## Farm to Table Program Educates Nearly 800 5th Grade Students

In its second year, the Farm to Table program expanded to two days in 2016 and reached hundreds of students from both Lakeland and Post Falls School Districts. Twenty-nine classes came to the Fairgrounds on May 18th and 19th to learn about agriculture and where their food comes from.

Participants rotated through several stations covering topics such as beef, wheat, dairy, sheep, crops, vegetables, bees, swine, aquifers, chemicals, wagon rides, and of course a lunch to fit the days curriculum. A menu of hamburgers, on wheat buns, served with cheese, tomatoes, pickles and lettuce, carrots on the side and milk to drink or ice cream was enjoyed by all.

# Fair & Rodeo Get New Name

As a culmination of nearly two years of strategizing, the Fair and rodeo both have a newly elevated brand. They will now be known as the North Idaho State Fair and Gem State Stampede, Coeur d'Alene's PRCA Rodeo.

Already the largest fair in the northern ten counties of Idaho, the North Idaho State Fair rivals many other fairs in the industry, offering world-class entertainment, the largest carnival in the region, professional rodeo and bull riding performances, record-breaking exhibit entries, and enhanced educational programs. In addition to increasing the fair's geographical presence, the name change serves to reflect the fair's brand and the quality of experience it already provides.

As the North Idaho State Fair, the area of eligible fair participants will expand from five counties to ten, giving the fair an opportunity to showcase more open class exhibit entries, as well as attract additional guests from the surrounding counties. The transition to being a state fair will also help develop new community partnerships and draw diverse vendors to the fair, further enhancing the event for all guests.

"This is an exciting time for the North Idaho State Fair. We are proud of the high-caliber fair we offer our guests, and look forward

to this chance to evolve our attendance, exhibits, and business relationships while still keeping our well-known rural charm. We're eager to invite new and returning guests to celebrate this opportunity with us," said Dane Dugan, General Manager.

The fair's expansion will allow exhibit participants from the following counties: Boundary, Bonner, Kootenai, Benewah, Shoshone, Latah, Clearwater, Nez Perce, Lewis, and Idaho. 4-H entries will continue to be limited to those residing in Kootenai and Shoshone counties.



# New Rodeo Chutes Getting Installed

Last September, the North Idaho Fair and Rodeo Foundation purchased a set of Powder River bucking chutes through the Fort Dalles Rodeo Liquidation Auction. The bucking chutes were acquired to replace the wood chutes that have been an icon at the fairgrounds for as long as many of us can remember.

The rodeo committee has done a lot of work on the old wooden chutes over the years, but the consensus of the contestants and rodeo stock contractor was that replacing them would improve our arena events, attract more cowboys and be safer for the bucking stock.

Thanks to the Fair Foundation we were able to post a successful bid of just over \$11,000 well below the asking price for a new set of metal bucking chutes. The cost of the chutes is being recouped through sponsorships (eight chutes sponsored for \$1,500 per chute). The sponsors will be recognized on the front of each chute and there are only two remaining!

In October, the rodeo committee traveled to Fort Dalles and picked up the new bucking chutes. Over the winter, the volunteer committee completely disassembled each of them and spent several weekends welding, cleaning and generally making them look new again. The disassembly of the old bucking chutes has started and the new chutes will be set in the arena in early summer.

We are excited to continue to improve the whole ambiance of the rodeo arena and grounds as the PRCA rodeo continues to grow. Attracting top cowboys and cowgirls to the North Idaho Fair and Rodeo is one of our top goals. We believe, the new bucking chutes will be well received by cowboys, animals and our stock contractor.

really puts the pressure on our volunteers to make sure we deliver a program that is fun, purposeful, and something everyone wants to come back to.

It was especially fun to see everyone enjoying the Photo Booth and posting their pictures on social media and to watch the dancers enjoy stepping out to Sam Platts and the Kootenai Three and to the Kelly Hughes Band. 
# Have Your Next Event At The Fairgrounds
