Item #1 Call to Order:

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The meeting was called to order at 3:30 p.m. by President Pacheco. Those in attendance were: President Jerry Pacheco, Directors Frank Flores, Annalisa Perea and Larry Serpa; Deputy Manager II Stacy Rianda, Deputy Manager II Lauri King, Business Assistant II Christina Estrada, Business Assistant II Saundra West, Event Coordinator Taylor Childers and via Zoom: Vice-President Chuck Riojas, Directors Linda Mae Balakian Hunsucker, Gary Chahil and Larry Salinas; Mike Francesconi with CDFA and Nikki (public member). Director Terri Gonsalves was an excused absence.

Item #2 Pledge of Allegiance:

President Pacheco requested Director Serpa to open the meeting by leading the Pledge of Allegiance.

Item #3 Roll Call of Directors and Declaration of Quorum:

President Pacheco called roll, Director Gonsalves was an excused absence and a full quorum was acknowledged.

- Item #4. <u>Minutes:</u> (Action by the Board)
 - A. Approve Board Minutes:

MSP (Riojas - Chahil) to approve the Board minutes. The vote was unanimous.

MSP (Serpa - Perea) to approve the Consent Agenda. The vote was unanimous.

Item #6 Public Comment:

None

- Item #7. <u>Executive Staff Report: (Informational)</u>
 - a. Report on Satellite Racing/CARF Meeting:

Deputy Manager II King reported that satellite wagering continues to be operating out of the grandstand on the first floor. We are hoping to move back inside as soon as the Health Department says we can. We are continuing to have our monthly CARF meetings and looking at what the racing calendar and schedule will look like. We have let everyone know that we are planning to race and want that news to get out to all of our horsemen.

b. Report on Interim Events and Postponements:

Event Coordinator Taylor Childers reported that the Drive-Thru Dinosaur event will be happening in March for 10 days. The Home Show is moving forward with plans for the end of May. Reported that she continues to work on the Drive Thru-Eats for April; submitted our plan to the Health Department for approval and will begin getting contracts out to vendors. Still working on trying to get a drive-in movie or concert. The problem we are running into is that the Health Department won't let people sit outside their cars, like they are doing in many other counties, this is turning off promoters.

c. <u>Report on Hispanic Plaza:</u>

Deputy Manager II Rianda reported that at the last board meeting it was announced that we are moving the Hispanic Plaza that was supposed to be on the backside of the Paul Paul Theater to the Museum Park. Director Salinas had asked what the difference in square footage was. Deputy Manager II Rianda stated the original plaza was scheduled to be 5,401 sq. ft. and the new location is 3,027 sq. ft. The finances were emailed to all directors' right after the last board meeting. We do have renderings of both, the old plaza and the new plaza. Dora Westerland was to be contacted by Sal Quintero and Ed Kashian; John Alkire has also had a conversation with her in the last 2 weeks.

d. <u>Report on Covid-19 Events:</u>

Deputy Manager II King reported that we continue to be a testing site for United Health Centers on Wednesdays and Saturdays in the Chance parking lot. Their contract goes through the end of February and they have not indicated to us that they want to continue in March. We also continue to have COVID-19 vaccinations in the Kings Canyon Parking Lot, the Industry Commerce Building, the Ag Building and the Commerce Building, we don't see an end in sight for that. We are working with our Home Show promoter to hopefully condense down to 1 building for her event in May but it will just depend on where we are at with vaccinations at that time. We are still waiting for payment from the county for the use of the facilities.

- Item #8. <u>Committee Reports:</u> (Action by the Board)
 - A. Finance Committee:
 - <u>Acknowledge December 31, 2020 Check Register in the amount of</u> \$171,944.25.

MSP (Serpa - Flores) to approve the Check Register. The vote was unanimous.

Acknowledge Statement of Operations dated December 31, 2020;

MSP (Flores - Perea) to approve the Statement of Operations. The vote was unanimous.

<u>Acknowledge Balance Sheet dated December 31, 2020</u>.

MSP (Riojas - Serpa) to approve the Balance Sheet.

President Pacheco reported that he and Director Gonsalves came in and met with staff to go through our financials line by line and gained a better understanding of what it all means. They were pleased with the two hours and staff was able to answer all their questions.

Item #9. Old Business: (Informational)

a. Discussion by the Board regarding Interim CEO

Director Pacheco stated that he has a real problem with the rotating CEO positions and feels that we can run our fair with our two Deputies doing what they have been doing and we don't need a CEO. Director Hunsucker agreed. Mike Francesconi with CDFA stated that it wasn't part of the agreement when we went into the layoff process, that we would have 2 Deputy IIs. Part of the issue is that if you convert one to a CEO, there are not enough employees to keep the other Deputy II. We can keep them both as Deputy IIs as long as they rotate. Someone can't stay in the CEO position for more than 3 months without going through the hiring process. That is a requirement of CalHR.

Director Serpa suggested that since everything is rolling along so smoothly right now, we need to let this play out and if our circumstances change in 6 months, then we can revisit.

Director Perea asked if we had an internal time line for which to have a CEO in place. Deputy Manager II Rianda stated no, what was agreed to last month was to have us do the rotating interim CEO for up to 1 year. Within that year things could change. Mike Francesconi stated that we do have some fairs that hired a retired annuitant as fair managers, but even that is frowned upon. We do have a fair that operates without a CEO and the Board members rotate each year, but that's a very small fair and probably not feasible for the 21st DAA. If things don't improve in a year from now, we're going to have bigger issues than just worrying about the CEO. President Pacheco stated we are good, we have already voted on it and we can address it again in 6 months.

- Item #10. <u>New Business:</u> (Informational/Action by the Board)
 - a. <u>Award Ground Lease for Retail Outdoor Swap Meet Operation Contract</u> <u>RFP #21-001 for a five-year contract with a five-year renewal option.</u>

MSP (Perea - Flores) to approve contract award for a Retail Outdoor Swap Meet Operation to Sunnyside Ventures, Inc. for a five-year (5) contract with a five-year (5) renewal option.

Item #12. Manager's Update:

Deputy Managers Rianda and King reported on various items management has been working on since the last Board Meeting.

• Deputy Manager II Rianda reported that she and Lauri have been on lots of Zoom meetings lately. They were invited to join the Area Executives, which meets monthly.

CFA has been discussing funding structures, which has required numerous meetings. The Governor has 50 million in his budget devoted to fairs, so through CFA we have been working to figure out what the structure of that funding will look like. Deputy Managers Rianda and King are also chairing committees for CFA – Communications and Business Development, which there have been committee meetings. Our area fairs are now zooming monthly. Deputy Manager II Rianda also sits on the IAFE Commercial Exhibits and Concessions Committee and they had a zoom meeting, as well.

Deputy Manager II King attended the ShoWorks Virtual/Live Auction seminar. We are hoping for a live auction but last year's virtual auction went so well that we are looking to add a virtual component to our live auction. Also reported that she has had deeper conversations with WFA and CFA about the funding structure and working to be sure that the money is distributed equally to all fairs.

- Deputy Manager II King reported that our 1499 money came in and it was \$199,240. FEMA has approved our request for public assistance with the Creek Fire. We are applying for reimbursement for the use of our buildings, equipment and staff overtime. This is the first hurdle and we will continue to work on this. Deputy Manager II King took part in a 2 day zoom planning retreat for WFA, as she sits on their board.
- Deputy Manager II King reported that on February 10th Governor Newsome visited our fairgrounds. He toured the vaccination facilities and did a press conference. He then needed a quiet place to do an interview, so we let him into the Fresno County Historical Museum. While he was there, Lauri asked him a question about the role California Fairs have been playing in COVID relief/assistance and evacuations and what is his plan to help the fairs? He finally said he and his team are looking at the transition model. To them, the best thing they can do for fairs is transition them away from the State structure and move them into the JPA structure.
- Deputy Manager II Rianda reported that Valley Wide's contract was supposed to start in 2020, they made their payment in 2020 but got no fair, did not sell one drop of beer all year and didn't get anything they were supposed to get contractually. So, we added a year to the back end of their contract to make up for it. Now their contract has been amended to run from 2021 – 2030.
- Deputy Manager II King reported that last month we told you there is the Shuttered Venue Operators Grant available and we thought we could apply for both the SVOG and PPP and see which one is greater and take one of the two. Since then, SBA has said that you cannot

apply for both. We feel that the SVOG will be more money than the second round of PPP, so we have pulled our PPP application and will proceed with our SVOG application. If for some reason we don't get the grant, we can still submit our PPP application. The SVOG could be up to 9 million dollars for us as it is all based on the revenue lost last year. The PPP money was estimated at about \$600,000. The Friends of the Fair has a program that matches grants with needs and Deputy Manager II King has been using that program to see what else is out there that we might qualify for; there are a couple of others that we will look at applying.

- Deputy Manager II King and Event Coordinator Childers have had meetings with the Health Department. Deputy Manager II stated that we are pushing them to make sure they understand that we can put on some events safely and to make decisions a little quicker. Taylor has been in touch with them daily. We have also reached out to them to set up a meeting to talk about what it's going to take in our County and in our State to be able to have something more for our fair than what we had last year. We feel that in October, we should be at a point where we could potentially have an in person fair, but what's going to have to happen for an in person fair, is still unknown.
- Deputy Manager II King attended a couple of virtual meetings with the California Tourism Board on the outlook for tourism. Both Universal Studios and Disneyland were participating and plan to be operating by this summer. All of the 26-Six Flags Amusement parks are also planning to reopen by summer. Reported that we have started planning our 2021 livestock show; we are planning for a normal show, like we had in 2019 and are also planning for what it would look like if we have to do another show and go. Terri Collins, former Livestock Superintendent is coming in one day a week to work on the show. Our livestock book will be available in the next 30 days; we have to start this process early because of the ownership deadlines. Deputy Managers Rianda and King were asked to participate in the Senate and Assembly Subcommittee Hearings. The hearings are regarding the fair funding that is available and the fact that in the Governor's budget it states the fairs need to be DAA's only to receive the funding and county and citrus fairs would not receive any funding. We were asked to testify to the need for fair funding for ALL fairs. There are 54 DAAs, total of 77 fairs.
- Deputy Manager II King reported that Friends of the Fair had their meeting today at 12noon. They applied for an SBA grant that was only for non-profits and received \$15,000. There's a lot of grants out there right now and a lot of foundations are just wanting to give money away, so they are trying to get as much money as they can.

The Friends of the Fair will be switching banks from Wells Fargo to Central Valley Community Bank and that process should be wrapped up in the next month.

- Deputy Manager II Rianda reminded everyone about the special budget meeting coming up on March 2nd from 1 PM – 4 PM. Director Salinas had a question regarding the gun show and if it had been approved. Taylor stated it had not been approved for March so they postponed the show to May. He asked because Senator Dave Min introduced a bill, SB-264, to ban gun shows at fairgrounds. Both Schwarzenegger and Brown vetoed bills relative to this topic. Deputy Manager II King stated that Louie Brown, our legislative analyst, is on top of this and it is on his radar. WFA has not taken a stand on it because they are getting through all of the budget items right now. Historically, WFA does not take a stand on these items, but CFA will.
