



Rodeo Royalty Obligations/Contract

The 2019 North Texas Fair & Rodeo Queen, Teen, Princess and Junior Princess will be obligated to represent the North Texas Fair & Rodeo (NTFR) from August 2019 through August 2020. All title holders are expected to appear groomed and looking their very best while wearing modest western clothing (“Official Western Dress”), their crown, sash and buckle when appearing and making representations as NTFR Rodeo Royalty. Title holders are expected to appear this way at all times during the North Texas Fair & Rodeo.

As representatives of the North Texas Fair & Rodeo, title holders will:

- Exhibit good, honest and positive behavior at all times.
- Refrain from using profanity and inappropriate language.
- Refrain from smoking, drinking alcohol and/or using illegal substances.
- Not become engaged, married or pregnant during the term of title reign.
- Not exhibit public displays of affection with a boyfriend or companion of that nature.
- Not create social media accounts using the NTFR title. All social media accounts for Miss Rodeo North Texas Fair Queen, Teen, Princess and Junior Princess are to be maintained by NTFR officials and/or the designated chairperson(s) or coordinator(s). Pictures and details of event representations are to be emailed or shared via text with the designated person(s) for use on the official social media accounts for Miss Rodeo North Texas Fair.

The following representations by 2019-2020 NTFR Royalty are required:

- Rodeo Grand Entry Representation
 - Queen/Teen – 5 minimum (3 of 5 being PRCA)
 - Princess/Junior Princess – 3 minimum (1 of 3 being PRCA)
- Complete 1 Community Service Project
 - Assist with a local Rodeo, school activity, fundraiser, Special Olympics or other event.
- 2020 North Texas Fair & Rodeo Events which include
 - 2020 Rodeo Royalty contest events
 - 2020 NTFR PRCA Rodeo Grand Entries
 - 2020 NTFR Parade
- Parade Representation
 - 2020 Fort Worth Stock Show & Rodeo Parade
 - At least 2 other parade representations for events other than NTFR

Additional appearances may be requested and/or offered by the NTFR Royalty Coordinator(s). Title holders are not limited to the above representations.

If for any reason these obligations cannot be fulfilled, the title holder or authorized guardian must contact the Coordinator to state why the obligations cannot be fulfilled. In default of not fulfilling the obligations to represent NTFR, the title holder may lose their title and prizes. The title and prizes will then be given to the First Runner Up in that division. Title holders will receive their scholarship checks after their obligations are fulfilled and their title reign is complete.

Title holders and/or their designated guardians should always first contact the NTFR Rodeo Royalty Coordinator/Chairperson with any questions or issues.
