

Menard County Fair Queen Pageant

1. Personal Characteristics: In order to be eligible, contestants must certify to the Personal Characteristics in this section:
 - a) Must be a minimum of 16 years of age and not have reached her 22nd birthday by January 1, 2019. Must be a U.S. Citizen. Contestant, Parent or Legal Guardian must currently be a resident of Illinois for a minimum of six months.
 - b) Can never have been convicted of a felony offense.
 - c) Was born female and have always been a female.
 - d) Does not use or consume any illegal controlled substances or abuse the use of alcohol or other dangerous substances.
 - e) Is of good moral character. Has never performed any act or engaged in any activity or employment that is or could be characterized as immoral or indecent. Attests that any and all online depictions associated with the contestant's name or likeness including but not limited to Facebook Twitter, and all other social media sites are consistent with the standards and dignity of the Miss Menard County Fair Queen Pageant.
2. Contestants must be single and never have been married, divorced, or had their marriage annulled. Contestants can never have been pregnant, is not the adoptive parent of a child.
3. Limitations - Contestants must reside within the area encompassed by Menard County School Districts or must be attending Menard County Schools, or has graduated high school from a Menard County School. Any girl whose parents are residing within the area encompassed by Menard County School Districts, who is a student at a university, college, trade school or other school of higher education, shall be eligible.
4. Contestants will be judged as follows:
 - 20% Evening Gown & Stage Presence
 - 15% Bathing Suit (Beauty & Physique)
 - 35% Personal Interview
 - 30% Speech
5. All contestants will appear on stage in swimsuits and evening gowns, Tuesday evening, JULY 17, 2018. At this time the 2018 Queen will be selected and crowned by Miss Madison Christison, 2017 Menard County Fair Queen.
6. Contestants who have appeared at the State Pageant on stage for another county in Illinois are not eligible to participate.
7. The winner of the contest will appear in Springfield sometime in January 2019, for the Miss Illinois County Fair Pageant. The winner of the state contest will serve as hostess of the 2019 Illinois State Fair and DuQuoin State Fair.
8. The reigning Queen will forfeit her title, prizes (including scholarship award) and privileges to the 1st runner-up in the case of marriage at anytime prior to the 2019 Menard County Fair or in case of gross misconduct as defined and determined by and in the sole discretion of Menard County Fair Board.
9. The Queen must meet with pageant director before January 1, 2019. She must also help gather donations for the 2019 Menard County Fair Queen Pageant. Scholarship money may be reduced or forfeited if she does not comply with these terms.
10. If the scholarship recipient should determine not to attend a post-secondary institution within three years

of being awarded the scholarship, the recipient thereby forfeits the prize. The scholarship money is not transferable and not redeemable for cash.

11. Contestants must file applications with the Menard County Fair Pageant Committee on or by July 4, 2018
12. The decisions made by the 2018 Menard County Fair Pageant judges shall be final.

1. Contestant must be 11 or 12 years of age. (Must not reach 13th birthday before JULY 18th, 2018.)
2. Limitations-Contestants must reside within the area encompassed by Menard County School Districts or must be attending Menard County Schools. Any girl whose parents are residing within the area encompassed by Menard County School District, who is a student elsewhere, shall be eligible.
3. All contestants must attest that any and all online depictions associated with the contestant's name or likeness including but not limited to Facebook, Twitter, and all other social media sites are consistent with the standards and dignity of the Menard County Fair Queen Pageants.
4. Contestants will be judged as follows:
35% Interview (3 minutes)
20% Facial Beauty
25% Stage Presence in Dress
20% Question
5. All contestants will appear on stage in dance attire and dresses, Tuesday evening, JULY 17, 2018. At this time, 2017 Jr. Miss Layken Buch, will crown the 2018 Junior Miss.

8. Jr. Miss must be accompanied by a parent/adult at all times when on the fair grounds.

Interview with judges (2 minutes) 35%
Beauty 20%
Stage Presence In Sunday Best 25%
Fish bowl question 20%
4. All contestants will appear on stage in dance attire and dresses, Tuesday evening, JULY 17, 2018. At this time the 2018 Little Miss will be crowned by Little Miss Menard 2017 Reilen Reynolds and Miss Madison Christison, the 2017 Menard County Fair Queen.
