
#### **Current Members**

### DID YOU KNOW THAT YOUR PET MANAGEMENT PRACTICES CAN CONTRIBUTE TO WATER QUALITY PROBLEMS?

Not only is pet waste unpleasant to look at; it contains bacteria and nutrients that pollute our Streams and Rivers. Pet waste is carried by rainfall runoff. And, pet waste deposited onto roads has a direct route to our storm drains, which carry stormwater runoff and everything it has picked up along the way straight into our rivers, creeks, and streams.

So, what can you do?

- When walking your dog, always carry a bag and pick up your pet's waste!
- Patrol your yard or kennel daily so rainfall runoff doesn't carry your pet's waste into our Streams and Rivers.
- Dispose of waste by either placing it in the trash, or flushing it down a toilet.
- Please be a responsible dog owner and friend of the environment.

And, remember: Storm drains are not sanitary sewer drains, so don't let your pet poop flow where it shouldn't go!

## Out in the Garden with Alan Cash



The weather is always a good topic to get a conversation started. However, it is getting old when the story is the same; hot and dry, hot and dry, and then dry and hot for variety. The current series of days at 100 degrees or above is really challenging, trying to keep gardens alive but still stay within the City's watering restrictions. The best thing to do is to keep shrubs and trees alive; they are the basic bones of any good landscape. Then decide which other plants should just be added to the compost

pile. It is time to plan ahead. Good times will return. See what is doing well in other gardens and make selections for fall planting. To help, there is a free list of drought-tolerant plants for our area in the box under the bulletin board on the front porch of the KWA office. Feel free to share the list with your neighbors.

There is always something to do in the garden, even in these "dog days of summer." Some plants can be trimmed to promote thicker foliage and more blooms later in the season. Do not trim climbing roses, but do trim other types back by about one foot. It is also time to trim poinsettias back to about 3 to 4 feet, no matter how tall they have grown. They will bush out and give you more red bracks in December.

When it gets cooler you can fertilize with an organic fertilizer. This will help stressed plants recover from the summer heat. Sprinkle some in flower beds and around the drip lines of shrubs and trees. You do not have to water organic fertilizers immediately after spreading them. So you can spread one day and water the next or the day after that.

If you have not already put out pans of water for birds and other animals, please do so. Without rain they are having a hard time. Be sure to empty and refill the containers every couple of days to keep the mosquito population down.

They say a picture is worth a thousand words. If you put mulch around your plants earlier in the year, you can tell the difference between yours and those that were not mulched. It really does keep the soil cooler and the moisture in. Mulch can be spread anytime. Put about 2 to 3 inches in flower beds and 4 to 5 around trees and shrubs.
