1. All exhibitors are required to read and abide by the Georgia National Fair General Rules And Regulations. PLEASE NOTE...IT IS YOUR RESPONSIBILITY TO READ AND UNDERSTAND THE RULES. If you have questions, you may certainly e-mail us at contests@gnfa.com. Please help us prevent entry disqualifications.

ELIGIBILITY

2. Students in the 6th through 12th grades (NO EXCEPTIONS) in public or private schools in Georgia are eligible to enter this division. (Please see Hobbies Department "Budding Artists" for opportunities for younger children.) Students may enter as individuals or through their school, but not both.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

3. All entries must be PRE-REGISTERED online by 11:59 PM September 18.

4. Student's name, address, telephone number, school (or "individual" if not entering through a school), age, grade level, Division number, Class number and title of work must be attached securely or written on BACK of artwork in upper right hand corner.

5. The maximum number of entries per student is 8 pieces, with a maximum of two entries in any class.

6. Schools with multiple art/photography teachers should coordinate their efforts and submit entries simultaneously. The maximum number of entries per school is 50 pieces. Teachers: Please do not submit more than two works from the same class project if the project produces "look-alike" pieces.

7. All works must be original and done solely by the entrant. Students may not copy an existing work (or photograph). This includes hobby kits, models, paint by numbers, etc. **NO COPY WORK OR REPRODUCTIONS OF ANY SORT WILL BE ACCEPTED.**
EXHIBITOR IS RESPONSIBLE

FOR OBTAINING PERMISSION FOR USE OF COPYRIGHTED OR TRADEMARKED CHARACTERS OR LOGOS (Spiderman, Batman, Spongebob, Harry Potter, Disney characters, video game characters, College logos, Coca Cola, etc.)

8. Unlike a traditional art gallery, the Georgia National Fair patrons consist largely of families with children and all exhibits should be suitable for family viewing. The Georgia National Fair reserves the right to reject any exhibit offered if it is objectionable. This includes, but is not limited to: images of nudity or graphic violence, profanity, and depictions of a sexually explicit nature. Decisions of the Georgia National Fair will be final.

9. All drawings and paintings on paper must be matted and backed with posterboard, cardboard, or fomecore (total thickness not to exceed 1/4"). No ragged edges - edges must be straight. Outside mats must be black, white, or off-white only; no color. Canvases are not to exceed 1/2" in thickness and should be wired for hanging. 2-D work should not exceed 48" in width and 52" in length. **Framed pieces will not be accepted.** DO NOT TAPE STRING OR WIRE TO MATTED WORKS. This will not hold up for a ten day exhibition.

10. Jewelry or other small works must be submitted in clear plastic resealable bags with the identification label (name, address, telephone number, school, age, grade level, Division number, Class number and title of work) attached INSIDE and other three-dimensional work must have identification label firmly tied to work.

11. Photographs must be mounted on standard mount board (black, white, or off-white; no color) or similar board not to exceed 16x20 inches. The photograph itself must not be smaller than 5x7 inches or greater than 16x20 inches. Fomecore mounts or overlay mats (black, white, or off-white; no color) are acceptable, provided total thickness does not exceed 1/4 inch. Plastic shrink-fit covering

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is permitted, but glass or frames are prohibited. No masonite, corrugated, or thin poster board is acceptable. Processing, enlarging, mounting, and matting may be done by someone other than the exhibitor. Altered photos should have label attached to back stating what alteration was made to the original.

12. 3-D pieces must be no larger than 36 inches in any direction and may not weigh more than 50 lbs.

DELIVERY OF ARTWORK

13. Teachers are asked to bring art entries to the Fairgrounds Saturday, September 21, between 10:00 AM and 4:00 PM. **Entries not received by 4:00 PM will not be accepted. Enter the West gate and follow signs.**

14. All artwork submitted by mail or express must be of such construction and materials that the work can be easily and safely shipped. Students should insure work sent by mail or express.

15. **EXHIBITS SHOULD BE SHIPPED TO ARRIVE NO LATER THAN SEPTEMBER 19.** Send exhibits to: **Youth Art Entry Department, Georgia National Fair, 401 Larry Walker Parkway, Perry, GA 31069.** All exhibits shipped must be prepaid. The box or container used for shipment must be sufficiently strong so that it may be used to return the exhibit to the sender. **Sender's name and address and name of school must be plainly written on outside of package. If artwork is to be shipped back to**

sender, a self-addressed label and sufficient postage or shipping fees must accompany the exhibit.

16. **A detailed packing slip listing all items must be included with all shipped works.**

17. **Responsibility will not be assumed for the return of exhibits for which sufficient shipping charges have not been paid or provided.**

18. Winning entries will remain on exhibit throughout the Fair. **Exhibits not claimed by October 19, 2019 become property of the Georgia National Fair.**

JUDGING

19. Qualified judges will be chosen from college and university art departments and other Georgia art professionals.

20. Judges are instructed not to award a premium or premiums unless the article or articles are deemed worthy of merit.

PREMIUMS

21. All premium money will be paid from the judges' record sheets and not from ribbons that may be attached to exhibits. Premium checks will be mailed the school within six weeks after the Fair is over.

22. Superior School Art Awards are presented to the Middle School and High School with the most blue ribbons.
