The 2019 North Idaho State Fair and Gem State Stampede were no doubt a huge success! With a 13% jump in attendance we hosted 97,082 guests in the course of 5 very fun filled days. Wednesday, we kicked things off with a record-breaking attendance and a concert people raved about which set a positive tone for the entire week. Once in the gates, the fair offered over \$100,000 in free entertainment including Music on the Midway, World Class Stage and Strolling Acts and so much more! With so much great entertainment to see we made it a priority to remain true to our mission of educating our fairgoers about the importance of Agriculture. To do this we, created new sponsorship opportunities and partnered with the Kootenai/Shoshone Farm Bureau and created the Idaho Forest Group AgVentureLand. This area showcased the new Farm Park, Vintage Agriculture Equipment, Sawmill demonstrations and more. The Findlay Arena Shows for the Gem State Stampede PRCA Rodeo, Xtreme Bulls and Demo Derby were SOLD OUT every day, bringing to light yet again the need for more seating is paramount!



This year was one of many changes. Change is not always viewed as positive, but I was raised that change is always constant, so we embraced and tackled it. Luckily for us, these changes were all with the desire to make operations smoother and work to add a better experience for our fairgoers. One of several changes many noticed this year was the addition of Paul Maurer Shows, our new carnival. For years we have heard our customers wanted a new carnival and after a lengthy Request For Proposal process we found the right fit and it showed with a 32% increase! Our new online ticketing system also proved to be a major success and brought us into the new era of technology thereby allowing us to be much more customer friendly at every point of entry.

We must not forget to mention the incredible success of the 4-H Livestock Sale increasing by \$200,000 for total sales of over \$850,000 in 2019! What an incredible community we have!

Chicks n Chaps raises over \$49,000

Gathering in the “pink’d up” Clubhouse above the Grandstands, over 150 women joined the committee, Ranch Hands and volunteers to participate in Chicks n Chaps at the Gem State Stampede -- a women-only rodeo clinic and fundraiser held annually in conjunction with Pink Night at the rodeo. Chicks n Chaps pulls together women to give them basic information on the animals, cowboys and cowgirls and the events that are featured at the rodeo. The ladies get to try their hands at roping, riding a mechanical bull and barrel racing with stick ponies. It then moves into the Clubhouse where the women enjoy fun and games and a live and silent auction.



“Chicks n Chaps at the Gem State Stampede is more than learning how to handle a lasso.” said Co-Chair Ann Siebert, “It’s about bringing together women in our community to raise funds that help others in Kootenai County and to increase awareness about breast cancer. Our girls can learn to ride a bull and can schedule their mammograms.”

This year’s event raised over \$49,000 with proceeds staying local and being divided between Kootenai Health Foundation’s Cancer Patient Support Fund and the North Idaho Fair & Rodeo Foundation. “As a committee we bring together the resources of two local organizations to create one event at The Fairgrounds,” said Siebert.

The Kootenai Health Foundation’s Cancer Patient Support Fund provides financial assistance for people in our community going through cancer treatment, so they can focus on their recovery rather than worrying about food or gas money.

The North Idaho Fair & Rodeo Foundation raises funds for capital improvements at the Fairgrounds and for scholarships and educational opportunities in our community.

This popular event which has sold out the past several years has raised nearly \$180,000 since its inception in 2009.

This event is Co-Chaired on behalf of the North Idaho Fair & Rodeo Foundation, by Mary Luann Larson, Immediate Past President of the North Idaho Fair & Rodeo Foundation and Ann Siebert, the Fair Foundation’s Secretary and Board Member. The committee is in the planning stages for next year’s 12th Chicks n Chaps at the Gem State Stampede to be held on August 28, 2020.

Once again the 2019 Farm to Table Agriculture Education tour days, held May 22 and 23rd, was a great success. 5th grade students from all of the Lakeland and Post Falls elementary schools plus three Coeur d’Alene schools and, new this year, Holy Family Catholic School’s 5th graders joined us to make a total of 1165 students plus teachers and chaperones. Each class attended seven agriculture information stations plus enjoying a horsedrawn wagonride and feasting on a hamburger lunch. At each station they learned about subjects such as beef, sheep, pigs, dairy, goats, bees and other pollinators, corn, potatoes, hay production, water, soil, apples, wheat and new this year were stations

on Agriculture careers and a well received, very interactive station on rodeo and how it links to agriculture which was hosted by the Gem State Stampede Rodeo committee. Feed back from those who attend each year plus often from folks who have attended in the past always reinforces that this field day is not only a great learning experience it is also fun and leaves lasting memories. Many thanks from the planning committee to all those who volunteer to teach at the stations plus the great crew who cooks and serves over 1500 hamburger lunches in the two days. Last, but not least, a thank you to our financial sponsors, including the Fair Foundation, who allows us to offer this learning experience free of charge to the schools.
