GENERAL INFORMATION

The Lake County Fair will not be responsible to any person, individual, corporation or association for any loss by fire, theft, damage or personal injury sustained by anyone through the negligence of any person or group of persons, exhibits or exhibitors.

The Directors of the Lake County Fair Association, Inc. reserves the right to rule on all questions not covered in the rules.

GATE & ADMISSIONS: Service gate at Southeast entrance of the Fairgrounds will be open until 4:00 PM except Saturdays and Sundays. On these days the service gate will be closed and locked at 12:00 PM and paid admission begins.

Adult admission (12 & older) - \$9.00

Child admission - \$3.00

5 & under free when accompanied by an adult
Every person entering the grounds must have a ticket.

ADMINISTRATION OFFICE: The President and Fair Manager of the Lake County Fair maintain headquarters at the Fair Office on the southwest end of the Fairgrounds.

REST ROOMS: Rest room facilities are available in the Clements and Commercial building. Baby changing stations are provided in the Commercial building restrooms.

FIRST AID: First aid care will be available during scheduled Fair hours to render emergency service under the competent direction of volunteer trained personnel. Ambulance service will be available if needed.

LOST AND FOUND: A Lost and Found Department is maintained at the Administration office.

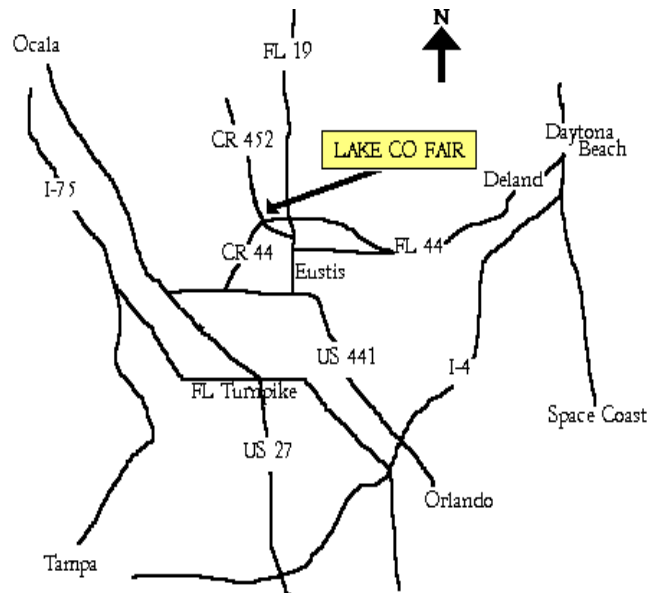

SECURITY: Fairgrounds will be policed by special security officers and night watchmen employed for your personal safety and for the protection of various group and individual exhibits. This service is provided with the interest and cooperation of the Lake County Fair Association.

ALCOHOL/BEVERAGE/DRINK

CONTAINERS: No alcoholic beverages will be permitted on the Fairgrounds. Soft drinks may be served in paper cups, approved cans or plastic bottles. NO GLASS BOTTLES PLEASE.

GENERAL RULES

EXHIBITORS

WHO MAY ENTER COMPETITION

Premium lists throughout this book are open to all qualified FFA and 4-H members, and all other youth and adults who reside in Lake County.

Eligibility requirements are found under individual departments.

Notice: Students attending Lake County Schools Grades 1-12 will be considered Youth and will enter all departments accordingly.

See Livestock Premium Book for requirements for all animal exhibits.

ENTRY BLANKS

Entry blanks will be made available at check in. Department class and lot numbers must be on entry blanks and must correspond to those in the Premium Book. Entry blanks must be presented on date specified in the specific department where entry is being made. Entry must be made by exhibitor with complete entry form.

LIABILITY

All property of every character, whether entered for exhibit or any other purpose, will be taken into the grounds and buildings and kept entirely at the risk of the owner who assumes all responsibility for loss, damage, or theft. It is distinctly understood that exhibitors, concessionaires, and all other persons, firms or corporations having property on the grounds and desiring protection from such loss or damage must make their own arrangements therefore.

The Lake County Fair will employ guards and traffic directors and will promote safety and protection of patrons, and their exhibits and property on the fairgrounds. But under no circumstances, will the Fair or any of its officers or employees be responsible for loss or damage to persons and their property (including exhibits, automobiles in parking lots, and articles left in cars) because of accidents, theft, fire, the elements, and other conditions.

PROTESTS

Judges have been carefully selected. All persons making entries accept these judges and agree to abide by their decisions. Protests upon any other grounds, or against other than judges, must be made out in writing on the same day in which protested action was taken, and given to the superintendent of the department concerned, who shall present such protest to the Fair officials. Parties filing protest must deposit \$100.00, to be forfeited if not sustained in complaint.

PLACEMENT AND REMOVAL OF EXHIBITS

For every article, animal, or fowl entered, a numbered entry tag or card will be filled out identifying entry. A claim check with number corresponding to that on the entry tag shall be given to the exhibitor. This claim check must be presented to the proper official at the close of the Fair, when the articles are being called for and claimed. See individual departments for placement and removal times and dates. **Livestock exhibitors please refer to Livestock Premium Book for removal times and dates.** Exhibits cannot be removed before **10:00 PM Saturday**, closing day of the Fair. See each department for removal times and dates. The Lake County Fair Association assumes no responsibility after removal time deadline. All items not claimed will be discarded by the Fair Association.

SECURITY

It is understood that the exhibits are entered in competition for prizes, and that the owner assumes all responsibility for an accident, loss or damage that may occur. Neither the Lake County Fair Association, Inc., the County of Lake, officers of the Association or its agents, will be held responsible for any loss, accident or damage.

FINE ARTS RULES

1. All Lake County ADULT & YOUTH artists.
2. Limit THREE (3) works of art per artists.
3. All entries must be securely framed, properly wired, no saw-toothed single brackets are permitted. Unframed canvas, if used, must be in good taste, suitable for viewing by families. Non-conforming entries will not be accepted as judged by the Committee.
4. **PLEASE NOTE: DUE TO LIMITED SPACE ONLY ITEMS WINNING AWARDS WILL BE ON DISPLAY DURING THE FAIR.**
5. **THOSE ITEMS NOT RECEIVING AWARDS NEED TO BE PICKED UP FRIDAY, MARCH 27 OR SATURDAY, MARCH 28, 2020 BETWEEN THE HOURS OF 9:00 AM-3:00 PM. YOU WILL BE CONTACTED ONCE JUDGING IS COMPLETE TO PICK UP YOUR ITEMS.**
6. Only one (1) work of the three may be as much as 36 inches on a side, including frame. The other 2 should be smaller than the 24 inches on a side, including frame. This is due to available space.
7. Entries must be original work only (not copied from someone else's work). Any work previously shown at the Fair will not be eligible. **Work done in a class should not be shown.**
8. Prints, computer generated work or computer copied work is not allowed.
9. Please keep picture titles short as possible.
10. Please follow instructions and complete information on the entry site which is available at www.lakecofair.com
11. During the Fair, prospective purchasers name and phone number will be attached to the back of the work.
12. ALL ENTIRES WINNING AWARDS MUST STAY FOR THE DURATION OF THE FAIR. Make arrangements if unable to pick up your work at the removal time. A fee may be charged if items are left after removal date.
13. All participants will be asked to volunteer a few hours to sit with show during the Fair.
