VIRTUAL SHOW RULES

1. All entries must be turned in online. No exceptions. All requirements are detailed on online registration.
2. Maximum of 10 (TEN) entries per exhibitor, per division. With a Maximum of 25 (TWENTY FIVE) entries per Exhibitor for the virtual fair.
3. The exhibitor must be a Washington State Resident.
4. By entering this competition, the Exhibitor undertake that the exhibit is shown in its current condition. Photos and videos MUST NOT be taken before June 1, 2020. Where an exhibit is an animal, the exhibit must be alive and in the hands of occupancy of the exhibitor on the date of entry submission.
5. By entering this competition, the Exhibitor undertake that the media used for the entry is a true representation of the condition of the exhibit and has not been enhanced or altered in any way.
6. By entering this competition, the Exhibitor undertake that the content submitted for entry can be used by The Northwest Washington Fair for promotional media and educational material.
7. Virtual Ribbons only will be awarded to 1st, 2nd & 3rd Places, honorable mentions may be awarded at the discretion of the judging panel.
8. ALL exhibits maybe displayed on the Northwest Washington Fair Facebook page by the Show Stewards. Judging results and comments will also be displayed. Winning entries will be acknowledged at the completion of the Online Show and winning exhibitors identified in Facebook posts.
9. The exhibitor and exhibit photos may be SHARED on Northwest Washington Fair Facebook page as part of the competition advertising campaign.
10. Any entry maybe featured in the Online Show Grand Parade.
11. If an exhibitor wishes to enter the exhibit in a future online show, a complete set of new photos and/or videos must be used.
12. In any class containing more than 6 (SIX) exhibits of the same breed, sub-classes may be created at the discretion of the Show Stewards.
13. Always remember, the soul objective of this event is to provide a friendly competition that celebrates exhibition and encourages participation in agricultural shows.
14. The judging panel's decision is FINAL, and no correspondence will be entered into.
15. **Premiums made possible by Phillips 66. Premium amounts to be determined by the number of exhibitors.**
16. The Participant acknowledges that due to the nature of the activities required in support of an online entry, it would be unreasonable for the Group to be in any way responsible for any injury to or death of the Participant. The Participant hereby, waives all of his or her legal rights of action against the Group and fully releases the Group, to the extent allowable under the law, for any personal injury or death arising out or in relation to the Participant undertaking the activities including without limitation, liability for any negligent or tortious act or omission, breach of duty, breach of contract or breach of statutory duty on the part of the Group, its office bearers, directors, employees or agents.



FFA DIVISION RULES

1. When there is only one entry for the class, the placing shall be based on the merits of the one entry.
2. All animals shown in FFA classes must be at least four months of age on entry and must be carried as the member's vocational agriculture project during the last or next year (Exception - Poultry and Rabbits).
3. Graduate students may show in FFA classes for 3 years following graduation or until they are twenty one, whichever comes first.
4. Animals will be judged on the Danish System.
5. Virtual Rosettes may be awarded at the discretion of the judges.
6. Owners will show their own animals.
7. **Incorrect or late entries will not be accepted.** The firm deadline to submit all entries, photos and videos is **July 25th**. Each student with an animal project must enter online showmanship class.
8. Members must show their own animals unless there is an agreement in place prior to June 1st of the current year. **This agreement must be sent to Ms. Whitcomb (twhitcomb@mtbaker.wednet.edu) signed by all parties and submitted prior to entering the animals in the virtual NWWF.** There is a **limit of 4 animals from another owner** unless the Superintendent gives permission.
9. Failure to Fit and Show will forfeit all FFA virtual premiums.
10. Official rules for clipping and grooming of FFA animals will be according to breed association rules.
11. **Maximum of 3 entries** livestock entries per exhibitor, per division, with a **maximum of 10 entries** per exhibitor. **(2020 only)**
12. Fitting and Showing class definitions:
NOVICE: A contestant in FFA and in their first calendar year showing a specific species.
JUNIOR: Last year freshmen and sophomores with any previous experience. Also applies to incoming 8th graders or freshman with previous experience.
SENIOR: Last year juniors, seniors, and graduates with experience.
13. FFA members are **not required** to wear FFA official Dress, but it is recommended. Other appropriate forms of dress include: dress jeans and button up shirt if student does not have access to official dress. **(2020 only)**
14. No mixing of animals between 4H and FFA. Members simultaneously enrolled in FFA and 4H must have separate projects or animals for each program during the same calendar year. The program year is October 1 to September 30. For example, a member may carry a dairy project for FFA and 4H as long as he or she uses a different animal and project for each program. The goal of both organizations is youth education.
15. Students must fit their own animals. No one may fit the animals other than the exhibitor. Discretion on the part of outside parties is mandatory. Help must be limited to teaching and holding, but not doing.
16. No animal will be allowed to compete for more than one premium, nor shall be entered in more than one class; except in showmanship class.
17. **FFA members are not required to turn in a record book. (2020 only)**



FFA DIVISIONS

FFA BEEF CATTLE DIVISION

CLASS 1: FFA Beef Showmanship

Entries to the above class to contain a 60 to 90 second video of the Exhibitor leading the exhibit and standing with the animal for assessment. The Judge will be looking for the Exhibitor to show control of the animal and ability to display the animal to its greatest potential.

CLASS 2: FFA Steer, any breed, under 24 months

CLASS 3: FFA Heifer, any breed, under age 1

CLASS 4: FFA Heifer, any breed, over age 1

CLASS 5: FFA Feeder Calf, any breed, under age 1

Entries to the above classes to contain (1) side profile of the animal standing for assessment, (2) from the rear of the animal standing for assessment and (3) a photo including the exhibitor and exhibit side on, in a staging pose. The Judge will be looking for the Exhibitor to show control of the animal and ability to display the animal to its greatest potential.

FFA DAIRY CATTLE DIVISION

CLASS 1: FFA Dairy Cattle Showmanship

Entries to the above class to contain a 60 to 90 second video of the Exhibitor leading the exhibit and standing with the animal for assessment. The Judge will be looking for the Exhibitor to show control of the animal and ability to display the animal to its greatest potential.

CLASS 2: FFA Heifer, under 24 months, any breed

CLASS 3: FFA Registered cow in milk, any breed

CLASS 4: FFA Cross bred cow in milk, any breed

Entries to the above classes to contain a photo of the exhibitor with the exhibit and 1 photo of the exhibit showing the detail of the entry.

CLASS 5: FFA Best Udder, cow in milk, any breed

Entries to the above class to contain a 30 second video of the exhibit parading and standing for assessment. Photos to be included in this entry are (1) side profile of the animal standing for assessment with exhibitor, (2) from the rear of the animal standing for assessment, (3) rear profile of the udder.

Pygmy Goats

CLASS A1: FFA Pygmy Goat Showmanship

Entries to the above class to contain a 60 to 90 second video of the Exhibitor leading the exhibit and standing with the animal for assessment. The Judge will be looking for the Exhibitor to show control of the animal and ability to display the animal to its greatest potential.

CLASS A2: FFA Pygmy Goat Jr. Whether, under 1 year of age

CLASS A3: FFA Pygmy Goat Sr. Whether, over 1 year of age

CLASS A4: FFA Pygmy Goat Jr. Doe, under 1 year of age

CLASS A5: FFA Pygmy Sr. Doe, over 1 year of age

Entries to the above classes to contain (1) side profile of the animal standing for assessment, (2) from the rear of the animal standing for assessment and (3) a photo including the exhibitor and exhibit side on, in a staging pose. The Judge will be looking for the Exhibitor to show control of the animal and ability to display the animal to its greatest potential.

CLASS B1: FFA Meat and Dairy Goat Showmanship

Entries to the above class to contain a 60 to 90 second video of the Exhibitor leading the exhibit and standing with the animal for assessment. The Judge will be looking for the Exhibitor to show control of the animal and ability to display the animal to its greatest potential.

Meat Goat Type

CLASS B2: FFA Market Goat

CLASS B3: FFA Meat Goat Jr. Doe, under 24 months, never pregnant

CLASS B4: FFA Meat Goat Sr. Doe, over 24 months, pregnant or kidded prior

Entries to the above classes to contain (1) side profile of the animal standing for assessment, (2) from the rear of the animal standing for assessment and (3) a photo including the exhibitor and exhibit side on, in a staging pose. The Judge will be looking for the Exhibitor to show control of the animal and ability to display the animal to its greatest potential.

Dairy Goat Type

CLASS C2: FFA Dairy Goat, Jr. Doe, under 24 months, never kidded

CLASS C3: FFA Dairy Goat, Sr. Doe, over 24 months, MUST BE IN MILK

Entries to the above classes to contain (1) side profile of the animal standing for assessment, (2) from the rear of the animal standing for assessment and (3) a photo including the exhibitor and exhibit side on, in a staging pose. The Judge will be looking for the Exhibitor to show control of the animal and ability to display the animal to its greatest potential.

CLASS 1B: FFA Jr. Buck Rabbit, under 1 year of age, any breed

CLASS 1C: FFA Sr. Buck Rabbit, over 1 year of age, any breed

CLASS 1D: FFA Jr. Doe Rabbit, under 1 year of age, any breed

CLASS 1E: FFA Sr. Doe Rabbit, over 1 year of age, any breed

Entries to the above classes to contain a Photo of (1) side profile of the animal standing for assessment, (2) from the rear of the animal standing for assessment, (3) a photo including the exhibitor holding the exhibit.

Cavies

CLASS 2A: FFA Cavy Showmanship

Entry to contain a 60 second video of the handling their cavy, showing the audience the main features of the breed and of their cavy. The Judge will be looking for the exhibitor to identify three main features of the breed, two strong characteristics of their cavy and two weaknesses of their cavy.

CLASS 2B: FFA Jr. Boar Cavy, under 1 year of age, any breed

CLASS 2C: FFA Sr. Boar Cavy, over 1 year of age, any breed

CLASS 2D: FFA Jr. Sow Cavy, under 1 year of age, any breed

CLASS 2E: FFA Sr. Sow Cavy, over 1 year of age, any breed

Entries to the above classes to contain a Photo of (1) side profile of the animal standing for assessment, (2) from the rear of the animal standing for assessment, (3) a photo including the exhibitor holding the exhibit.

Following the close of entries, and waiting on the judge's decision, a series of videos will be made compiling all the entries received to showcase the diversity of the Show Movement and all the wonderful stories that go behind these fabulous exhibits. To fulfill this, it is important a picture of the Exhibitor and Exhibit is sent in as part of your entry.
