To be eligible to exhibit in the Prospect Goat show exhibitors must not be more than twenty-one years of age. All exhibitors must show their own animal without assistance in the ring. (Exception: If an exhibitor has a physical handicap, he or she must notify State Fair of Louisiana Livestock Management in writing prior to the show for assistance.)

NOTE: All goats must have an official USDA Scrapie Tag and Identification Ear Tag in their ear in order to be eligible for exhibition at The State Fair of Louisiana.

To guarantee stall space you must enter by October 15, 2019. After October 15, 2019 the State Fair has the right to refuse entry due to lack of stall space.

Check or money order for entry fees must accompany application for entries.
Entry Fee: \$20.00 per animal.
Entry fees will not be refunded unless cancellation is made in writing and received prior to closing entry date, October 15, 2019.

SPECIAL ATTENTION IS CALLED TO THE GENERAL RULES GOVERNING THE EXHIBIT OF LIVESTOCK AND POULTRY IN THIS DIVISION. All rules, regulations, premium offerings, etc., appearing in this catalog are subject to correction in event of any printing errors that would tend to change the meaning or intent.

1. Withers and/or Non-Bred Does are eligible to show.
2. Each exhibitor must show his/her own animal.
3. Prospect Goats will be weighed between 12:00 AM and 3:00 PM on the official weigh day designated by the Fair Management. Official scales will be provided.
4. Goats must be dehorned, polled or disbudded. Any scurs or horn structures must be blunted and not exceed one inch in length. NO dehorning on premises.

5. Prospect Goats ARE NOT required to have milk teeth in place.
6. Prospect Goats shown in the 2019 State Fair of Louisiana must have an identification tag
7. All goats will show by weight only.
8. Maximum weight for Prospect Goat is 55 lbs. with no minimum.
9. Prospect Goats must have hair no longer than ¼ inch above the hocks and knees including the head but excluding the tail.

WHOLESOME ASSURANCE STATEMENT

ATTENTION:

The use by non-veterinarians* of animal drugs or other substances in any manner other than in accord with the labeling approved by FDA is a violation of federal law.

* NOTE: Abuse of the extra-label privilege by veterinarians is unethical and is subject to serious consequences such as license revocation.
Any food animal must not exceed FDA/EPA/USDA-established tolerances for any foreign substance (identified or unidentified) including drugs, pesticides, feed additives, or other chemicals.

Violating results of residue testing are subject to investigation by USDA and FDA for prosecution.

Any misrepresentation of a food animal that can potentially affect the acceptability of the carcass will be considered fraud.

DRUG TESTING: Prospect goats are subject to randomly drug tested upon request from State Fair of Louisiana officials.
