



2020 CWSF – Junior Fairest of the Fair Competition Rules & Guidelines

JOB DESCRIPTION

The CWSF Royalty are the official ambassadors of the CWSF. In addition to serving as the official ambassadors of the CWSF, the Crowned Fairests and Attendants represent and promote the CWSF at events throughout Wood County and beyond, including area parades, festivals, community events, and during the week of the Central Wisconsin State Fair. Crowned Fairests and Attendants serve for an entire year (*terms starting on coronation night and ending on the following years coronation night*) as an ambassador for the CWSF; this includes media interviews, community events, and speaking opportunities. Crowned Fairests and Attendants must be available throughout the year for appearances, meetings, interviews, ext.

ELIGIBILITY

The crowned Junior Fairest of the Fair (JR FOTF) may only serve one year as the CWSF JR FOTF, however, all runner-ups and Attendants may run as many times as they wish.

- Contestants must be a Wisconsin resident for at least one year prior to entry.
- Contestants must be enrolled in 7th-12th grade for the 2020/2021 school year.
- Contestants must have reliable transportation to events and meetings.
- Contestants must be a resident of Wood County, or must have done a majority of their Fair or school activities in Wood County.
- Contestants do not have to be in a Wood County club or organization to enter.
- Contestants should have no history of felony acts.

SELECTION GUIDELINES

The Fairest of the Fair Coronation is held in early May. Prior to the coronation there are a series of interviews, impromptu questions, a radio ad, and a self introduction, as well as an application process.

A panel of judges will be selected by the FOTF Committee and CWSF office, whom will be actively involved with this process to choose the next JR FOTF at the Coronation. Crowned JR FOTF and Attendants will be awarded scholarship money at the end of a successful reign. A panel of judges will select the winner based on the following criteria:

Personality, Poise, and Attitude
Maturity and Professionalism
Creativity

Speaking and Writing Ability
Involvement and Activities

OBLIGATIONS

As a CWSF JR FOTF contestant, you must attend all stages of the judging process which can be found in the Application Packet. Crowned JR Fairests and Attendants will be required to attend the events listed in the Application Packet. Other events may be added by the FOTF Committee at any time. We ask that you make an effort to attend these suggested events as an ambassador of the CWSF.

Crowned JR FOTF and Attendants are encouraged to represent the CWSF and Wood County at surrounding community festivals but must coordinate these events with the FOTF Committee and the Fair office in advance. Crowned JR FOTF and Attendants should assist with keeping the CWSF FOTF Facebook page up to date by posting pictures of the events, festivals, or other community involvement activities they are participating in. All posts should remain FOTF Program appropriate.

As the official host, crowned Jr. Fairests and Attendants will greet fairgoers, emcee and participate in events/contests, and perform media interviews, etc. During the Spring FOTF Coronation at the end of the term, the JR FOTF and Attendant will prepare and give a farewell speech during the banquet.

REQUIREMENTS

Contestants should be poised, mature, outgoing, articulate, sensitive to all types of people, and be able to withstand long hours of work while maintaining a positive and enthusiastic attitude. Contestants should also have excellent writing, public speaking, computer, and telephone skills. Contestants should be able to adapt to any situation, as well as be dependable and professional in the performance of your duties.

As the Crowned Jr. Fairest or Attendant you will be required to work with the FOTF Committee to schedule appearances and arrange media interviews. The Contestants should meet and maintain a good working relationship with the CWSF Executive Director and other Fair office staff during their reign.

Junior Fairest of the Fair: As the JR FOTF, you will receive the following:

- A crown and sash upon coronation
- \$100 at the end of a successful reign
- A CWSF polo shirt with the CWSF logo

Junior Fairest of the Fair Attendant: As the JR FOTF Attendant, you will receive the following:

- A crown and sash upon coronation
- \$50 at the end of a successful reign
- A CWSF polo shirt with the CWSF logo

JUDGING:

Contestant must attend all stages of the judging process.

If a contestant is named as Central Wisconsin State Fair’s Junior Fairest of the Fair, or Attendant, and for any reason cannot fulfill the duties of this position, as outlined above, for the entire term (one year), the Central Wisconsin State Fair Junior Fairest of the Fair, or Attendant, will forfeit all cash prizes and any other prizes that have been awarded with the position. All of these awards will be returned to the CWSF office within two weeks (14 days) of termination of this position. At this point, the Attendant or runner-up may become eligible to serve as the Central Wisconsin State Fair’s Junior Fairest of the Fair or Attendant.

DEADLINE

Only applications completed in their entirety by the deadline will be considered for the competition. Entry form, essays, a 4x6 printed photo, and signed obligation form must be postmarked and returned to the Fair Office no later than **3:30pm Monday, March 30th, 2020**.
