AMATEUR ONLY – An amateur makes less than 30% of their income from Flowers and Potted Plants.

A Best of Show and an Honorable Mention ribbon will be awarded in each of the two flower classes and in Potted Plants (No Premium).

CLASS 1 – FLOWERS

- Exhibitors are to provide appropriate sized containers for their exhibits.
- All flowers and plants must be grown by exhibitor.
- No artificial flowers or extra greens are permitted in exhibits that are not from the plant being judged. (ex. No asparagus fern added to marigolds. That would be considered an arrangement or bouquet.)
- A blossom showing color is considered a blossom.
- Gladiolas – trim tips to maintain straight spike.
- Roses will be judged according to the standards stated in publication “American Rose Society Guidelines & Rules for Judging Roses.” An original copy of the guidelines is available in the Fair Office for exhibitors to review.
