Item #1 <u>Call to Order:</u>

The meeting was called to order at 3:30 p.m. by President Serpa. Those in attendance were: President Larry Serpa, Vice President Jerry Pacheco, Directors Linda Mae Balakian Hunsucker via Zoom, Leta Ciavaglia, Gabriel Hernandez, Chuck Riojas and Larry Salinas. CEO John C. Alkire, Deputy Manager II Stacy Rianda, Deputy Manager II Lauri King, Business Assistant II Christina Estrada, Business Assistant II Saundra West, Exhibit Representative II Taylor Childers and via Zoom: Cohen Communications Danielle Griffin, Michael Brown and Terri Eaton with Arabian Racing Association of California, Jo Ann Rodriguez and Candice Anderson. Director Leta Ciavaglia was an excused absence.

Item #2 <u>Pledge of Allegiance:</u>

President Serpa requested Director Riojas to open the meeting by leading the Pledge of Allegiance.

President Serpa called roll and all Directors were present for a full quorum.

a. Personnel Matters

It was announced after coming out of closed session that the Board has received CEO John Alkire's official retirement notice. He is becoming the new CEO of the Friends of the Fair. A new org chart was presented showing the future management duties being split between Deputy Manager's II Rianda and King.

Item #8 <u>Executive Staff Report:</u> (Informational)

a. Report on Satellite Wagering/Live Horse Racing:

Deputy Manager II King reported that satellite wagering is fully open and the health department has allowed us to expand. The Kentucky Derby will be Saturday, September 5th and we are going to be able to have about 100 people on site for the race, socially distanced with 1 person per table and we will have two food trucks. We are still in discussions regarding our options for live horse racing. We are following the lead of CARF and are waiting for more information from them as to what their best recommendations are for moving forward. Our license was on the agenda for the CHRB meeting to run the dates in Pleasanton but that item was pulled from the agenda and will be heard in September. CARF is working with CHRB to figure out what the best plan is for the racing industry and for our fair.

Michael Brown with the Arabian Racing Association of California is concerned about a program they instituted last year which concluded at our fair and was very successful. Maidens come in at the beginning of the year, they run throughout the year and the top rated horses have a race at the end of the year. They are doing it again this

year, the plan was to conclude in Fresno with a high stakes race and because we are not having live racing at Fresno and taking it to Golden Gate Fields is that they are out of race dates for the year unless it's fair racing dates. They are concerned and want to be sure that in our negotiations with CARF and CHRB that those races dates are signified as our fair dates. When this is discussed with CHRB and CARF we need to remind them that it has to be fair races in order to get the money and GGF couldn't do it otherwise. Director of Racing Larry Schwartzlander told them that CARF gave up the dates to GGF, no breeds. Those are their dates, indicating it would be non-fair dates. California law requires that there must be immerging breeds, which includes Arabian horses. Larry has indicated that it is not going to be allowed, which would be against the law. They are concerned that there have been many discussions or negotiations over this matter because anything that is done in this regard must be done in public. They just want to be sure the dates are fair dates so the Arabians can participate.

b. Report on CARF/CHRB Meetings:

This report was covered under agenda item 8a.

c. Report on Interim Events and Postponements:

Exhibit Representative II Taylor Childers reported that events have been postponed through the end of September. Currently working on bringing in a maternity consignment sale for the end of October and a plan has been submitted to the health department. Also looking at a used car sale for the end of October and drive in concerts that would take place over 2 weekends in October. These would be live Hispanic acts and modeled after a drive-in movie theater. They are still working on their plan to be submitted to the health department. Our home show promoter is also working closely with the health department to get something up and going for their November show.

d. Report on the Swap Meet:

Deputy Manager II Rianda reported that our contract has now ended with our previous swap meet operator. We met with Tai Nguyen the gentleman who is now running the swap meet. He is working hard to bring it back up; their numbers have jumped from 82 vendors two Sundays ago to 120 this past Sunday. People are excited about the new management. Reported that we have two employees who have been going over and working with him. We did do a contract to be voted on later in the agenda for \$5,000 per month for 6 months.

We are also working on an RFP that will go out to for something more permanent.

e. Report on Junior Livestock Shows:

Deputy Manager II King reported that the health department has agreed that the Junior Livestock Grading events are essential and our 4-H and FFA youth will get to have in-person shows the first week of October. We will still have a virtual auction and have divided it out per specie, one specie per day so that we can allow the least amount of people in as possible. The kids will bring their animals in early in the morning, they will weigh, prepare, grade and they will leave. The virtual auction will work just like any other auction. You will have to sign on and have a registered account, put in your bid up to a certain amount and the computer will bid for you; you can also do top offs.

Since we are using ShoWorks, which is our entry program, there is no added expense to us. If kids decide they are going to grade and then pull their animal from the sale, typically we don't allow them to stay in to get top offs, but this year we are going to allow that so that they can utilize the on-line features. It has an amazing tie back to social media where the kids can actually take their link and share it on all their platforms. We will create a landing page on our website where it will be all about the virtual auction. Each student will be required to upload their own photo. We will approve their photos to be sure it is family friendly. We will require them when they are here for their grading day, they take a picture in front of our branded back drop with our fair, 4-H and FFA logos and that's the picture they will use.

Deputy Manager II Rianda reported that the Health Department has approved us to move forward with our Drive-Thru Food Event. They realized the power of the fair to reach people and the importance of this fair to the community; they need us as a partner. We talked about doing Covid-19 testing on site during the event. They would like us to reach out to the Blood Center and maybe do a mobile blood drive. They would also like to see more of the healthcare community involved with booths and handing out information; we will help educate our community and they have some dollars that may support that, as well.

MSP (Salinas - Pacheco) to approve Scenario #2, Drive-thru & Virtual Experiences.

CEO Alkire stated that he felt a couple of the nominees did not meet the criteria for Hall of Fame and should be put into Community Champions. Director Hunsucker suggested that perhaps staff pull out those that do not fit the criteria before they come to the board.

MSP (Hunsucker-Salinas) to induct Jim and Debbie Christian, John Hoyt and Donald "Donny" Rollin into the Hall of Fame for 2020.

d. Discussion and action by the Board regarding setting aside \$500,000 from our savings for Compensated Absences Liability.

Director Pacheco had asked that this be put on the agenda but has now rescinded his request due to the retirement of CEO Alkire.

Item #12 Manager's (CEO) Update:

CEO Alkire reported on various items management has been working on since the last Board Meeting:

- CEO Alkire reported he had a great visit with Bill Lyle's son. There was one conference call with some state officials and consultants with regard to the opportunities to move from a state facility to a county relationship. This will be a long time coming if it even comes to fruition.
- CEO Alkire reported that the Italian Exhibit is progressing. Deputy Manager II King reported that Taylor had an idea of pairing Hobbs Grove with us for the Drive-Thru Eats event. Taylor met with them and toured the barn area. They thought it would be great but were nervous about the potential financial loss for them, so they passed on it for this year.
- CEO Alkire reported that Mike Kludjian and Debbie Jacobsen have made countless amounts of donations. We received a 1930 International Harvester tractor from Elmer "Corky" Maddox.
- CEO Alkire reported that Teen Challenge might possibly make the Arise event virtual this year. They have sent us a letter to see if we had any interest, so we are in negotiations with them. Deputy Manager II King reported that she and Taylor met with the Hmong New Year Committee and realistically for 2020 there is no way their event is going to happen. So, we asked them to make that decision early on so we could explore other options. We have booked a holiday themed drive-thru light show with Lightasmic. It will run the day after Thanksgiving through the day after New Year's Day.
- CEO Alkire gave a list of signs and artifacts that will be ready to go for 2021(half will be ready by this year's fair) including Foster's,

Fresno Bee, Drug Store, Pontiac, Castillo's, Boxing Posters, Accordion, Water Tank, Guitar and Cable Car.

- Deputy Manager II King reported that typically we have had a night watchman here from 3:30 p.m. 7 a.m. and it costs the fair about \$11,000 to \$12,000 per month. We have realigned two of our maintenance jobs to start later in the day, from 2 p.m. 11 p.m. and then the security guard works from 11 p.m. 7 p.m. saving us about \$6,000 per month. CEO Alkire reported that he did a museum tour for 4 people the other day. They donated some signs and wanted to see how their exhibit was put together.
- Friends of the Fair Director Debbie Jacobsen announced that the FOF fundraiser is being held on-line this year from September 11 October 2nd. The Friends of the Fair Board came up with 25 items including 3 different vacation homes, Dr. Macias donated a total of \$10,000 in services, Brian Tatarian is doing his limo with a \$500 dinner at Five, Brad Stevens donated a foursome for the Cigarfest golf tournament as well as AT&T Pro-Am tickets including shuttles, luggage, our VIP food card and much more!

Deputy Manager II King reported that Friends of the Fair will also be sending letters out saying even though we can't have concerts this year, we're still asking people to consider paying for their deck table or to consider donating to the 501(c)(3). Thinking out of the box ideas to continue to raise funds. When you get the fundraiser link, please send it out to family and friends. Chris Pacheco is going to put it on his radio stations. Deputy Manager II King reported that Taylor has a proposal into the health department for live concerts two weekends in October. One will overlap with our Drive-Thru Eats event. You stay in your vehicle, it is actually live music being performed; they are some pretty big Hispanic entertainers. Our portion will be a rental fee on the lot and a percentage of the cars. It will be held in the Butler parking lot. CEO Alkire announced that his Blue Ribbon Nominations for 2020 should go to Mona Cummings of Tree Fresno.

- CEO Alkire reported that the King Brothers from Speeda Sound are going out of business. There was a copy of the city follow up letter in your packet to Chairman Arias and Chavez. Another follow up letter will go out that needs to go before a COVID committee. In an effort to save a few hours and work off some of the leave balances we will close the office on Fridays. Without events, we aren't busy and we would prefer to save money. The Board agreed.
- CEO Alkire thanked the board for all their support and help over the years. He will be right down the hall representing Friends of the Fair.

Please refer to the org chart that was distributed if you have questions. The state truck will be turned back in and FOF will be picking up the phone bills, I will still have the same phone number. Reported he will be on KMJ on Friday to announce his retirement and talk about our plans moving forward.
