



IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER

The City of Navasota has violated the monitoring and reporting requirements set by Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) in Chapter 30, Section 290, Subchapter F. Even though these were not emergencies, as our customers, you have the right to know what happened and what we are doing to correct these situations.

We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not our drinking water meets health standards. During the **Lead and Copper Routine Tap Sampling**, we did not complete all monitoring or testing for lead and copper and therefore cannot be sure of the quality of your drinking water at this time.

The table below lists the contaminants we did not properly test for during the last year, how often we are supposed to sample for lead and copper, how many samples we are supposed to take, how many we took, when samples should have been taken, and the date on which the follow-up samples will be taken.

Contaminant	Required Sampling Frequency	Number of samples taken	When samples should have been taken	When samples were or will be taken
Lead and Copper	20 samples every 3 years	19 samples	June 1-Sept 30, 2016	June 1-Sept 30, 2016

What is being done?

Due to a clerical error one of the sample site addresses was incorrect from the TCEQ approved list which made the city noncompliant with the number of samples required. As a result of the error we will perform tap sampling again next year instead of the required 3 year frequency to provide the correct number of samples (20) needed.

Please share this information with all other people who drink this water, especially those who may have not received this notice directly (i.e., people in apartments, nursing homes, schools and businesses). You can do this by posting this notice in a public place or distributing copies by hand or mail.
