ENTRY INSTRUCTIONS:

Registration is online. Complete the entry form and be sure to use the name of the youth exhibitor who will take part in the show. Pay online. You will **not** upload your current Coggins, but please check to make sure it is current, and bring it with you to the show. Coggins will be examined there by the inspector when you check-in.

FEE:

A **\$10** entry fee covers one (1) class, grounds fee, stall fee, and two (2) bags of shavings. If you wish to participate in more than one class, you may enroll in any additional classes at a cost of \$10 per class. There is no minimum or maximum amount of classes required. If you need additional shavings, please contact the Jacksonville Equestrian Center's Administration office to purchase them for \$8.00 per bag.

A Note to Parents About Your Child's Personal Information:

Why do we require personal information and social security numbers? We understand your concerns, and we want you to know why this info is needed. Many of our 4-H and FFA youths take part in various contests and events-rabbits, poultry, dog show, horse show, and other open and youth shows. It is possible our kids can earn multiple premiums and accumulate a sum of money that requires us to report their earnings to the IRS. It would be difficult to contact parents after the fair to get the information needed and still get checks written and to the winners in a timely manner. We want you to know their information is guarded and entry forms are shredded when they are no longer needed.

Photography Release

Photographs will be taken during these events and the images will be used to help promote the fair and educate the public about our different programs and competitions.

I authorize the Greater Jacksonville Agricultural Fair or their assignees to record and photograph my image and/or voice (or that of my child if under 18) for use in research, educational and promotional programs. I also recognize that these audio, video and image recordings are the property of the Greater Jacksonville Agricultural Fair. ELIGIBILITY:

1. Entries shall be open to:

- Junior Division - Between the ages of 8 -13, as of Sept. 1st, 2020
- Senior Division - Between the ages of 14-18, as of Sept.1st, 2020

2. Exhibitors may enter only one (1) horse. Replacement of a horse prior to the Greater Jacksonville Agricultural Fair's Horse Show is allowed, if the horse entered is certified unsound by a veterinarian and a request for replacement is approved by the 4-H Club advisor, or FFA leader, or Show Supervisor.

3. Walk/Trot exhibitors may not exhibit in Walk/Trot and point classes of the same discipline.

RECEIVING:

Gates will open for stall assignments Friday evening, October 16th, from 4:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. and Saturday morning, October 17th from 6:30 a.m. to 8:00 a.m. Prior to unloading, horses must be checked by a State Inspector or person authorized by the Fair staff and must be accompanied by a negative Coggins Test Certificate. (Be sure to bring your original Coggins.) Upon arrival, the Equestrian Security Staff will advise all exhibitors the designated lot where trailers must be parked immediately following unloading. Golf carts or motorized vehicles of any kind are not allowed on the grounds at any time during this event. Exhibitors should be prepared to have helmets and bits checked at registration.

JUDGING:

1. The Official Rules of the Florida 4-H Area & State Horse Shows will be used as a guideline to judge the show, a copy of which is available at your respective County Extension Office. The Judge's and show supervisors' decision shall be final. When an exhibitor or their parent, leader, or agent is guilty of unsportsmanlike conduct, the show management may suspend the exhibitor's right to participate in future classes and / or shows for such period as judged appropriate. Adults involved will be asked to leave the Show and may be asked not to return for future shows. Appeals to the Judge's decision must be in writing and filed with the Show Supervisor immediately upon conclusion of the class or event in question. A fee of \$50.00 (certified funds) must accompany the protest. If the Appeals Committee upholds the protest, the deposit shall be refunded. If the appeal is overruled, the deposit will be forfeited.
2. Florida 4-H Bit Rules will be used as a guideline to insure horse and rider safety. Show staff will check bits at registration and reserve the right to accept alternative bits at their discretion.
3. Classes may not be added after entries have been submitted.
4. Attire: Exhibitors must wear proper attire and appropriate footwear at all times for the event in which they are competing. Exhibitors are required to wear SEI or SET/ASTM approved safety equestrian helmets with chin harness fastened. These must be worn in all classes, warm-ups, and make-up areas or anytime while mounted. English exhibitors, if competing for high point, must exhibit in their English tack for the trail portion. Only numbers provided by the Show may be worn.
5. Riders may share a mount.

Qualifying for High Point:

In order to be awarded High Point for a category, in Western, English, or Speed, you must receive the most points in the discipline you have designated as your High Point Category on your registration form.

AWARDS:

Rosettes will be awarded to the first (1st) through sixth (6th) places in all classes.

Premiums: The top six (6) individuals in each class will be awarded premiums.

Premium money and points are as follows:

- 1st Place = \$30 and 6 Pts.
- 2nd Place = \$25 and 5 Pts.
- 3rd Place = \$20 and 4 Pts.
- 4th Place = \$15 and 3 Pts.
- 5th Place = \$10 and 2 Pts.
- 6th Place = \$5 and 1 Pt.

High Point Awards:

High Point Junior Western: Will receive \$50 and Special Award

High Point Senior Western: Will receive \$50 and Special Award

High Point Junior English: Will receive \$50 and Special Award

Walk-Trot points will not be credited toward High Point Award.

The High Point Awards will be presented approximately thirty (30) minutes following the end of the last class. However, premium checks will be mailed after the Greater Jacksonville Agricultural Fair held November 5th through November 15th. All awards and premiums are provided by the Greater Jacksonville Agricultural Fair.

STALL DECORATING CONTEST

Only registered riders may enter the stall decorating contest sponsored by the Greater Jacksonville Agricultural Fair. No additional fee is required. Riders should use their creative imagination to decorate their stalls using the theme of the 2020 Greater Jacksonville Agricultural Fair, which is "It's Fair Time!" Stalls will be judged by fair officials at 10:30 a.m. on show day. Please see the attached rubric below and refer to it when decorating.

Prizes for stall decorating are as follows:

- 1st Prize - \$30.00
- 2nd Prize - \$20.00
- 3rd Prize - \$10.00

RV Camping Request: You can make arrangements for camping accommodations prior to or upon arrival at the Jacksonville Equestrian Center. POSTER CONTEST

Posters must not exceed 22" X 14" in size and can be submitted to Duval County 4-H on or before show day. They will be judged during the show and then displayed at the Jacksonville Equestrian Center with their awards. The poster can depict any topic related to the horse. For example: care, training, health, nutrition, psychology, breed, history of breeds, anatomy, careers, safety, reproduction, youth leadership in projects, colors, and markings, etc.

PRACTICE?

Want to practice in the Equestrian Arena before the show? Night schooling is scheduled once a month. Check with the Equestrian website, www.jaxevents.com, to determine the schedule. The cost is \$10 per rider. Riders must show a Negative Coggins for their horses.

COVID 19
