GOAT RULES

- a) All goat health records must accompany animals to the Fair.
- b) Goats must have an ear tag or tattoo number that is to be used as positive identification on the official goat entry form and health papers.
- c) The Interdepartmental Rabies Committee (NYS Health Department, Department of Environmental Conservation and Department of Agriculture and Markets) recommends appropriate off-label rabies vaccine by a licensed veterinarian. This is subject to change upon approval of a vaccine for goats.
- d) Goats may be purebred or recorded grade.
- e) Any animal showing an open sore may not be exhibited. Any animal that produces an open sore while at the fair will be sent home immediately.
- f) Herd signs will be permitted.
- g) All exhibitors are required to participate in Showmanship, complete records and must have given a public presentation prior to May 2019.
- h) **ALL exhibitors are responsible for maintaining their exhibit until released by the 4-H program on Sunday, August 18, 2019. Failure to do so will result in not being able to participate at The Erie County Fair in the future and forfeit of premium checks.**

MARKET MEAT GOAT REGULATIONS

- a) Market Meat Goats must be born since October 1, 2018.
- b) Market Meat Goats must weigh a minimum of 60 lbs at time of Fair weigh-in, or they will not be eligible for the show or sale. All goats will be weighed one time only and no substitutions will be allowed.
- c) All animals must be owned and cared for by the exhibitor since May 1, 2019 and must have been identified on the meat goat identification card submitted to the 4-H office by May 1, 2019.
- d) All meat goats must be either a wether or a doe. Acceptable breeds are Nubian, Kiko, Boer, Spanish, Savannah, Myotonic or crosses of these and may be purebred or grade.
- e) There must be a minimum of 5 market meat goats to hold an official auction.
- f) All exhibitors must be 9 as of January 1, 2019.
- g) The Interdepartmental Rabies Committee (NYS Health Department, Department of Environmental Conservation and Department of Agriculture and Markets) recommends appropriate off-label rabies vaccine by a licensed veterinarian. This is subject to change upon approval of a vaccine for goats. If a rabies vaccination was administered to a Market Meat Goat it should be done no later than July 22, 2019 in order to adhere to the 21 days withholding.
- h) Market Meat Goats weighing 59lbs or less at the time of weighing will be eligible to show in a non-sale light weight class and member will be eligible for showmanship but animal will not be sold at the auction, also:
 - a. Exhibitors must meet all program requirements.
 - b. Goat is not eligible for champion class.
 - c. No “for sale” signs may be posted.
 - d. Goat must be removed from the fair on Sunday August 18th at 6:00pm.
 - e. Goat is not eligible to be transported on a 4-H hired trailer.

BREEDING MEAT GOAT REGULATIONS

- a) All animals must be owned and cared for by exhibitor since May 1, 2019.
- b) All animals, registered or non-registered, must have proper identification. Non-registered animals are required to have a scrapie tag.
- c) Animals shown in the market meat goat class are NOT eligible to show in the breeding classes.
- d) The base date for ages is the date of the show.
- e) Exhibitors of breeding animals must be 8 as of January 1, 2019.
- f) Limit of 2 animals per class.

- b. Exhibitors must be 8 years old as of January 1, 2019.

MASTER SHOWMAN

Entries limited to previous Erie County Fair Master Goat Showman and 2019 Champion Meat Goat Showman.
