- Every effort will be made to protect exhibits entered. Locked glass cabinets will be used to display small exhibits; larger items will be displayed in a protected area. Security will be in the building to give reasonable protection during the Fair. In no event will the management be responsible for any injury or loss which may occur while in transit or while at the Fair.
- A brief history of articles, if available, would be helpful. Please print legibly on a 3x5 index card for display with entry.
- All entries must be clean and in good condition (not disintegrating).
- Items that do not meet these qualifications will not be accepted for competition.

## Macon County Historical Society

Macon County Historical Society will have a special exhibit in the Antiques department at the 2019 fair. Founded in 1979, Macon County Historical Society will be celebrating its 40th anniversary this year. We are a 501c3 nonprofit membership corporation formed to promote awareness of local history in Macon County, Georgia. Named after North Carolina General Nathaniel Macon (as was the City of Macon, which is located in Bibb County), Macon County was created in 1837 from parts of Marion and Houston Counties. It was the 91st County in Georgia and and four towns remain in Macon County - Marshallville, Montezuma, Oglethorpe (the county seat), and Ideal. Membership of the Macon County Historical Society elects a board to run the organization, which meets monthly. Currently there are around seventy members. The organization has programs for the membership, and operates a local history museum in the historic railroad depot in downtown Montezuma, which it helped to acquire and eventually restore. Macon County Historical Society is affiliated with the Georgia Historical Society.
