- REQUIRED: Legible Bangs Tattoo on all females.
- RECOMMENDED:
 - ✓ USDA Metal ID or Brucellosis Tag
 - ✓ USDA NAIS ID

The goal of the Veterinary Inspection is to minimize the potential for contagious and infection diseases (including parasites). Examples of Infectious Disease and Parasites include:

- Infectious Foot Rot
- Ringworm
- Warts
- Evidence of diarrhea
- Snotty nose/ Respiratory
- Pinkeye
- High Fever
- Coarse, dry cough

No Visible External Parasite Burden (or related clinical signs)

- Mange
- Lice

Adequate Body Condition

- Minimum BCS of 2.5
Scale for cattle is: 1-5: 1-emaciated 2-thin 3-good condition 4-overweight 5-obese)
- Feed and water should be available at the fair at all times

Dehorned properly and completely healed.
