

DIVISION 231 - MEAT PEN, RABBITS

ARRIVAL TIME:	TBD – Connect with your advisor or leader. Tentative - September 1, 2020; 07:00 AM
WEIGH-IN:	Tuesday - September 1, 2020; 08:00 AM
JUDGING:	Tuesday - September 1, 2020; after weigh-in
REQUIREMENTS:	- To Lake County Residents only. - PEN of THREE RABBITS: Weight 3 ½ to 5 ½ lbs. each, not over 10 weeks old - Two (2) photos are required and one video may be required for each pen
ENTRY FEE:	\$16.00 per entry, per class
ENTRY LIMIT:	Combination of 2 market animals or meat pens – must be IDENTIFIED BY EAR MARKING ON ENTRY

Rules, definitions and judging procedures as prescribed in the latest edition of the Guide Book and Standard of the American Rabbit Breeder's Association, Inc. shall apply to all district and county fair rabbit shows, provided they do not conflict with any of the rules and regulations prescribed in the Department of Food and Agriculture.

1. All Rabbits must be identified by permanent ear markings conforming with the entry form on arrival at the show. Any duplication of ear markings by one exhibitor in the same division must be eliminated and changed or recorded on the judging sheet BEFORE JUDGING.
2. All animals must be checked-in with the show secretary BEFORE CAGING. This is to check for tattoos and signs of illness.
3. All breeds judged together. Each entry to be one breed and color.
4. All Rabbits must have proper water and food dishes.
5. Exhibitors are responsible for the care and feeding of their rabbits.



DANISH SYSTEM OF GRADING

DIVISION 231 – MEAT PEN RABBITS, PEN OF THREE

CLASS

1. Rabbits – Three rabbits, weight 3 ½ to 5 ½ lbs. each, not over 10 weeks old.

Processing for rabbit meat pens are arranged by the Junior Livestock Committee. **NO "HOLD LIVE" Terminal sale**

UPON ARRIVAL TO THE GROUNDS YOU MUST HAVE IN YOUR POSSESSION:

1. Fair Liability Waiver Form for each person.
2. Copy of you YQCA Certificate
3. Copy of Declaration of Medication Form

California Department of Food & Agriculture requires all youth livestock exhibitors to have completed an applicable YQCA (Youth Quality Assurance) program training

***Rabbit Hemorrhagic Disease virus type 2 (RHDV2)** was confirmed in a wild **rabbit** population in **California** for the first time in early May 2020. RHDV2 is highly contagious and lethal to both wild & domestic **rabbits**, hares and pikas.

On June 8, 2020, the 49th District Agriculture Association voted unanimously that if Rabbit Hemorrhagic Disease comes within 150 miles of Lake County, or the State veterinarian quarantines all rabbits, the show and sale of meat pen rabbits will be cancelled for the 2020 Junior Livestock Auction.
