## DAIRY RULES

- a) All animals exhibited must have been owned OR leased through the Erie County 4-H Dairy Lease program, registered or certified as an identified grade, in the name of and cared for by the exhibitor since June 1, 2019. Dairy animals must have an ear tag or tattoo number. This number is to be used as identification on the health papers and dairy entry form required to enter all animals.
- b) No bulls or bull calves will be shown in Jr. Department.
- c) All animals entered in classes **3 to 16** must be **dehorned** in order to be exhibited at the Fair. This rule has been established for reasons including, but not limited to, concern for the safety of the exhibitors and the general public.
- d) All animals must meet the health requirements as set by the New York State Department of Agriculture and Markets, including, but not limited to, being free of ring worm and warts.
- e) All animals must have been tested and had a negative result for BVD (Bovine Viral Diarrhea).
- f) The exhibitor is required to bring registration papers to the Fair for the animals he/she exhibits. The exhibitor **must** keep the registration papers in his/her possession until after the show day. Registration papers will be checked at the conclusion of the exhibitor meeting.
- g) Absolutely NO milk is to be dumped into the Fairgrounds storm sewer system. All bad milk (milk treated with antibiotics or milk not worthy of being processed for consumption) must be dumped in into the milking parlor gutter. This is the ONLY place bad milk can be dumped. All animal waste must be taken to the manure boxes and not left on the pavement to mix with run-off or storm water.
- h) **ABSOLUTELY NO VACCINATIONS ARE TO BE GIVEN IN THE MILKING PARLOR!!!**
- i) Project Champion Regulations: Please see your handbook for complete rules and regulations for the Project Champion Program. Project animal must be designated at the Exhibitor meeting on August 6<sup>th</sup> at 5:00 PM
- j) Participants must be 8-18 years old as of January 1, 2019.
- k) All participants must have given a public presentation prior to May 2019.

## GRADE CATTLE EXHIBITION REQUIREMENTS

- a) Participants must complete a Grade Dairy Animal Certificate and submit it to the 4-H office along with a photo by June 1, 2019.
- b) Grade cattle will be shown along with registered cattle.

2. **Intermediate Heifer Calf** – born between 12/1/18 and 2/28/2019
3. **Sr. Heifer Calf** – born between 9/1/18 and 11/30/18
4. **Summer Yearling** – born between 6/1/18 and 8/31/18
5. **Jr. Yearling** – (not in milk) born between 3/1/18 and 5/31/18
6. **Intermediate Sr. Yearling** – (not in milk) born between 12/1/17 and 2/28/18
7. **Sr. Yearling** – (not in milk) born between 9/1/17 and 11/30/17

12. **Junior 2 Year Old** – born between 3/1/17 and 8/31/17 (Sr. yearlings in milk will show with Jr. 2 yr. olds)
13. **Senior 2 Year Old** – born between 9/1/16 and 2/28/17
14. **3 & 4 Year Old Cows** – born between 9/1/14 and 8/31/15
15. **5 Year old & Over** – born on or before 8/31/14
16. **Dry Cows** – 3 yrs. & over. Cows in this class may not show in the milking classes

23. **Production-** DHI Production Paper showing pounds per day of live from 2 years. Papers are due at the time of check-in.
24. **Produce of Dam:** 2 animals any age, progeny of one dam
25. **Dam & Daughter**
  - Supreme Champion- Banner & Trophy*

\*Two dollars (\$2.00) will be added to each award made on individual animals bred by the exhibitor, if so declared at time of entry. Ribbons will be awarded to best animal bred and owned by exhibitor in each class. **If your animal qualifies as a BBE you will sign up for the class at check-in.**

\*Best Jr. Animal Bred and Owned by Exhibitor. Class to consist of all animals, of any breed, two years of age and under, bred and owned by the exhibitor. Animals shown in this class should be lead by a 4-H member.

\*Best Senior Animal Bred and Owned by Exhibitor. Class to consist of all animals, of any breed, two years of age and older, bred and owned by the exhibitor. Animals shown in this class should be lead by a 4-H member.

**Genex Artificial Breeding Special.**

**Genex Cooperative, Inc.** will pay the following additional prizes on registered female animals artificially sired by their bulls to exhibitors in their service area receiving awards in classes 1 through 16. Limited to one prize per exhibitor. **If the animal you are showing has a Genex sire** - sire's name must be indicated at the time of entering.

**29. Queens of the Milky Weigh-** Exhibitors with cows in milk at the fair are eligible for this contest. Milk weights will be recorded at the Erie County Fair milking parlor from Wednesday (8/7) AM milking until Sunday (8/11) AM milking. The cows will be placed according to their production during this time, top 3 producers will receive special prizes. Exhibitors may enter two (2) owned/leased animals per breed, however, only one award per member will be given.

**34. Novice Showmanship:** Open to 1<sup>st</sup> year exhibitors, with no prior experience in fitting or showing Dairy Cattle up to 13 years of age as of 1/1/2019.

**Champion Dairy Cattle Showman:** Previous winners of Champion Showman must compete in the age class in which they would normally compete. Entries for this class are limited to the 1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup> place showmen in classes 31 – 34 and the 1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup> place showmen in the alumni class.

## OTHER DAIRY COMPETITIONS

**Class #9 – Dairy Cattle Educational Poster –** Participants shall construct an educational poster to educate the general public about an aspect of the dairy industry. Exhibitors may use any suitable materials or photographs on their posters with accurate information. Posters will be evaluated on content, illustration, organization, clarity, visual appeal and readability.

### Janiga – Koch Memorial Award
