Stall Rent:

- Tie Stall \$8.00 (includes manure removal fee) Lot 1 through Lot 8 (Heifer)
- Tie Stall \$10.00 (includes manure removal fee) Lot 9 through Lot 20 (Cow)

Cattle washing must be done in designated wash racks.

- Due to the high cost of disposal, bedding packs cannot exceed ten inches.
- **Do not place any garbage in manure.**
- Exhibitors are strongly encouraged to use shavings in lieu of straw. Shavings will be sold during the fair.
- If your bedding pack exceeds ten inches, you will be docked points in herdsmanship.

All animals shown as purebred must exhibit registry papers.

All breeds will follow the show standards set up by that breed. All cattle must be entered and exhibited in owner's name.

All rules conform to uniform regulations adopted by the Wisconsin Association of Fairs.

The rules of the Wisconsin State Fair shall govern as to the ages in this department.

Standards for show ethics are adopted from the PDCA Show Ring Code of Ethics. Those found to have broken these rules will forfeit all show premiums and will be held to further disciplinary action by the Show Management and the Fair Board.
