesday morning.
10. W-9 forms must be completed by each exhibitor in order to pick up sale lot back numbers.
11. Any animal that leaves the fairgrounds before the auction will not be eligible for auction with the exception of broilers. Grand and Reserve broilers must remain on grounds for the duration of the fair. All other animals listed and sold in the Junior Livestock Auction must remain on the fairgrounds until their posted release date.
12. There will be a release at 5 pm on Saturday afternoon, for all animals from Junior Livestock Auction that were Floored or are being shipped to the slaughter house per buyer's disposition. There will be a list of these exhibitors/ animals posted at the General Sales Office by 6 pm on the Friday. Exhibitors are required to check this list and have their animals ready for load out.
13. All exhibitors selling in the Junior Livestock Auction whose animal was NOT floored or sent to the processor on Saturday must pick up auction disposition paper between 6pm-8pm Saturday and be present on Sunday, October 18 to load and or deliver their animal.

14. All disposition papers must be signed by the buyer upon delivery. Exhibitor or guardian can sign when animal is "returned to exhibitor" per buyer's instruction. All signed disposition paperwork must be accompanied by a stamped, fully addressed thank you card(s) to the buyer and to any additional add-ons and returned to the fair office by November 30, 2020 before a check will be released. Any disposition paperwork received after this date may not be paid.st.

15. Add-ons will be accepted until October 31st

16. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor/parent to feed, water, and maintain each animal sold in auction until released to processor or delivered to buyer by exhibitor at their designated time.

17. Consequences for failure to comply with delivery rule will be loss of 50% net sale after 7 days and banned from participating in auctions the following year if not complied with delivery after 14 days.

Terms of Sale: Payment is due at the close of the Auction. Credit may be extended to previous buyers and to those who make arrangements with the Fair Office prior to the auction. With prior credit approval, the buyer will be sent a statement, which will be due and payable upon receipt. Visa/Mastercard/American Express/Discover Accepted.
