East Cooper Community Outreach	health and wellness programs for needy people in the East Cooper area
East Cooper Meals on Wheels	home-delivered weekday meals for 300 homebound individuals in the East Cooper area
Food Ministry of Goose Creek United Methodist Church	upgraded kitchen appliances and accessories to increase the capacity for fresh foods

My Sister's House	laminatE flooring for the emergency shelter to reduce allergens experienced at the shelter
One80 Place	the operation of the Rescue Food Program, including refrigerated truck driver's salary, fuel costs and vehicle maintenance and insurance
Operation Home	building supplies for two ADA-compliant accessibility ramps for low-income families in the Lowcountry
Operation Sight	restoring sight for low-income, uninsured adults with operable cataracts
Pattison's Academy	moving costs and facility upgrades for new location
People Against Rape	the purchase of building supplies needed to convert an old file room into a therapy room
Reading Partners South Carolina	the 2018 summer reading initiative, which provides reading backpacks filled with books, activity pages and a reading journal
Ronald McDonald House Charities of Charleston	the purchase of developmental toys and program materials for the Baby Steps Program, which helps teach parents how to care for their special needs infants
