Junior Department Rules

The junior department is for youth who want to enter exhibits at the La Habra Citrus Fair. There are a number of organizations that want competition within their specific organization. The La Habra Citrus Fair can do this by establishing divisions and classes for groups such as FFA, 4-H and others. The L.H.V.C.F will provide the opportunity for young people to exhibit who are not members of an organized group. Independent Junior exhibitors will compete in the appropriate class in direct competition with other 4H and FFA members.

***All livestock classes are reserved for 4-H, FFA, and Agriculture College members**

Community Youth

FFA Members: may participate in classes when they enroll in high school agriculture education courses and may show until the end of the next calendar year following graduation.

4-H Membership: enrollment is open to all youth from kindergarten through 12th grade through December 31st of the year in which they turn 19 years of age.

4-H Primary: members must be 5 years old or in Kindergarten by Dec. 31st of the program year. Primary members **cannot** enroll in large animal projects. **Approved** animal projects are dogs, rabbits, cats, poultry, cavies, and pygmy goats.

College: Students enrolled in agriculture related classes and showing animals that are college project related.

Independent Junior Exhibitors: An independent junior is a youth in our community Ages 5-19 and enrolled in our local school districts or living in the City limits or county zones in 90631.

- All projects must be the result of an exhibitor's work in regular classroom or project instruction in the past year.
- Entries may not be shown in more than one calendar year.
- The Exhibitor must be the major contributor to the construction on the project.

DIVISION 950 – SMALL CONSTRUCTED PROJECTS

- Construction cost should not exceed \$25.00.

DIVISION 951 – MEDIUM CONSTRUCTED PROJECTS

- Construction cost of \$26.00 to \$150.00.
- Limit of 3 projects per exhibitor per division.

DIVISION 952 – LARGE CONSTRUCTED PROJECTS

Construction cost of \$151.00 to \$1,000.00.
Limit of 1 project per exhibitor per division.

DIVISION 953 – REPAIRED INDUSTRIAL & FARM EQUIPMENT

- Example: tool handles, re-welding, refinishing lumber
- Limit of 1 project per exhibitor per class

Class

- 01 Construction cost of less than \$25.00 to refurbish
- 02 Construction cost between 26.00 to 100.00 to refurbish
- 03 Construction cost between 101.00 to 149.00

DIVISION 954 – REPAIRED INDUSTRIAL & FARM EQUIPMENT

- Limit of 1 project per exhibitor per division.

Class

- 01 Construction cost of \$150. 00 to \$500.00
- 02 Construction cost of \$501 to \$1,000.00
- 03 Construction cost of \$1001.00.00 & Over

DIVISION 955 – RESTORED SMALL ENGINES

Class

- 01 Restoration cost of \$25.00 or less
- 02 Restoration cost of 26.00 to \$50.00
- 03 Restoration cost of \$51.00 to \$100.00
- 04 Restoration cost of \$101.00 to \$500.00
- 05 Restoration cost of \$501.00 to \$1,000.00

DIVISION 956 – CHAPTER GROUP

- Limit of 1 entry per Chapter Group
- The judge will use the following rubric to judge: Scorecard
 - Workmanship 60
 - Practicability 20
 - Amount of work 20

Class

- 01 Any 3 items by one chapter, not more than 1 by each exhibitor. Chapter group items must be submitted and items designated by the advisor prior to the exhibits being judged.
