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Welcome to the 2018 Quilt Department



If you visited the 2017 State Fair Quilt Show, you noticed that once again it was a really big show – many talented exhibitors, many beautiful quilts and many admiring fair visitors. But we were sad that with so many entries, we could show only a small portion of so many of the large quilts. So, in 2018 we are making two changes: (1) limit quilts per exhibitor to a maximum of three, and (2) change the Best in County from a competition class to a recognition program. With this change we will be able to see more of the quilts that are here, something important to exhibitors and fairgoers alike.

The most efficient way to enter is online. Instructions on how to enter online are found on the web site, www.statefair.org. For directions on entering by mail or in-person go to the entry information section in this book. Need help in getting your entries to and from the fair? As in Division 5320, an exhibitor may enter only one quilt per class in this division and a maximum of 3 quilt entries in the combination of Divisions 5320 and 5330 classes.
- **Page 11: Youth Two-Person Quilts, NCQ and CQ** (non-commercially and commercially quilted)
 - **Page 11: Two-Person Quilts, NCQ**
 - **Page 11-13: Two-Person Quilts, CQ**
 - **Page 13-14: Group (three or more)-Person Quilts, NCQ and CQ**
- Pages 15-20** **Division 5390 - Special Quilt Contests:** These contests draw quilts from Divisions 5320 and 5330 competition classes. The different contest sponsors determine the rules for each contest. The exhibitor may enter multiple (but not more than three) quilts in the same special contest as well as the same quilt in multiple (but not more than three) special contests.
- Pages 21** **Division 5391 - Best in County Quilt Recognition Program:** A quilt that received the top honor at a county fair may receive this special recognition at the NSF provided the quilt is entered in Division 5320 or 5330 and documentation confirming the quilt was selected at the local county fair as the best quilt to represent their county. *This is the only division that requires prior entry in a county fair.*

We hope to see you and your quilts at the fair.

New in 2018:

- **Entry Limit:** **Three quilts per exhibitor.** (Previously, the limit was five.)
- **Division 5330 (multi-person quilts) class additions in 2018:**
 - Class 3015 – Logo-item quilt any size, CQ
 - Class 3016 – Reclaimed-material quilt, any size, CQ
 - Class 3017 – Vintage fragment quilt, any size, CQ
- **Division 5330 (multi-person quilts) class name changes in 2018:**
 - Class 3070 – Group quilts by non-quilters, BQ or TQ, tied or NCQ (*previously Quilting Bee School/Community Quilts NCQ*)
 - Class 3071 – Group quilts by non-quilters, WQ, tied or NCQ (*previously Quilting Bee School/Community Quilts NCQ*)
 - Class 3080 – Group quilts, BQ or TQ, NCQ (*previously Quilting Bee Group Quilts*)
 - Class 3081 – Group quilts, WQ, NCQ (*previously Quilting Bee Group Quilts*)
- **Division 5390 (Special Contests) additions or changes:**
 - Class 9401 – 40 or Less! – *For exhibitors 40 years of age or less*
 - Class 9410 – Best of the Panhandle – *now open to both 5320 and 5330 entries*
 - Class 9416 – Machine Quilting: Track-Mounted Machine – *digital program restriction added*
 - Class 9417 – Quilting the Modern – *best quilting on a modern quilt*
 - Class 9432 – Flying Geese - *quilt with flying geese blocks*
 - Class 9433 – Hexagon – *quilt with hexagon blocks*
 - Class 9453 – The Improvisational Quilt – *quilt using improvisational design*
- **Division 5391 (Best-in-County) This has changed from a competition to a recognition program.** A quilt that received the top award at a Nebraska county fair will be entered, received, judged and hung with all other entries in the Quilt Department of the NSF but will be recognized with signage and a distinctive ribbon. This quilt will count as one of the three quilts allowed per exhibitor. The “**Best in County Verification Form**” must also accompany the quilt when received as an entry in the NSF show. Details are outlined in Division 5391 of this entry book.

Important Dates

Entry Deadline: Wed, Aug 8, midnight

Drop-Off Day: Sun, Aug 12 (Seward noon to 5 pm; North Platte noon to 3 pm)

Exhibit Delivery: Wed, Aug 15, 3 to 8 pm and Thu, Aug 16, 8 am to 3 pm for all Division 5320 and 5330 entries.

Exhibit Release: Mon, Sep 3 from 8 pm to 10 pm and Tue, Sep 4 from 8 am to noon. *Early release is prohibited.*

Return Day: Wed, Sep 5 (Seward 2 to 6:30 pm; North Platte 3:30 to 5:30 pm)

Quilt Awards: The judge may but is not required to award up to five ribbons (1st through 5th) for the first five places in the competition classes - Divisions 5320 and 5330. In cases where the class is large, the judge may opt to award an additional set of ribbons (2nd through 5th) but there will be only one 1st place (blue) awarded in each class. Usually only a 1st place is awarded in the Division 5390 Special Contests.

The NSF provides the following:

- NSF ribbons for those quilts placed 1st through 5th in each class
- NSF rosette and a \$25 cash award to each of the following: Best Kit/BOM Divisions 5320 and 5330, Best of Divisions 5320 and 5330, Best and Reserve Best of Show, Judges Choice and Best Commercial Quilter.
- Special Best-in-County NSF ribbons and signage for all quilts that received the top award at a county fair and completed the required documentation to qualify for special recognition at the NSF. See Division 5391 for details.

Quilt Shops, guilds and private donors provide gift certificates or cash awards for the best entry in nearly all classes in Divisions 5320, 5330 and 5390. In many cases, the sponsors also provide "special ribbons" for the winning entry. Sponsored awards are listed at the end of each set of classes within a division.

Best Overall Division and Show Awards:

In 2017, we added two additional best of division awards: Best Kit/BOM Division 5320 and Best Kit/BOM Division 5330. These two awards are selected from the 1st place winners of all kit/BOM quilt classes in each respective division. This will be the terminating award for quilts in kit/BOM classes.

- The Best and Reserve Best of Divisions: 5320 and 5330 will be selected from the 1st place winners of all classes in the respective divisions with the exception of kit/BOM classes.
- The Best of Show will be selected from the two quilts: Best of Division 5320 and 5330. Reserve Best of Show will be selected from three quilts: the remaining Best of Division not selected as Best of Show and the Reserve Best of Divisions: 5320 and 5330.

Results: Judging results are posted online as soon as possible after verification of data. This usually takes a few days after the completion of judging since getting the exhibition area ready for opening day of the fair must take precedent over the posting process. Go to www.statefair.org. Select "Open Class Domestic Exhibits & Results" on the "Get Involved" tab.

Quilt Department Abbreviations:

BQ - bed quilt

TQ - throw quilt

JQ - juvenile/crib quilt

WQ - wall quilt

HQ - hand quilted (must contain no machine quilting)

MQ - machine quilted (can contain a combination of hand and machine quilting)

CQ - commercially quilted: quilting is done for pay (includes both hand and machine)

NCQ - non-commercially quilted: no money is exchanged for the quilting done by a second person or group

BOM - Block-of-the-Month

Kit or BOM - quilts that are made from patterns and fabrics specified and/or sold as a unit for retail sale.

Mixed techniques - where a combination of two or more construction methods (not including quilting or trapunto) are major components in the quilt design. An example would be a quilt containing significant amounts of both piecing and appliqué.

Quilt Department Divisions: Classes and Contests

The Quilt Department has four divisions that house different types of classes, contests and restrictions for entry.

Divisions 5320 and 5330 – Competition Classes (exhibitor maximum of one quilt per class and 3 quilts per total)

- Division 5320 is for quilts sewn and quilted exclusively by one person.
- Division 5330 is for quilts sewn and quilted by more than one person and includes: two-person quilts, group quilts, quilts where the top is made by one or more persons and the quilting is done either for pay (commercially quilted) or not-for-pay (non-commercially quilted).

Division 5390 - Special Contests: (exhibitor maximum of three special contests per quilt)

The rules for each special contest are set by the contest sponsor and vary from contest to contest. All quilts must be entered in a competition class in order to compete in a Division 5390 special contest.

Division 5391 – Best-in-County Quilts: *As of 2018 NSF, this has been changed from a competition to a recognition program for those quilts entered in the NSF that have been previously designated as the best quilt at their county fair competition.* These quilts are entered, received, judged and hung along side all other entries in the NSF Quilt Department but will be recognized with signage and a distinctive ribbon denoting their county fair achievements. *Note that entry in a county fair is not a prerequisite except for the Best-in-County recognition program.*

Quilt Department Rules:

It is the responsibility of each exhibitor to be familiar with all applicable rules and regulations. The [General Rules and Regulations](#) linked here apply to all NSF open class domestic departments.

In addition, the following **Specific Quilt Department Rules** also apply:

- Competition in all Quilt Department divisions is limited to items which meet the following criteria: (1) meets the definition of a quilt: a fabric sandwich made of three layers (a top, a filling and a back) held together by thread or string that goes through all layers, (2) is a bed, throw or wall quilt but **not** another type of quilted item i.e. table runners, kitchen items, pillows and quilted wearable garments and (3) has no sharp embellishments, surface design features or hanging devices that require special handling.

Opportunities for entering items which do not meet the above criteria can be found in the [Textile Arts Entry Book](#), Division 5202: *Sewing for the Home* or Division 5210: Creative Fiber Art.

- Quilt Department entry limits:
 - **Competition Class Limits** (Division 5320 and 5330): total of three quilts per exhibitor. *New limit in 2018*
 - **Special Contest Limits** (Division 5390): Quilts must be entered in a "competition class" to compete in special contests. The exhibitor may enter multiple quilts in the same special contest as well as the same quilt in multiple (but not more than three) special contests.
- Youth and senior adults can enter a quilt in either their respective age-restricted competition class or any non-age restricted competition class but the same quilt cannot be entered both places. The exhibitor's age as of Jan 1 is used for age-restricted classes. Birthdate is required on the entry form only on age-restricted classes.
- All entries must have been completed within the last three years.
- Competition in Division 5320 (one-person quilts) is limited to Nebraska residents only. In Divisions 5330 (multiple-person quilts), Division 5390 (Special Contests) and Division 5391 (Best in County), the primary maker or majority of persons involved in making the quilt must be Nebraska resident(s), but a secondary portion (including the quilting step) may be done by a non-Nebraska resident.
- Any quilt previously entered in Divisions 5320 or 5330 (one-person quilts or multiple-person quilts) cannot compete again in those divisions.
- The exhibitor selects the division and class for entry. However, the superintendent or judge may move an entry to a different class to comply with the class description.
- Entry in a county fair is not a prerequisite except for the special recognition award - **Division 5391, Best-in-County Quilts**.
- A quilt made from a kit or block-of-the-month package where the pattern and fabric components are retailed as a unit must be entered in a class specifically for kits and block-of-the-month quilts.
- Tied quilts may be entered only in the following classes **Special Types of Quilts** (Classes 2001, 2002, 2003); **Youth** (Classes 2080 through 2086); and **Group Quilts by Non-Quilters** (Classes 3070 and 3071).
- All quilts must have a fabric label with the name and address of the maker(s) for identification purposes. Attach the label to the lower left corner of the backside of the quilt. Then, in order to prevent the judge from seeing the name, baste a piece of fabric over the label and anywhere else the name appears on the quilt.
- Hanging sleeves are not required on quilts.
- Include no photographs, newspaper articles, county ribbons or other information with the exhibit.
- Removal of entries prior to release time is prohibited.

How to Enter - Entry Deadline is Wed, Aug 8, midnight

If you wish to purchase exhibitor tickets you must do so when you enter your exhibits online or on the Quilt Entry Form. Purchase of these tickets is optional. Note that gate admission is less than exhibitor ticket admission on some days of the Fair. Check www.statefair.org Guest Info/Admission Pricing for details.

Online Registration: The most time and cost efficient way to enter is online. Exhibitors can enter all their open class exhibits and order exhibitor tickets (optional) in one session. Online entry instructions are found on the web site, www.statefair.org. Select "Get Involved", then "Open Class Domestic Exhibits & Results" and then click on "Online Entry."

Mail-In or In-Person Registration: When using mail-in or in-person registration, the exhibitor must use a separate form for each department entered. Either print out the entry form from the following hyperlink: [2018 Quilt Entry Form](#) or request the form from the Nebraska State Fair Office Grand Island; phone: 308-382-1620.

Guidelines For Completing Entry Form – Online & Mail in or Delivery

- Enter **all** items that you plan to bring. Items not brought to the fair by deadline will be deleted.
- Retain a copy of entry form. A copy is required with each package mailed/shipped to Grand Island or delivered to a drop off site. For online registration: print either the entry receipt activity report or a packing/loading report.

- **Entry description format:** Description is for identification purposes only. Limit the total entry description to not more than 40 characters (letters and spaces). This requires use of an abbreviated format. Do not include the quilt name or quilt class number in the description. Use abbreviations for colors, design feature, omit words and numbers as much as possible. List size only to the closest inch and without "inch" or abbreviation of inch.
- For a **Division 5320 or 5330** quilt, the entry form description must include only the following information in this order: (1) quilt dimensions, (2) predominant colors (3) identifying design feature. Example: a quilt in Division 5320, Class 2025 which is 75" x 95" with log cabin blocks made from multiple blue, green and cream fabrics would be: **75x95 blu/gr/cm log cabin**.
- For a **Division 5390** quilt, the entry form description must include only the following information in this order: (1) original competition class number (oc=number) (2) quilt dimensions, (3) predominant colors (4) identifying design feature. Example: the same quilt entered in **Division 5390** would be: **oc=2025;75x95 blu/gr/cm logcabin**.

Deliver Exhibits to Quilt Hall - Pinnacle Bank Expo Center – Deadline is Thu, Aug 16, 3 pm

Entries can be: (1) delivered in person, (2) taken to a drop-off / return site, or (3) sent by USPS, FedEx or UPS.

- **In-Person:** bring exhibit(s), along with a copy of the entry form, to the Quilt Hall in the Pinnacle Bank Expo Center on Wed, Aug 15 from 3 to 8 pm or Thu, Aug 16 from 8 am to 3 pm.
- **Drop-off/Return Site:** There are two drop-off/return sites (one in North Platte and one in Seward) to facilitate transportation of exhibits to and from Grand Island. Refer to [Domestic Drop-Off / Return Sites](#) document for detailed instructions on packaging, location and time. Items going to different departments must be packaged separately.
- **Ship by USPS, UPS or FedEx:** Refer to the [Domestic Shipping Options](#) for detailed instructions on packaging, where to send exhibits and how to pay for return costs. Note that items sent by mail (USPS) must use the PO Box address and those sent by a delivery service (UPS or FedEx) must use the street address. These items must be delivered in time to meet the receiving deadline of Thu, Aug 16.

Return Options of Exhibits --- No Early Release

- **In-Person:** Items can be picked up Mon, Sep 3, from 8 to 10 pm or Tue, Sep 4, from 8 am to noon in the Quilt Hall. You must sign the release list to collect your entries. If you sent your exhibits by mail, shipping service or drop-off but wish to pick them up in person at the end of the fair, you can do so with identification.
- **Drop-Off/Return Sites:** Refer to the [Domestic Drop-Off/Return Sites](#) for return information.
- **Shipping:** Exhibitors who want items returned by mail or a delivery service must make this notation on the entry form enclosed with exhibits. Exhibits will not be accepted or returned by COD. Refer to [Domestic Shipping Options](#) for return information.

Exhibits not picked up during release time or with insufficient payment for return shipment must be picked up from the NSF Office, 501 E Fonner Park Rd, Grand Island no later than Wed, Oct 3, 2018. After that, items will be donated to charity.

DIVISION 5320 ~ One-Person Quilts

All quilts in **Division 5320** must be made and completed exclusively by one person who is a Nebraska resident. Quilts made by more than one person are entered in **Division 5330 - Multiple-Person Quilts**.

In **Division 5320, only quilts in classes 2001, 2002, 2003 and classes 2080 through 2086 (youth quilt classes), have the option to be secured with knots or ties.*

Entry description format: The entry description is for identification purposes only. Limit the total length of entry description to not more than 40 characters (letters and spaces). This requires use of an abbreviated format. Do not

include the quilt class name, the quilt name or the commercial pattern name of the quilt in the description. Use abbreviations for colors, design features, omit words and numbers as much as possible.

The description should contain only the following information and in this order: (1) quilt dimensions to the closest whole inch - omitting inch abbreviation and spaces, (2) major quilt colors - abbreviate (3) a identifying design feature - abbreviate.

Example: For an entry in Division 5320, Class 2025 which is 75" x 95" with log cabin blocks made from multiple blue, green and cream fabrics, a suitable entry description which is only 25 characters long would be: **75x95 blu/gr/cm log cabin.**

SPECIAL TYPES of QUILTS

Note: A quilt made from a kit/BOM should be entered in a kit/BOM class of the appropriate size and description rather than Classes 2000 through 2019.

<u>Div</u>	<u>Class</u>	<u>Class Name</u>
5320	2000	Pride of Nebraska, any size quilt of original or traditional design that reflects Nebraska's heritage or culture. <u>Requirement:</u> 3"x5" card near the label telling in 100 words or less how the design relates to Nebraska.
5320	2001	Tied quilt, any size
5320	2002	Crazy quilt, any size. A quilt composed of a disorderly mixture of fabrics put together in a haphazard, hodgepodge or asymmetrical fashion and lacking a repeating pattern. <i>Note that the layers of a crazy quilt should be secured or tied but are not required to be quilted.</i>
5320	2003	Dolly and Me: A small doll quilt, <i>either quilted or tied</i> , playful or endearing in nature and appropriate to be used by a child for a doll. Quilt should not contain any embellishments that could be a choking hazard.
5320	2004	Hand embroidered, any size. The embroidery should be the predominant feature with sashing, piecing, applique or other techniques having minimal impact on the quilt. A quilt composed of both embroidery and one or more other predominant techniques should be entered in a mixed technique class.
5320	2006	Special occasion, any size. A quilt made for a holiday or special occasion. <u>Requirement:</u> 3"x5" card attached near the label indicating the holiday/special occasion.
5320	2007	Logo-item quilt, any size: Made exclusively by one person and featuring a collection of items such as T-shirts, golf towels, hats, etc. that contain logos and/or are commemorative of events.
5320	2008	Reclaimed material quilt, any size: Contains salvaged material from clothing (excluding logo items) and/or other sources (i.e. dresser scarves, table linens, etc.) previously used for some purpose other than a quilt. <u>Requirement:</u> 3"x5" card attached near the label explaining in 100 words or less the source of recycled material.
5320	2009	Vintage fragment quilt, any size: A quilt using a combination of new and vintage quilt fabrics and/or vintage quilt fragments combined together and completed exclusively by one quiltmaker. <u>Requirement:</u> 3"x5" card near the label indicating in 100 words or less the vintage source and history of the quilt fragments.
5320	2010	Whole cloth traditional quilt, any size: A quilt made from a single piece of cloth or lengths of cloth joined together rather than being made of patchwork or other construction methods. A traditional whole cloth quilting pattern (either by hand or machine) provides a major design feature of the whole cloth quilts but is not necessarily the only design feature.
5320	2011	Whole cloth art quilt, any size: A quilt made from a single piece of cloth or lengths of cloth joined together to simulate a single piece of fabric where dying, painting, printing, thread work or other surface design techniques done by the maker provide the major impact of the quilt.
5320	2012	Landscape, any size: A quilt portraying a scene such as a landscape, seascape or cityscape. People and/or animals may be a component of the scene but not the primary focus.
5320	2013	Portrait, any size: A quilt portraying a recognizable aspect of human, animal, insect or mythical life as the major focus of the quilt.
5320	2014	Art small, up to 100" around: A small quilt other than a portrait or landscape that reflects imagery or ideas rather than using a traditional pattern and is hung on the wall rather than used for warmth.

DIVISION 5330 ~ Multi-Person Quilts

5330 the description used on the entry form must include only the following information in this order: (1) quilt dimensions, (2) predominant colors (3) design feature. **Example:** For an entry in Division 5330, Class 3023 which is 75" x 95" with log cabin blocks made from multiple blue, green and cream fabrics, a suitable entry description would be: **75x95 blu/gr/cm log cabin.**

It also includes both quilts where there is no payment exchange for the quilting step (non-commercially quilted) and quilts where one or more people are paid for the quilting step (commercially quilted). In all cases, the majority of people making the quilt must be Nebraska residents.

Entry Instructions for Group Quilts:

Group quilts must be entered using a group name as the exhibitor - not under the name of an individual exhibitor. Choose a name for your group if you don't already have an established group name. You also need to have a contact person for the entry (typically the person responsible for submitting the entry). The contact person's address and phone is used for the address and phone number of the group.

Complete the online entry (or a mail-in entry form) for the Group Exhibit using the following information:

Initiate a new exhibitor using your group name as the exhibitor's name as follows:

First name: use the word "group" (this is a required field so it can't be left blank)
Last name: name you have selected for your group (can be multiple words with spaces between)
Address: contact person's address
Phone: contact person's phone

DIVISION 5390 - SPECIAL QUILT CONTESTS

Division 5390 contains the classes known as **Special Quilt Contests**.

Both fabric prepared by the quiltermaker as well as those prepared by other persons can count toward the requirement as long as the fabric is not from a commercial source. Requirement: *Attach a 3"x5" card near the label listing the various color modification techniques used and % of total quilt.*

Div Class **Quilt Inspired by a Child's Artwork**

Rules: Open to Division 5320 and 5330 entries of any size where the quilt design is inspired by a child's original artwork and the quilt construction uses one or more quilting techniques such as pieced, appliquéd, embroidered or other methods. DIVISION 5391 ~ Best in County Quilts

Starting with the 2018 NSF, the “**Best in County Quilts**” division is changing from a competition to a recognition event. To qualify for the recognition program, a quilt that received the top honor at a County Fair, is entered, received (with the Best in County Verification Form) and judged during the same time period and in the same classes as the other quilt entries to the NSF. The entry will count as one of the three quilts allowed per exhibitor. After judging is completed and all the quilts are hung, these quilts which received the top honors at a County Fair will be recognized with (1) signage acknowledging them as the top county winner in their respective county fair and (2) with a distinctive ribbon award. A parallel change will also occur with the NSF Textile Arts Department.

One major difference with the Best in County recognition program is that the entry must be received at the same time as all other entries in the NSF Quilt Department. This is nearly a week earlier than in the past.

With the change in the Best in County program, no quilt will be exhibited at the NSF Quilt Department more than one time after the 2018 Fair. But in the 2018 transition year, quilts that were entered in the 2017 Best in County competition may be entered in the 2018 Quilt Department Divisions 5320 or 5330 as one of the three maximum entries per exhibitor provided the quilt is still within the 3-year date of completion. This will allow these quilts to compete in the regular competition and receive a written critique by the nationally certified quilt judge.

To Qualify for the “Best in County” Recognition Award:

1. The entry must be the quilt receiving the top award at the local county fair, plus the quiltmaker must be a resident of the county submitting the entry.
2. The quilt must be entered one of the **Division 5320 or 5330 Competition Classes** in the 2018 NSF Quilt Department and must comply with all the NSF Quilt Department Rules including completion within the last three years. Also, quilted items such as table runners, placemats, quilted garments, 3-D items and quilted items requiring special handling are in the Textile Arts Department rather than the Quilt Department.

To Receive “Best in County” Recognition Award:

1. Complete the Division 5391- Best in County Textile Arts Verification Form, which is found online or by contacting the NSF office (308-382-1620). This requires the signature of your county fair official.
2. Attach the Verification Form to the quilt or mail the Verification Form to Jan Sittler, NSF Quilt Superintendent, 2104 W Charles, Grand Island, NE 68803.

Note that the quilt must be entered in either a Division 5320 or 5330 class in the NSF Quilt Department by entry deadline of Aug 8, but the Best in County Verification Form does not need to be in place and on the quilt until the receiving deadline, which is Aug 16.

In the event that your county fair is held during or after the NSF or if the quilt entry was not entered in the NSF Quilt Department prior to the NSF entry deadline of Aug 8, the county winner will be eligible for recognition in the Best of County Quilt Division 5391 the following year provided that the entry still meets the requirement of completion within the last three years. Also, for joint county fairs, each county may have one entry in the Best in County Division 5391.

Delivery of Exhibit – Deadline is 3 pm Thu, Aug 16 to the Quilt Hall in the Pinnacle Bank Expo Center. *Note that the receiving date is the same as all other quilt entries in the 2018 Quilt Department. This is nearly a week earlier than in the past when the Best in County entries could arrive with the County Extension staff bringing the 4-H exhibits. However, the extension staff can pick up the exhibit on return.*
