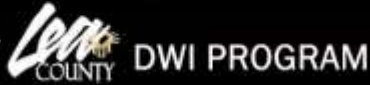

PREVENTION

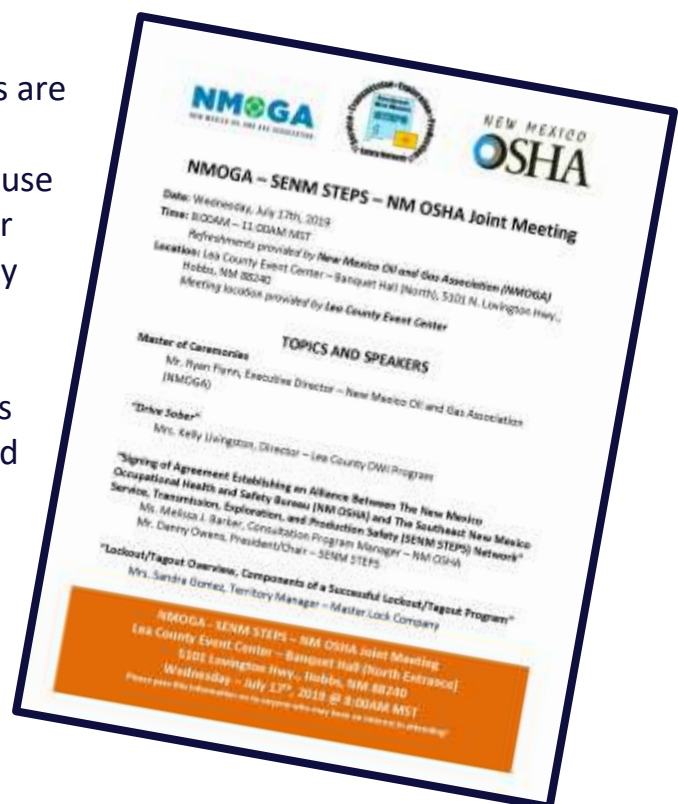
Prevention Summary

The Lea County DWI Program lost our Preventionist at the beginning of the month. However, we will continue our prevention efforts towards reducing occurrences of driving while impaired.

Every year during the summer when schools are out for summer vacation, the DWI Program focuses on our local oilfield companies. We use this time to partner services and provide our local companies with drug and alcohol safety classes.

We provided a safety class to the employees of THF Ltd on the consequences of drugs and alcohol on their job, commercial driver's license and livelihood. We believe this service is important for our communities and are thankful to those companies to whom allow us to provide DWI education.

The DWI Program also presented at the SENM S.T.E.P.S. – NM OSHA Joint Meeting on July 17th at the Lea County Event Center. The audience received education on DWIs in New Mexico and the consequences of driving impaired. Director Livingston is now an active member of the SENM S.T.E.P.S. Board.



Prevention also:

- Provided interviews and anti-DWI commercials on local radio stations and advertisements in local newspapers for reminders to not drink and drive and to use a designated driver for 4th of July celebrations.
