RULES AND CLASSIFICATION OF FAIRS

GRANGE and 4-H FAIRS

Each fair shall publish a premium book (exhibitors' guide or list), paper or on-line or both.

GRANGE FAIRS are sponsored by Granges. They are usually held indoors for a one day duration.

They **MUST** have the following exhibits in order to qualify for membership in the Association of Connecticut Fairs. Also, if there is an admission fee, they must honor any statewide passes issued by the Association of Connecticut Fairs.

Agricultural Products: Fruits, vegetables, flowers, trees, other plants, farm animals or their products.
Minimum of 50 exhibits to be in competition and to be judged and awarded prizes.

Home Arts: Baking, canning, needlework, handcrafts, hobbies including collections, art and photography. Minimum of 50 exhibits to be in competition and to be judged and awarded prizes.

4-H FAIRS are managed by 4-H organizations and their members.

They **MUST** have the following exhibits in order to qualify for membership in the Association of Connecticut Fairs. Also, if there is an admission fee, they must honor any statewide passes issued by the Association of Connecticut Fairs.

Agricultural Products: Fruits, vegetables, flowers, trees, other plants, farm animals or their products. Exhibits are to be in competition and to be judged and awarded prizes.

Home Arts: Baking, canning, needlework, handcrafts, hobbies including collections, art and photography. Exhibits are to be in competition and to be judged and awarded prizes.
