

PASSES & ENTRY FEES
GENERAL RULES GOVERNING LIVESTOCK EXHIBITION

(Special Rules Will Be Found Pertaining to the Respective Breeds of Livestock)

Rule 1. Entries in all Livestock Departments close September 7 (except as otherwise specified) and must be filed with Livestock Office. All entries must have a U.S. Postmark not a postage meter stamp. Livestock exhibition will follow Schedule of Events.

Rule 2. On all entry forms: If the form is incomplete or incorrectly completed it will be rejected, refused, and returned.

Rule 3. Application for stalls and pens must be made to the State Fair of Louisiana, naming breed of animals and number to be exhibited. Stalls and pens will be assigned by the Livestock Director and the State Fair of Louisiana reserves the right, through its management, to determine the number of animals to be entered by any one firm or individual at the 2019 State Fair of Louisiana.

Because of limited space the livestock director reserves the right to limit space per exhibitor. Entry fees do not dictate stall/pen spaces. Exhibitors will only receive proper space for each animal delivered to The State Fair of Louisiana, regardless of the number of entries made for the show.

Rule 4. State Fair gate admission photo I.D.'s will be issued only to official Livestock Superintendents and Volunteers, Assistants, 4-H Club Agents and Vocational Agriculture teachers directly responsible for 4-H and FFA livestock exhibits. Photo I.D.'s may be obtained on application at the CREDENTIALS OFFICE LOCATED AT THE ENTRANCE ON FAIR STREET.

Rule 5. LIVESTOCK EXHIBITOR TICKETS

Livestock exhibitor passes will be issued to all Open Show exhibitors on the following basis and will be available in the CREDENTIALS OFFICE upon arrival. Additional passes in excess of the allotted number will not be issued but may be purchased at \$10.00 each.

This is only for OPEN SHOW ENTIRIES ONLY. The exhibitor of any animal that is entered in junior show and the open show will only receive one pass, regardless of the number of entries.

Rule 6. LIVESTOCK EXHIBITOR ARRIVAL ON FAIRGROUNDS:

1. Check health papers at veterinarian's office inside livestock gate.
2. All exhibitor passes will be at the Livestock office beside the Veterinarian's office. Stop there before proceeding.
3. If you must purchase additional passes do so at the Livestock office before proceeding to unload livestock.
4. Proceed to livestock unloading lane.

There will be a 30-minute limit in the loading and unloading lane. All unattended vehicles will be towed away at owner's expense.

Keep the left lane under the stadium open at all times.

Rule 8. PREMIUM CHECKS: PLEASE NOTICE ALL PREMIUM CHECKS HAVE A 60 DAY EXPIRATION. PLEASE ADHERE TO THIS POLICY AS THE STATE FAIR OF LOUISIANA MUST CLOSE OUT THIS ACCOUNT BY JANUARY 1, 2019. EXPIRED CHECKS WILL NOT BE RE-ISSUED.

Rule 9. Junior exhibitors who wish to enter their animals in the open classes may do so, upon payment of fees as applies to the open classes, and provided the entry is filed by September 7th. Late fees will be assessed following the chart below. Deadline to enter class is midnight before show.

Junior exhibitors must comply with all rules and regulations as applies to open classes. Failure to comply will bar the exhibitor from participating for premiums, which may be awarded by the judge in any Department of the Fair.

Rule 10. No breeding animal can be entered or exhibited unless it has been recorded in the recognized book of records for its respective breed. Exhibitors must have certificate of registry on hand during the fair. Name and registry number of sire and dam must be given for animals under six months of age.

Rule 11. Animals composing a herd or group will need to be named in application for entry. The herd or group must consist of animals entered and shown in the individual classes and their names and numbers must be reported to the Superintendent when the class is called.

Rule 12. No substitution of any animal will be allowed after the entries are officially closed, unless approved by Livestock Director.

Rule 13. All animals must be entered in the name of the owner and the title of ownership of the exhibitor shall show on the registration certificate at the time of exhibition. There shall be no dual ownership in the Junior Division. Animals must be registered in one person's name. All entries of animals must specify the owner's name, its name, sex, registry number and description. The record number of each animal must be given on the entry blank.

Rule 14. A breeder is defined to be the owner of a female at the time of service. All entries must be made on regulation entry blanks.

Rule 15. Exhibitors when called are expected to produce their stock promptly. Stock must be in the ring within ten minutes after the class is called. Any exhibitor failing to comply with the orders or instructions of the Manager or Superintendent will thereby annul and cancel all entries and forfeit such prizes awarded him as the State Fair Management may see fit to withhold, and exhibitor may be barred from further showing during the State Fair.

Rule 16. Special care will be taken that no animal has a disease. If an animal has been exposed to disease 30 days prior to the Fair it will not be admitted into the grounds at any time during the Fair. Management will refuse unloading privileges to any stock having disease or characteristics of having an illness. If animal does show characteristics of an illness, a State Vet will examine to see if animal is fit to show. If animal is positive for illness, that animal must leave the Fairgrounds immediately.

Rule17. All attendants or persons leading or driving an animal into the judging arena, shall be neatly attired or in uniform, and must be kept neat and clean throughout the show.

Rule 18. Animals must be tied in areas designated by the management. Violation of this rule may result in forfeiture of any premium money awarded.

Rule 19. Entries of animals in any division are subject to the special rules, if any, of the respective breed associations as pertain to dental inspections.

Rule 20. Care of stalls and pens — Exhibitors are required to keep their tack area, stalls, aisles and exhibits in a neat condition at all times.

Rule 21. NURSE COWS FOR BEEF CATTLE, BOTH BREEDING AND STEERS IN THE OPEN AND JUNIOR SHOWS, MAY NOT BE ON THE STATE FAIR OF LOUISIANA GROUNDS, IN ACCORDANCE TO RULES OF THE INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF FAIRS AND EXPOSITIONS AND THE AMERICAN BREED ASSOCIATIONS.
