Premiums to be paid for 1st and 2nd place only in classes of 10 or smaller.

Exhibitors will be allowed to use oil base or show sheen on show cattle. No grooming products may be used such as paint, dyes, glue or adhesive.

Junior Angus entering the make up ring with evidence of paint, dye, glue or adhesive will be disqualified

ENTRIES CLOSE SEPTEMBER 7, 2019

Check or money order for entry fees must accompany application for entries. Entry Fee: \$30.00 per animal.

Entry fees will not be refunded unless cancellation is made in writing and received prior to closing entry date, September 7, 2019.

SPECIAL ATTENTION IS CALLED TO THE GENERAL RULES GOVERNING THE EXHIBIT OF LIVESTOCK AND POULTRY IN THIS DIVISION.

All rules, regulations, premium offerings, etc., appearing in this catalog are subject to correction in event of any printing errors that would tend to change the meaning or intent.

Louisiana Beef Breed Associations may have Louisiana Bred Champions selected by the Judge if Association desires. The association will be responsible for all awards and premiums in the Louisiana Bred Division.

LOUISIANA-BRED — If animal is to be considered for Louisiana-Bred Champion or Louisiana-Bred Reserve Champion, all registration papers must be received in the State Fair of Louisiana Livestock office no later than October 1, 2019. The animal must be entered as Louisiana-Bred at time of entry.

All bulls must be secured with neck strap in addition to their halter while tied in stalls.

All bulls exhibited in this division must be shown with a nose lead.

SHOWMANSHIP

Breed Associations will sponsor showmanship for their respective breed. Each breed must adhere to the rules set forth by the Association.

The State Fair will provide arena, microphone and designated time as in Schedule of Events.

Premiums and ribbons will be provided by breed associations.

SPECIAL RULES FOR JUNIOR ANGUS

1. The American Angus Association, 3201 Frederick Avenue, St. Joseph, MO, will participate in premiums offered in individual classes for junior Angus heifers as included in its standard show classifications, according to the premium schedule based on the number of heads shown. The Association contributions will be included in the premium checks issued by the show.
2. A minimum of fifteen (15) head must be shown in the junior Angus heifer class to receive American Angus Association premium participation.
3. To be eligible for Association premiums heifer entries must be recorded in the sole name of the junior exhibitor and the issue date on the registration certificate must conform to the individual show's requirements regarding ownership. The Association's contribution is included in the total premiums listed in each class.
4. The animals must be judged by the American system of judging (they must be placed numerically and the ribbons and premiums awarded in the same manner). The American Angus Association does not offer financial assistance or awards on any show judged under the Danish or group system of judging.
5. Premiums from the Association are paid by registration number. Therefore, all cattle should be registered at the time of entry to make certain they receive the Association's portion of premiums. The Association does not pay a percentage on premiums offered in championship classes.
6. Exhibitors must have the original registration certificate on each animal available for inspection at the show.
7. Any animal, upon check-in, which does not have a legible tattoo corresponding to its registration certificate, is ineligible to show. Once disqualified due to an incorrect or illegible tattoo, animals cannot be re-tattooed and rechecked at the show.
8. If a recorded parent is excluded (as a parent) as a result of blood type, the owner may request, at his own expense, the Association to determine the actual parent. Failure to determine the sire and dam disqualifies the animal's eligibility in the Angus Herdbook, and the registration certificate becomes null and void. Any animal with a nontraditional blood type is ineligible for the

Angus Herdbook.

9. The recorded sire and dam must qualify as parents of the sampled animal through blood chemistry. If a recorded parent is excluded (as a parent) as a result of blood type, the owner may request, at his own expense, the Association to determine the actual parent. Failure to determine the sire and dam disqualifies the animal's eligibility in the Angus Herdbook, and the registration certificate becomes null and void. Any animal with a nontraditional blood type is ineligible for the Angus Herdbook.

PARISH GROUPS (Must have three parishes or more to have a parish group class)

1. Where there are one or more Parish Groups of beef animals exhibited from a Parish, only one premium will be paid and that to the group receiving the highest placing.
2. Parish groups will receive ribbons instead of premium money.

CLASS

1. Breeding Beef Parish Groups, consisting of 6 beef breeding of the same breed, all from one parish, with not more than 3 animals entered by any one 4-H Club member or FFA member.
