

Section IV - FRESH VEGETABLES

- * One entry per exhibitor per class, UNLESS different varieties with variety name on each entry.
- * Must be displayed on disposable white plate or bowl furnished by exhibitor.
- * No wax or oil allowed on entries.
- * Display number of items denoted in each class.
- * Variety name should be listed on entry tag.

<u>Class 400</u>	Allium (onion, garlic, etc.) (3)
<u>Class 401</u>	Beans (5)
<u>Class 402</u>	Beets (3)
<u>Class 403A</u>	Bell Peppers (2)
<u>Class 403B</u>	Hot Peppers (3)
<u>Class 403C</u>	Sweet Peppers, not bell (3)
<u>Class 404</u>	Carrots, shown with greens intact (4)
<u>Class 405A</u>	Cherry Tomato (5)
<u>Class 405B</u>	Medium Tomato (e.g. paste) (3)
<u>Class 405C</u>	Large Tomato (1)
<u>Class 406</u>	Cole Crops (broccoli, cauliflower, cabbage, etc.) (1)
<u>Class 407</u>	Corn *Husk should be removed on one ear only (3)
<u>Class 408</u>	Cucumbers (3)
<u>Class 409</u>	Eggplant large (1) small (3)
<u>Class 410</u>	Leafy greens may be shown in water in clear glass container to prevent wilting (3)
<u>Class 411</u>	Okra (5)
<u>Class 412</u>	Potatoes (3)
<u>Class 413A</u>	Zucchini (3)
<u>Class 413B</u>	Yellow Summer Squash (3)
<u>Class 413C</u>	Other Summer Squash (3)
<u>Class 414</u>	Other: large (1) medium (3) small (5)

- * Must be ripe and displayed on disposal white paper plate or bowl furnished by exhibitor.
- * Display number of items denoted in each class.

<u>Class 500</u>	Blackberry (8)
<u>Class 501</u>	Blueberry (8)
<u>Class 502</u>	Melon (cantaloupe, honeydew, etc.) (1)
<u>Class 503</u>	Raspberry (8)
<u>Class 504</u>	Rhubarb with leaves (2); leaves may be removed by show officials after judging
<u>Class 505</u>	Stone (peaches, plums, etc.) (2)
<u>Class 506</u>	Other: large (1) medium (3) berry size (5)

BRING 3 GARDEN RELATED ITEMS -- SWAP FOR 3
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GENERAL SHOW RULES:

1. All plant material must be fresh, with exception of **Floral Arrangement** section.
2. All live plant material must be grown by exhibitor as of May 1. Only exception is the **Floral Arrangement** section which may use purchased material.
3. All elements (plants, pots, vases, etc.) must be clean, bug-free, disease-free, and well groomed.
4. Viewers' Choice will be awarded to one adult entry and one youth entry in each **section**, as merited by show officials.
5. Entry tag should list exhibitor's name, contact phone number, and entry name, including variety name (i.e. Mouse Ears Hosta, not just Hosta).
6. One entry per class per exhibitor except where noted.
7. Youth entries will be displayed and judged separately from adult entries.

Section I - POTTED PLANTS

- * Maximum size allowed - **12 inch container**
- * Exhibitors may have more than one entry in Classes 100 & 101 **IF** they are of different species (e.g. entry of african violet, gerbera daisy, orchid).
- * Exhibitors may have two entries each in Classes 102 & 103.

Class 100 Single plant grown for foliage
Class 101 Single plant grown for bloom and must be blooming
Class 102 **Succulent Garden** - minimum of 3 different succulents (jade, kalanchoe, cacti, etc.)
Class 103 **Combination Planting, 3 or more different plants**

Section II - FLORAL ARRANGEMENTS

- * Plant material must be minimum of 80% fresh, remaining 20% may be dried or accents. No artificial material allowed.

- * May use purchased material in this **SECTION ONLY**.

Class 200 Special Occasion -- Fresh Material
Class 201 Everyday -- Fresh Material
Class 202 Monochromatic -- Fresh Material
Class 203 Rose Bouquet - Minimum 12 stems / maximum 24 stems
Class 204 Arrangement in Repurposed Container - Choice of Material
Class 205 Fair Theme: "Tiki Lights & Country Nights"

Section III - CUT HORTICULTURE

- * Entries must be one stem, stalk, or spray.
- * Field crops will **NOT** be accepted as entries.
- * Entries must be displayed in clean, **COLORLESS** see-through containers furnished by exhibitor.
- * There should be no leaves in water.
- * Wedging material may be used.
- * Exhibitors may have more than one entry per class provided each entry is different type of plant (e.g. *Class 300 - zinnia entry, marigold entry, salvia entry or **different** variety WITH variety name listed on entry*).

Class 300 Annuals grown for bloom (**enter the bloom**)
Class 301 Annuals grown for foliage (e.g. coleus)
Class 302 Roses (may have multiple entries as long as each is different variety)
Class 303 Perennials grown for bloom **and must be blooming**, (e.g. daylily, coneflower, hibiscus); NOTE: daylily entry should have bloom and buds
Class 304 Perennials grown for foliage (e.g. single stem sedum or single leaf hosta)
Class 305 Corms, bulbs, tubers (1 stalk) (e.g. one stalk canna or gladiolus or dahlia, etc.)
Class 306 Herbs (1 stalk or stem)
