

SOUTHEAST EMPIRE LIVESTOCK SHOW

Junior & Senior Dairy Goat Doe Show - Judge: Rusty Repp [GA]

Thursday, September 12, 2019 *** Gwinnett Co. Fair *** 10:30 a.m.

1. This show is an official American Dairy Goat Association Show & their rules shall govern. Competition is open to the world.
2. The Senior & Junior Doe Shows are sanctioned separately & for the following breeds: Alpine, LaMancha, Nigerian Dwarf, Nubian, Oberhasli, Saanen, AOP [Sable, Toggenburg] & Recorded Grade. Breeds will show in that order. The order of the show is not subject to change.
3. Base date for both shows is September 12, 2019. There will be no pre-show milk-out.
4. Entry fee is \$4.00 per animal. Substitutions will be allowed. Entry fees are not refundable. Pen fee is \$4.00 per 5' x 10' pen. [For availability of 5' x 10' pens, please call 706-769-9460.] Tack pens are not available! Pens will be assigned by order of check receipt.
5. Any doe shown in a group, milking or costume event must be shown in its regular age class.
6. Exhibitors competing in the Milking Contest may milk one [1] ADGA registered goat.
7. Animals must be checked in with the Show Secretary & be in place by 8:30 a.m. the day of the show [9/12/2019]. Early arrivals may begin after 2:00 p.m. on Wednesday the 11th.
8. An original registration or recordation certificate is required for goats 6 months of age or older. Goats less than 6 months of age may show with a stamped duplicate or a stamped Faxed duplicate application.
9. All goats will be inspected prior to show time. Health papers are required as follows:
 - A. A certificate of veterinary inspection must be issued within 30 days of the show date & indicate the name & tattoo of each goat to be shown; it must also state: "No evidence of footrot, scabies, cutaneous fungal lesions, Scrapie or soremouth".
 - B. Georgia goats have no brucellosis or tuberculosis test requirements. Out-of-state goats must satisfy Georgia import requirements for brucellosis & tuberculosis test requirements - regulations are contingent on state of origin - call 404-656-3667 for current regulations.
10. The Gwinnett County Livestock & Fair Association will not be held responsible for damage to or by any animal on the fairground property.
11. The Show Committee has a responsibility to the ADGA & to the Gwinnett County Livestock & Fair Association to present dairy goats in a positive manner & to maintain order. The Show Committee will enforce regulations equally for all exhibitors. The Show Committee will deal with improper behavior [poor sportsman-like, disruptive, mishandling of animals, etc.]. When improper behavior is observed, the exhibitor will be given one warning; the Committee will explain what behavior was noticed & what action(s) will be taken if the behavior continues.
