4. True antiques are defined as being at least 100 years old. But in general, items that are at least 50 years old are considered "antique" for this competition.

5. Articles must be owned by the exhibitor.

6. Photocopies of documents will not be accepted for competition.

7. Every effort will be made to protect exhibits entered. Locked glass cabinets will be used to display small exhibits; larger items will be displayed in a protected area. Security will be in the building to give reasonable protection during the Fair. In no event will the management be responsible for any injury or loss which may occur while in transit or while at the Fair.

8. A brief history of articles, if available, would be helpful. Please print legibly on a 3x5 index card for display with entry.

9. All entries must be clean and in good condition (not disintegrating).

10. Items that do not meet these qualifications will not be accepted for competition.
