### FLORICULTURE DEPARTMENT RULES

**Please also read the General Information, Rules and Regulations of the Fair.**

- Entry form must be completed by exhibitor as to Division, Exhibit number, Color and Class number, if required. If you need assistance, please ask a Clerk.
- Containers will be furnished for Chrysanthemums, Dahlias, Flower Specimens, Glads and Roses. Containers for all other classes must be furnished by the exhibitor and should be plainly marked with name taped on the bottom of the container. The Fair management will not be responsible for the loss of containers or accessories.
- Specimens must be grown by exhibitor. Exhibitors are encouraged to change their flowers (specimens or designs) to keep the show looking fresh. Any deteriorated specimens will be removed and destroyed.
- Designs are to consist of naturally grown materials. No plastic flowers. Accessories permitted in designs.
- Competition is open to the public, all ages.
- Any flowers brought after specified deadline may be left for exhibition only if space permits.
- If an entrant has over 15 entries, please bring them at least ½ hour before deadline time.
- Whenever possible, flower exhibits should be named on entry form. If unsure of name, contact Superintendent and/or clerk for assistance.
- Professionals may not enter in Open Class Floriculture – may only enter in Professional Class Floriculture. A professional is a person who engages in any aspect of the floral industry as a livelihood rather than as a hobby. Professionals are required to pre-enter online – please see Division 20 for details.

#### Helpful Hints for Exhibitors:

- ❖ Make a list of possible entries early so they will be well-groomed at entry time. Entries should be free of dust, mildew & insect

damage.

- ❖ Dahlias and Chrysanthemums need to be in proportion with height and size of bloom. Dahlias need foliage to accompany bloom.
- ❖ Glads should be 1/3 bloom, 1/3 bud, 1/3 closed.
- ❖ Roses need to be in bud ¼ to ½ open.
- ❖ Specimens need to be one blooming stalk or three items with one flower per stem.
- ❖ Potted plants need to be clear of dried foliage.
- ❖ For those of you who have access to the internet, there are several good sites for information on dahlias ([www.dahlia.org](http://www.dahlia.org)); roses ([www.ars.org](http://www.ars.org)); chrysanthemums ([www.mums.org](http://www.mums.org)).

### OPEN CLASS FLORICULTURE

#### CHRYSANTHEMUMS

##### DIVISION 1

#### First and Second Half Show

#### Classes:

1. Single – daisy like flowers – one (1) bloom disbudded.
2. Anemone – flowers like single, but with a rounded crest of deeper colored petals – one (1) bloom disbudded.
3. Quill – petals straight, long, and tubular – one (1) bloom disbudded.
4. Spider – petals long and tubular with hooked ends – one (1) bloom disbudded.
5. Spoon – petals spoon-shaped – one (1) bloom disbudded.
6. Garden Decorative, one (1) bloom reflex disbudded.
7. Garden Decorative, one (1) bloom incurve disbudded.
8. Garden Decorative, three (3) blooms, same color disbudded.
9. Garden Decorative, three (3) blooms, mixed colors.
10. Anemone, one (1) spray.
11. Cactus or Carnation, one (1) spray.
12. Spoon or Quill, one (1) spray.
13. Pompon – small, stiff, almost globular flowers – one (1) spray.
14. Spider – one (1) spray.
15. Garden Hardy – one (1) spray.

#### Requirements:

- Blooms should be named where possible.
- Disbud entries should not show any side buds.
- Spray is one lateral of a plant bearing a number of flowers on one stem.
- No less than 3 blooms to stem.
- You may enter as many flowers as you would like, but each must be a different type, variety or color.
- Must describe entry completely on form.



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**DAHLIAS  
DIVISION 2**

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**First and Second Half Show**

**Classes:**

1. Formal Decorative – any size, one (1) bloom – ray florets flat, partially revolute, or partially involute. Petals uniform and regularly arranged, tending to recurve toward the stem.
2. Informal Decorative – any size, one (1) bloom – ray florets twisted, or curled, or wavy.
3. Straight Cactus – any size, one (1) bloom – ray florets revolute for more than ½ their length; pointed, straight, or recurved, radiating in all directions from the center.
4. Semi-Cactus – any size, one (1) bloom – ray florets broad at base, straight, incurved, or recurved; with ray florets revolute for up to ½ of their length.
5. Lacinated – the split should be in proportion to the ray floret length – an overall fringed effect.
6. Water Lily – fully double and symmetrical petals.
7. Miniatures – any form – three (3) blooms.
8. Best Basket of Miniatures – any form.
9. Collarettes – open centered with a single row of uniform evenly spaced compound ray florets in a flat plain surrounding the disc flowers – three (3) blooms.
10. Mini Ball – three (3) blooms – fully double flowers, ball-shaped or slightly flattened at face.
11. Pompon – fully double flowers similar to ball but more globular and smaller in size – three (3) blooms.
12. Ball – fully double flowers, ball-shaped or slightly flattened at the face; ray florets are blunt, rounded or indented – larger than 3” – one (1) bloom.
13. Novelty – Dahlias with characteristics differing from any other form presentation – three (3) blooms.
14. Peony-Flowering – open-centered with two or more rows of ray florets surrounding the disc flowers.
15. Anemone – with one or more rows of ray florets surrounding a center of elongated tubular disc florets.

**Requirements:**

- Must have attached foliage (at least one pair of leaves).
- Must be disbudded.
- No open centers except in novelties.
- 
- Dahlia stems should be 3 different lengths.
- Dahlias will be judged on the following: Color, substance, form, size according to variety, stem & foliage, and bloom condition.
- You may enter any of the classes below and any number per class if the color and size is different. Example: Formal Decorative, 8” or over, color red and Formal Decorative, under 8”, color red.

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**GLADIOLI  
DIVISION 3**

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**First and Second Half Show**

**Classes:**

1. Large – 4 ½” to 5 ½” florets
2. Medium – 3 ½” to 4/12” florets
3. Miniatures – up to 3 ½” florets
4. Collections – three to five stems

**Requirements:**

- You may enter as many exhibits as you wish.
- Each must be a different color.
- Glads should be 1/3 bloom, 1/3 bud, 1/3 closed.

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**ROSES

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**First and Second Half Show**

**Requirements:**

- Roses are judged on the following: form, substance, color, stem, foliage and proportion.
- At the time of judging an exhibition rose should be one bloom, ¼ to ½ open.
- You may enter as many as you wish from the types above; each must be a different named variety.

### GENERAL RULES

**Please Read: The General Rules & Regulations of the Fair, in addition to the following, are to be observed.**

- All exhibits in this Department must be the work of the exhibitor. Items must be finished; new, clean and made within the last two years (except in Baked Foods and Food Preservation areas). Any entry which has been exhibited at a previous Central Washington State Fair may not be entered again. Articles stained, soiled or showing wear will not be judged. If any entry is guilty of breaking these rules, the exhibitor will not be subject to a refund of any entry fees.
- Exhibitors from ages 4-18 may enter in Crafts, Floral, Threads, and Foods with the exception of the Food Preservation division, which may only be entered by youth 8-18 years of age.
- Please complete the entry form by printing or typing, or use an address label with **complete** information.
- Exhibitors entering more than 20 exhibits must check at least 1 hour before closing time.
- At the discretion of the Area Superintendent or management, any exhibit deemed not worthy will not be exhibited.
- If item is disqualified, you will be notified.
- Any exhibit that deteriorates before the Fair closes will be removed from the display and disposed of at the discretion of the Superintendent or Management; ribbons will be held for the exhibitor.
- Liabilities: Every precaution will be taken to prevent loss and/or damage to entries; **HOWEVER**, entries are held or exhibited at the owner's risk.
- Due to health regulations all baked items entered in the Fair will not be returned.
- When it is obvious to the Judges that two or more exhibits are identical (as from the same cooking kettle), the judges **WILL** automatically disqualify ALL entries.
- Late entries may be accepted for display only. They may not be judged.
- All exhibits must remain in the Modern Living Building until the release date, unless area superintendent or management displays them elsewhere at which time exhibitor will be notified.
- No plastic or glued items except in the Craft Department. Embellishment or bling is allowed in Threads if construction is sewn.
- **The Danish System of Judging will apply to all areas EXCEPT Special Contests and Awards or otherwise indicated. Each entry is judged individually according to a standard. A Blue Ribbon means 1st Place, a Red Ribbon 2nd Place, a White Ribbon means 3rd Place. There can be more than one placing in each of these categories, if they meet the required standard. If an entry does not meet the required standard, then no ribbon is given. Prizes and Prize Money (Premiums) are paid from the records of the judges' sheets. Ribbons, tags, etc. have no value. Best of Class Award may be awarded if judge deems worthy, & only if enough entries qualify in a class.**

**Demonstrate your craft or hobby to the fair guests. Admission passes will be given to demonstrators for day of demonstration.**
