Only the present year's growth considered except soybeans and dry shell corn, which may be of previous years, but preference will be given to this year's crops.

List the name of every variety on the front of the entry tag.

A Best of Show and Honorable Mention ribbon will be awarded in Class 1, Class 2 (depending on the number of entries), and Class 3 (No Premium). An Over All Best of Show and Honorable Mention ribbon will be awarded in the fruit category Class 6 through Class 10 (No Premium).

All threshed grain must be thoroughly cleaned and graded. Must be in an ice cream pail, **three quarters full with cover on pail**. Will exhibit in an ice cream pail.

2. **Best Vegetable Display** - Display shall include seven different kinds of vegetable crops attractively arranged. Entries with greater or lesser number will be disqualified. Entry must contain only specimens commonly known as vegetables and may not include flowers of herbs or other items. **Exhibitor must supply the basket or container.** This shall not exceed 24" in length and 18" in width or if it is round must not exceed 20" in diameter. Crops shown must have been grown by the exhibitor. The exhibitor may exhibit up to five varieties of tomatoes, but they will count only as one kind of vegetable. The container must hold all the vegetables for the entry; specimens may not overflow to the display table or other places.

4. **Picture Vegetable Garden (not flower pictures) - Display should include the following:**

- a. Three color photos of your garden at least 8"X10"
- b. Exhibitor number and garden address must be included on the back of poster
- c. Must be exhibitors garden
- d. Can be seasonal, close ups or creative mix of photos
- e. Photos need to be secured to poster board not to exceed 2 ft X 3 ft
- f. Photos will be on display for the whole run of the fair

Entries will be judged 40% on gardening practices, 30% overall presentation and 30% photo quality and technical aspects.

CLASS 5 – LARGEST VEGETABLE & SUNFLOWER

The winner in each category (except lot 1) will receive a \$10 premium, ribbon and bragging rights. All entries must be clean and meet the standards for exhibiting vegetables.

All articles must be entered in the name of the grower. Competition in this department limited to residents of Wood, Clark, and Marathon counties. Professional nurserymen are not eligible to exhibit in this class. Any exhibitor may be required by the superintendent to certify that the articles were grown by him/her, and, upon failure to do so, for certifying falsely shall be barred from competition.
