The CAM-PLEX Heritage Center Theater partners with CCSD to implement the Arts in Education program, directed by the Arts Education Facilitator at the CAM-PLEX and the Advisory Board at CCSD. The Advisory Board is made up of district staff at the elementary and secondary levels. The main contacts for this program within CCSD are the district Visual Arts and Performing Arts Facilitators. The Advisory Board meets three (3) times per school year.



Theater Etiquette

Please review this information with students prior to visiting the theater.

- Cell phones must be off. Not only is taking pictures in the theater against copyright laws, the lights and sound are distracting to the performers as well as audience members. Your phone can be confiscated and you may be removed from the theater for this offense.
- No food, drink, candy, or gum is allowed in the theater.
- Do not swing or play on the handrails. They are used to help patrons climb the stairs and are not toys.
- Visit the restroom before the performance begins.
- Talk quietly before and after the performance. Once the performance has started, **please do not talk**. Remember that the people around you and on stage can hear you.
- Keep your hands and feet to yourself. Please do not put your feet on the seat in front of you.
- When music begins to play or an announcer steps on stage, please stop talking and give them your full attention. Remain seated quietly while the show is in progress. If a performer asks for audience participation, please feel free to do so.
- Always be respectful of teachers, ushers, performers, and audience members. Stay with your teacher and classmates.
