We have partnered again with Arcadia Guided Outdoor Education to expand on our Youth Summer Camps and they have some incredible new offerings. GOAL will also continue to offer Mountain Bike Camps and Indoor Climbing Camps. To learn more please visit our website for details and scholarship application.

Thanks to a grant from the United Way of Northern Utah we have \$12,600 in scholarships available for 2021!

HIKING CAMP | Ages 8-12

Come join us as we explore the trails right in our backyard! During this week-long camp, you will explore a new trail from as far north as Jumpoff Canyon all the way to the heights of Malan's Peak. You will learn about the flora and fauna Ogden trails offers. You will also grow leadership skills, learn and practice Leave No Trace principles and basic first aid techniques.

INTRO TO BACKPACKING | Ages 10-14

This course will introduce students to backpacking with a focus on efficiency systems, healthy interpersonal interactions, environmental stewardship, and leadership development.

OUTDOOR ROCK CLIMBING | Ages 12-16

This camp will introduce students to climbing safety, mindful movement skills, rappelling, and climbing history and philosophy. While discovering the geological wonder that is the Wasatch Mountains with our hands and feet and practicing climbing-specific Leave No Trace skills. All guides are Single Pitch Instructors, certified through the American Mountain Guide Association.

ADVANCED BACKPACKING | Ages 14-18

Spend five days and four nights above the treeline exploring beautiful lakes, bagging peaks, and climbing alpine crags. Students will learn hard skills, such as how to utilize backpacking equipment appropriately and efficiently, and soft skills, such as resilience, teamwork, leadership, and stewardship while strengthening their connection to wild spaces. We'll learn and practice Leave No Trace principles, and each student will have the opportunity to become a Leave No Trace Trainer. All gear provided.

VOLUNTEER SPOTLIGHT - UPWARD BOUND PROGRAM

The Weber State University Upward Bound program is a federal TRIO pre-college program funded by the U.S. Department of Education for future first-generation college students. As part of their mission to prepare students to be the first in their families to graduate from college with a bachelor's degree, they build pathways for students to be active citizens of the Wasatch Front community through frequent participation in community service events.

It is for this reason that WSU Upward Bound formed a strong partnership with the GOAL Foundation many years ago. Each spring, the Ogden Marathon is their largest community service event, as all 82 of our students dedicate up to six hours organizing and distributing hundreds of marathon runner bags at the finish line in downtown Ogden.

One of Upward Bound's senior students reflects on her first marathon, *"One of my favorite memories is the first time I participated. Just helping out was really fun. I think that was when I finally built up enough courage to talk to these two kids from the program. We had a really fun time getting to know each other that day and now they're some of my best friends."*



- Every year they bring 80 volunteers on a Saturday morning, ready to go at 5 am!

VOLUNTEER SPOTLIGHT

If there's a nonprofit in Ogden, chances are that at some point in time, Danielle has directly or indirectly worked with them. While attending Weber State University, she worked in the office of Student Affairs where she learned about a lot of opportunities to get involved. She ended up serving on the Service Team through the Center for Community-Engaged Learning where she racked up some tremendous good karma.

As she neared her graduation from WSU, Danielle went on a school-sanctioned Alternative Spring Break to San Francisco where she serendipitously rode shotgun to the trip advisor, who just so happened to be Clairesse Miljour. Danielle recounted their conversation as a pivotal moment in her life and that she "kinda fell in love" with Clairesse as she told her about organizations like the Jr. League of Ogden and GOAL Foundation. Upon returning from California, Danielle immediately signed up for JLo and got involved with GOAL.

At GOAL, she interned for a while and was later hired to help with the annual Ogden Marathon. The money she earned helped fund a month-long service trip to Mozambique. Her time serving with JLo connected her to many other amazing Ogden women who would leave a lasting mark in Danielle's journey and help propel her to become the person she is today. One of those women was Kimberly Bowsher, director of the Ogden Downtown Alliance.

Danielle knew that ODA was hiring for a new position there but felt like she was underqualified, especially since she hadn't graduated yet. But because of her involvement with JLo, and with encouragement from other members, she felt empowered enough to apply, and (no big surprise) she got the job. Her life was awesome and she was totally killing it and then... she felt drawn to do more. She felt an overwhelming calling to join the Peace Corps.

"I always feel more productive when I'm working for a purpose over a profit," Danielle said. She believes that, in order to impact real changes in the world, service needs to be sustainable. That driving passion pushed her to apply for the community development sector of the Peace Corps and ultimately landed her in Macedonia. She was just getting started on leaving her mark (which may or may not have included a romantic connection) when the COVID-19 pandemic ravaged the world and she had to be evacuated back to the United States. While her Peace Corps stint currently hangs in limbo, her desire to make the world a better place still burns bright. Her future plans include international travel, working toward a master's degree, and always serving others. Danielle is a sterling example of the importance and impact of volunteering. Her advice to anyone interested in serving is:

"Find something you're passionate about. If you're not sure what that is, volunteering with nonprofits is such a good way to learn what that is."

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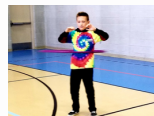
