#### **ELIGIBILITY:**

Open to any adult 19 years or older. All youth are entered in a separate Youth Division.

#### **ENTRY LOCATION:**

Clay County Fair Grounds – Rear of Reinhold Exhibit Building

#### **ENTRY TIME:**

Sunday, March 29, 2020 2:00 PM to 7:00 PM

Monday, March 30, 2020 9:00 AM to 2:00 PM

**NOTE: All exhibits, including all baked goods, must be entered at this time.**

#### **REMOVAL TIME:**

Sunday, April 12, 2020 2:00 PM - 5:00 PM

Monday, April 13, 2020 10:00 AM - 12:00 PM

#### **ENTRIES:**

Each exhibitor will be limited to six (6) items in any class, however, only two (2) in any one lot. Each article must be a different technique or a different product.

#### **DIVISIONS:**

There are Three (3) Divisions, and each is judged separately.

A. 19 Years and older as of September 1, 2019

B. **Exceptionally Challenged** -19 Years and older as of September 1, 2019

C: **Professional**

A professional wishing to exhibit articles will be judged in a separate category from nonprofessionals. A professional is anyone who is or has been actively engaged in earning money by said skill; or, is or has been employed to teach such skill.

## **AWARDS:**

The Modified Danish System of Judging will be used. Ribbons and Cash premiums will be awarded in all Divisions.

## **JUDGING:**

Judging will take place Wednesday, April 1, 2020 at 9:00 AM. When possible, ribbons will be placed before the opening of the Fair.

## **GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS:**

1. All entries in the Open Creative Arts Show must have been made within the last twelve (12) months and must be the work of the exhibitor.
2. No article will be accepted for judging that has previously been exhibited at the Clay County Agricultural Fair.
3. All entries must be clean and in good condition.
4. Each article entered must be listed on the Exhibitor Entry Form. The exhibitor copy of this form must be presented when the article(s) are checked out by the exhibitor or their representative. All articles must first be checked out by the Division person in charge.
5. All articles entered are for competition and are not to be for sale at the Fair by the exhibitor.
6. In case of only one (1) entry, judges will award a suitable prize.
7. Premiums will be paid for the awards as marked in the judges' book and not from ribbons that may be attached to exhibits.
8. The Fair Management will take every reasonable precaution for the safeguarding of all articles entered in the Creative Arts Show. The owner/exhibitor; however, must assume all responsibility for any accident, loss or damage of articles entered.
9. If additional information is needed regarding any of the Exhibits, please contact the individual Superintendent.
10. Professionals will be judged separately. A professional is someone who instructs or sells their items to the general public.

**ADULT QUILTS AND QUILTING EXHIBIT**

*Any name or date on the quilt must be removed or totally covered. In order to be hung, quilts must have a hanging sleeve.*

**TO MAKE A SLEEVE:**

1. Cut a strip of sleeve fabric that is 8 inches wide and two inches shorter than the width of the finished quilt.
2. Hem the short ends with a narrow hem.
3. Stitch a 1/4 inch seam along the length to make a tube; press the seam to one side.
4. Place the sleeve against the quilt back with the seam side toward the back of the quilt.
5. Hand stitch the sleeve in place along the top and bottom folded edges. Be careful not to sew through to the front of the quilt.

Quilts will be judged either as an individual entry or a collaborative entry (worked on by 2 or more people)

## **ADULT PRESERVED FOOD EXHIBIT**

All canned foods should be of good quality in clean standard canning jars.

**U.S.D.A. Guidelines must be followed as to proper canning methods.** Call the County Extension Office for a copy of the USDA Guidelines. (284-6355) (No Mayonnaise Type Jars or Rusty Lids/Rings Allowed.) A label stating name of product, name of owner and date of canning should be placed on the bottom of the jar. Remove Rings. The recipe including procedure must be included to be judged.

### **SCORE CARD FOR JUDGING CANNING EXHIBITS**

1. Container –appropriate, clean, USDA approved  
(Standard size jars, jars should be clean - no rings)
2. Pack, Fullness, Proportion of product to liquid, Uniformity
3. Product - Clearness-liquid clear and free of small pieces  
Color – good, natural, free of blemishes and bruises  
Texture & Quality

**To be judged Recipes are required for all entries in this class. Blue ribbon recipes may be published by the Fair Board.**
